





- 1. A motor vehicle or trailer within a class of motor vehicles or trailers specified in an Australian Design Rule must comply with that rule if manufactured on or after the date specified in the rule.

and incorporated into the booklet issued by the Federal Department of Transport entitled "Australian Design Rules for Motor Vehicles and Trailers, Third Edition, Endorsed by the Australian Transport Advisory Council".

#### Legal Profession Practice Act 1958 SOLICITORS' (PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT AND PRACTICE) RULES 1987

Pursuant to section 88 of the Legal Profession Practice Act 1958 and all other powers thereto enabling, the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria hereby makes the following rules:

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the "Solicitors' (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules 1987" and shall come into operation on the date on which they are published in the Government Gazette.
- 2. In these Rules, the Solicitors' (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules 1984 are called the "Principal Rules".
- 3. Rule 2 of the Principal Rules is repealed and the following Rule substituted therefor:
- "2 (1) A solicitor may advertise in connection with the solicitor's practice if the advertising—
  - (a) is not false;
  - (b) is not misleading or deceptive or likely to mislead or deceive;
  - (c) does not use the word specialist, or a direct derivation of that word.
- 2 (2) Notwithstanding sub-rule (1), if in the opinion of the Council, an advertisement or form of advertising is undesirable, the Council may order the solicitor to cease or amend such advertising.
- 2 (3) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, if a solicitor is an accredited specialist in an area of practice, the solicitor shall be entitled to use the word "specialist" or a direct derivation of that word in advertising that area of practice in connection with the solicitor's practice."
- 4. Rule 10 and the Schedule of the Principal Rules are repealed and the following Rule and Schedule substituted therefor:
- "10 (1) Nothing in this Rule shall be deemed to limit or restrict any duty or obligation of a solicitor which otherwise exists.
  - 10 (2) A solicitor shall not act-
  - (a) for both vendor and purchaser in connection with a contract for the sale of land, or a conveyance or transfer of land, for value at arm's length; or
  - (b) for both vendor and purchaser in connection with a contract for the sale of a business at arm's length; or

- (c) for both lessor and lessee in connection with a lease of land, or an agreement for the lease of land, for value at arm's length;
- (d) for both lender and borrower in connection with a loan of money or an agreement to lend money; or
- (e) for both a purchaser of land and the lender of money intended to be secured by a mortgage of that land;

unless and until he obtains the written acknowledgement of the parties in or to the effect of Form 1 in the Schedule.

- 10 (3) In the event of a conflict of interest arising, the solicitor will cease to act for all of the parties for whom he has agreed to act unless each of them agrees in writing for which of them the solicitor may continue to act.
- 10 (4) A solicitor may obtain a general authority from a client authorising the solicitor to act for that client and for other parties to any matter or transaction, and such general authority in or to the effect of Form 2 in the Schedule will satisfy the requirements of sub-rule 10 (2) insofar as that client is concerned.
- 10 (5) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-rule (2) a solicitor shall not act for any purchaser under a contract of sale of land if the solicitor is a party to any agreement or understanding with the vendor or the lender under an associated loan agreement as to the amount of costs that will be payable by the purchaser or as to the payment of those costs.
- 10 (6) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-rule (2) a solicitor shall not act-
  - (a) for both lender and borrower in connection with a loan of money or an agreement to lend money; or
  - (b) for both a purchaser of land and the lender of money intended to be secured by a mortgage of that land;

where the borrower or mortgagor is a builder, develop or subdivider and the transaction relates to the borrower or mortgagor in his capacity as a builder, developer or subdivider.

10 (7) For the purpose of this rule-

Reference to a solicitor acting or not acting includes the partner, principal or employee of the solicitor acting or not acting.

"land" has the same meaning as in section 2 (1) of the Sale of Land Act 1962.

"solicitor" has the same meaning as in section 51 of the Legal Profession Practice Act 1958.

- 4. Makes provision, as set out in the Schedule, for or with respect to regulating and controlling advertising by or on behalf of the Home in relation to the provision of veterinary service.

