EXEMPTION

Application No. 5 of 1988

On 7 October 1988, the Equal Opportunity Board considered an application made under section 40 (1) of the Equal Opportunity Act 1984 by the Steering Committee of the Outer Eastern Women's Health Service for an exemption from the provisions of the Act to enable the Outer Eastern Women's Health Service to advertise for and appoint women only in two positions of a Project Co-ordinator and a Project Officer in order to co-ordinate and assist in the establishment and development of the Outer Eastern Women's Health Service.

The Board has regard to the applicant's submission and job descriptions which informed the Board that—

- (i) both positions will be responsible to the Steering Committee which comprises representatives from the Maroondah Hospital Advisory Group on Women's Health and representatives from the Outer Eastern Women's Health Network;
- (ii) the State Government has allocated funds to establish an Outer Eastern Women's Health Service, which will be in premises already secured adjacent to the Maroondah Hospital in Ringwood East. The successful submission was prepared jointly by the Maroondah Hospital Advisory Group on Women's Health and the Outer Eastern Women's Health Network:
- (iii) the Maroondah Hospital Advisory Group on Women's Health was formed in September 1987 and its role is to advise the Maroondah Hospital Committee of Management on matters pertaining to women's health. It includes female members of the Hospital's Committee of Management, Ringwood City Council, District Health Council Program, Medical and Nursing professions and Hospital Administrative Staff. The Outer Eastern Women's Health Network is a group of women who live in the outer eastern suburbs. It was formed in May 1987 through local Neighbourhood Houses, Maternal and Child Health, Education Department, Medical and Nursing professions, and has a membership of 75 women:
- (iv) The service will work with existing health and community services to address women's health needs in such areas as cervical cancer and breast cancer, stages of life, family planning; contraception; premenstrual tension; menopause; menstrual

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pain; pelvic problems; endeometriosis; ageing; osteoporosis; emotional health and determined that the exemption requested was desirable to assist in the establishment and development of the Outer Eastern Women's Health Service.

The Board hereby grants an exemption from the operation of section 21 (1) (a) and (c) and section 59 of the Equal Opportunity Act 1984 to permit the Steering Committee of the Outer Eastern Women's Health Service to advertise for and appoint women to the following positions with the Outer Eastern Women's Health Service:

- 1. Project Co-ordinator;
- 2. Project Officer.

The granting of this exemption does not guarantee any extension of exemption will be granted nor does it imply that any other positions other than those specified are exempt.

This exemption shall remain in force until 31 July 1989.




