ADMINISTRATION OF ACTS

Supplement to the General Order of 13 July 1987

I, John Cain, Premier, state that the following administrative arrangements for the following Acts will operate in addition to and, where necessary, in substitution for the arrangements specified in the Administration of Acts—General Order of 13 July 1987 and subsequent Supplementary Orders:

Minister for Education

Employment and Training Act 1981, insofar as it relates to technical and vocational training (the remaining provisions are administered by the Minister for Labour and the Minister for Industry, Technology and Resources)

Industrial Training Act 1975

Post-Secondary Education Act 1978

Minister for Housing and Construction

Architects Act 1958

Housing Act 1983—Excluding Part VI (these provisions are administered by the Attorney-General)

Public Lands and Works Act 1964—Excluding sections 8 (2) and (3), and 8A (1) and (2) (these provisions are administered by the Minister for Property and Services)

Residential Tenancies Act 1980—Excluding section 7, Part II, sections 64, 71, 77 (4)–(7), 96, 100, 101, 105, 106, 108, 111–113, 127–135, 136

(4)-(6) and Part VI (these provisions are administered by the Minister for Consumer Affairs)

Urban Land Authority Act 1979—Excluding those provisions which relate to major project control as referred to in the Administration of Acts Supplement to the General Order of 29 April 1986, dated 13 February 1987 and published in the *Government Gazette* of 18 February 1987 (these provisions are administered by the Minister for Agriculture and Rural Affairs)

Urban Renewal Act 1970

Minister for Police and Emergency Services

Community Welfare Services Act 1970—sections 7 (2), 10 (2A), 11 (1A), 12A, Part V, sections 190-193; sections 10 (3) and 10 (4) insofar as they relate to assignments under section 10 (2A); section 12c insofar as it relates to the Correctional Services Council; sections 199 (1A), (2) and (3), 200 and 202A insofar as they relate to persons in the legal custody of the Director-General of Corrections; sections 6, 11 (2), 201, 202 and 203 insofar as they relate to the administration of the above provisions. (The remaining provisions are administered by the Minister for Community Services, the Minister for Labour and the Minister for Education)

Corrections Act 1986

Mental Health Act 1986—sections 44 to 53 insofar as they relate to persons under the care, charge and direction of the Director-General of Corrections; insofar as these sections relate to youth offenders, they are administered by the Minister for Community Services (the remaining provisions are administered by the Minister for Health and the Minister for Community Services)

Parole Orders (Transfer) Act 1983

Prisoners (Interstate Transfer) Act 1983

Victorian Prison Industries Commission Act 1983

Minister for Tourism

Chinatown Historic Precinct Act 1984—(jointly administered with the Minister for Planning and Environment)

AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULE TWO

The Governor in Council, acting under sections 22, 23A and 23B of the *Public Service Act 1974* amends Schedule Two of that Act by:

(1) altering the name of the administrative unit of "Ministry of Housing" in column one to "Ministry of Housing and Construction",

(2) removing the associated administrative unit of "Office of the State Training Board" from column three,

(3) removing the office of "General Manager, State Training Board" from column four,

(4) adding, in relation to the administrative unit of "Ministry of Education" in column one, the unit of "Office of the State Training Board" to column three immediately after the unit of "Office of the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Board",

(5) adding, in relation to the unit of "Office of the State Training Board" in column three, the office of "General Manager, State Training Board" to column four,

(6) removing the administrative unit of "Public Works Department" from column one, and

(7) removing the office of "Director-General of Public Works" from column two, with effect on and from 14 December 1987.

ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS ORDER (No. 57) 1987

1. This Order is called the Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 57) 1987.

2. This Order is made under the powers conferred by section 3 of the *Administrative Arrangements Act* 1983 and under every other available power.

3. This Order takes effect on and after 14 December 1987.

4. In respect of each item in the Schedule a reference to the Old Body in any Act, or any provision of an Act, specified in Column 2 or in any statutory or other instrument made under any Act, or any provision of an Act, specified in Column 2 shall be construed as a reference to the New Body.

5. Where—

(a) before this Order takes effect a transaction happened in relation to an Old Body;
then—

(b) this Order does not affect the validity or continuity of the transaction, and the transaction shall continue and may be completed in relation to the New Body in the same way as it would have been continued and may have been completed in relation to the Old Body if this Order had not been made.

6. In this Order—

“The Act” means the *Administrative Arrangements Act* 1983.

“Body” means Minister, Administrative Unit or Officer.

“Instrument” includes contract and agreement.

“Old Body” and “New Body” mean respectively the Body specified in Column 1 and Column 3 of each item in the Schedule.

“Schedule” means the Schedule to this Order.

“Transaction” includes—

- (a) Agreement, bond, contract, deed or other consensual arrangement whatsoever;
- (b) Action, appeal, arbitration, prosecution or other legal proceeding whatsoever;
- (c) Assignment, charge, lease, mortgage, transfer or other dealing with property whatsoever;
- (d) Loan, guarantee, indemnity or other dealing with money whatsoever;
- (e) Approval, consent, delegation, direction, licence, Order, permit, requirement or other authority whatsoever;
- (f) Notice; and
- (g) Any other act, entitlement or liability in the law whatsoever.