### Schedule

- 1. (1) In this Schedule-
  - "advertisement" means any method by which is publicized or disseminated information about the provision of veterinary services by the Home, and includes an advertisement on a vehicle.
  - "premises" means the premises specified in paragraph 2 of the Declaration as the place at which the Home may provide veterinary services.
- (2) The provisions of this Schedule do not apply to any advertising by the Home, whether direct or indirect, other than advertising in connexion with the provision of veterinary services.
- 2. Subject to this Schedule, the Home must not—
  - (a) exhibit or cause or permit to be exhibited;or
  - (b) have about its premises so as to be visible to the public generally by way of advertisement—

any sign, plate, placard, painting, sculpture, replica, representation or other form of advertisement.

- 3. (1) The Home may install and use at the premises any premises any or more of—
  - (a) a sign, plate, placard or advertisement not exceeding 1,000 sq cm in area and bearing only the name of the Home;
  - (b) a sign, plate, placard or advertisement not exceeding 3,000 sq cm in area and bearing no more than—
    - (i) the name of the Home;
    - (ii) the hours of consultation;

- (iii) the telephone numbers of the Home; and
- (iv) directions for after-hours procedure;
- (c) an illuminated sign not exceeding I m in length and 40 cm in height bearing the words "Veterinary Hospital", and
- (d) an identifying sign for the premises, on which each letter is not more than 30-5 cm in its greater dimension.
- (2) A sign, plate, placard or advertisement installed and used under subclause (1)—
  - (a) must not, except in the case of a sign installed and used under subclause (1) (c), exceed 30-5 cm in height or 61 cm in length;
  - (b) must not, except in the case of a sign installed and used under subclause (1) (d), be inscribed with letters any of which is more than 5 cm in its greater dimension; and
  - (c) must not be illuminated other than by a single light either white or blue which is not of an intermittent or flashing type.
- 4. (1) The Home must not publish or distribute or cause or permit to be published or distributed any newspaper advertisement which contains more than the name of the Home and the place, days and hours at or during which veterinary services are provided.
  - (2) A newspaper advertisement-
  - (a) must be in ordinary type and setting;
  - (b) must not be wholly or partly in a form of type which places undue emphasis on that advertisement or any part of it; and
  - (c) must not exceed two single columns in width or 5 cm in depth.
- (3) A newspaper advertisement must not be placed in newspaper more than once in any period of four weeks,
- 5. The Home must not use stationery on which is printed any statement or information other than—
  - (a) its name and the address of its premises;
  - (b) its telephone number; and
  - (c) the days and hours on or at which veterinary services are provided.
- 6. (1) The Home must not insert or cause or permit to be inserted in any telephone directory or business any entry other than an entry—
  - (a) subject to subclause (2), in ordinary type and setting;
  - (b) containing only-
    - (i) the name of the Home;
    - (ii) the address of the premises of the Home:

- (iii) the telephone numbers of the Home;
- (iv) the days and hours on or at which veterinary services are provided.
- (2) In any entry in a telephone directory or business directory the name of the Home may be in extra bold type.
- 7. The Home must not, in or in connexion with any article or photograph published in any newspaper or journal or in connexion with any radio or television broadcast or public lecture, make or cause or permit to be made any reference to the veterinary services it provides other than to state that a veterinary surgeon is in attendance.
- 8. The Home must not advertise on radio or television or on the screens of threatres, or upon any train, tram, omnibus or other public vehicle or on any programme, leastlet, or circular, intended for public circulation.
- 9. (1) Subject to subclause (2), the Home must not place or exhibit or allow to be placed or exhibited any advertisement on any motor vehicle used or owned by the Home.
- (2) The Home may place or exhibit on any motor vehicle its name and address and any other information or symbol required by law to be so placed or exhibited.
- 10. The Home must not publish, cause to be published, or be in any way concerned in the publishing of
  - (a) any claim by it of pre-eminence in veterinary science, or any matter commending or directing attention to the professional skill, knowledge or services of the Home, its office-bearers or members of staff or
  - (b) anything derogatory of, or disparaging to, any registered veterinary surgeon or other recognized body; or
  - (c) any claim of the use by it of exclusive or superior apparatus, methods, or material in the provision of veterinary services.

VARIATIONS TO THE BOUNDARIES OF THE DANDENONG SEWERAGE DISTRICT OF THE DANDENONG SPRINGVALE WATER BOARD AND THE METROPOLIS OF THE MELBOURNE AND

METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS FOR SEWERAGE PURPOSES

The Administrator in Council under the provisions of the Water and Sewerage Authorities (Restructuring) Act 1983 and the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1958 ("the Act") directs that:

1. Operative Date

This Order shall come into force on 1 July 1987 ("the operative date").

2. Transfer of Sewerage Responsibilities to Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works

As on and from the operative date:

- (A) The lands shown by green colour on the plan approved by the Governor in Council by and with this Order and deposited in the office of the Department of Water Resources Melbourne (Correspondence No. L87/53/16), shall be excised from the Dandenong Sewerage District of the Dandenong Springvale Water Board ("the Sewerage Authority").
- (B) The lands described in the First and Second Schedules hereto shall be included in the metropolis for sewerage purposes within the area of control of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works ("the Board") and Parts I, III, IIIA, IV, V, VI, VIII and IX of the Act shall apply to such lands.

(C) In respect of the lands described in the First and Second Schedules hereto, there shall be transferred from the Sewerage Authority to the Board:

- (a) (i) all property, plant, equipment, and works used or intended to be used, by the Sewerage Authority for the provision of sewerage services together with all interests rights and benefits owned by, vested in, possessed by, or accruing to the Sewerage Authority in relation thereto;
  - (ii) all rights and liabilities in land or easements owned by, vested in, or existing in favour of the Sewerage Authority—including any lands or easements in the process of being acquired as at the operative date, in relation to the provision by it of sewerage services;
  - (iii) all rights, powers, obligations and liabilities of the Sewerage Authority in relation to the provision by it of sewerage services;
  - (iv) all or any accumulated monies prepaid to the Sewerage Authority for outfall and disposal works and/or construction of sewerage works;
- (b) all rights to monies due and payable to the Sewerage Authority as at the operative date, in relation to the provision by it of sewerage services.
- (D) The board shall be liable to pay to the Sewerage Authority the amount (if any) agreed upon in respect of any works or property of the Sewerage Authority in the area transferred to the Board.

3. Variation of Orders

As on and from the operative date the Orders in Council made respectively:

- (a) on 25 June 1963 and published in the Government Gazette dated 26 June 1963, including parts of the Cities of Dandenong and Berwick and the Shire of Cranbourne in the metropolis for water supply purposes; and
- (b) on 13 June 1978 and published in the Government Gazette, dated 21 June 1978, including parts of the Cities of Berwick, Knox, Dandenong and Springvale and the Shire of Cranbourne in the metropolis for water supply purposes,

shall be varied by the inclusion, for sewerage purposes, of the lands described in the First and Second Schedules hereto within the area of control of the Board and Part III of the Act shall apply to such lands.

4. Transfer of Sewerage Responsibilities to the Dandenong Springvale Water Board

As on and from the operative date:

- (A) The lands described in the Third Schedule hereto shall be excluded from the metropolis for sewerage purposes within the area of control of the Board.
- (B) The lands shown by red colour on the plan approved by the Governor in Council by and with this Order and deposited in the office of the Department of Water Resources (Correspondence No. L87/53/16), shall be annexed to the Dandenong Sewerage District of the Sewerage Authority.
- (C) In respect of the lands described in the Third Schedule hereto, there shall be transferred from the Board to the Sewerage Authority:
- (a) (i) all property, plant, equipment, and works used, or intended to be used, by the Board for the provision of sewerage services together with all interests rights and benefits owned by, vested in, possessed by, or accruing to the Board in relation thereto;
  - (ii) all rights and liabilities in land or easements owned by, vested in, or existing in favour of the Board including any lands or easements in the process of being acquired as at the operative date, in relation to the provision by it of sewerage services;
  - (iii) all rights, powers, obligations and liabilities of the Board in relation to the provision by it of sewerage services:
