

MURRAY RIVER FRONTAGE PARK

Regulations BALCOMBE ESTUARY PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE

I, Joan Elizabeth Kirner, Her Majesty's Minister for Conservation, Forests and Lands in and for the State of Victoria in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978, do hereby apply the Regulations for and with respect to the reserved Crown Land in the Township of Osborne, Parish of Moorooduc, temporarily reserved for Public Recreation purposes by Order in Council of 6 May 1986 (vide Government Gazette dated 14 May 1986) being the land indicated by red colour on plan attached to Departmental correspondence Rs4898 and known as the "Balcombe Estuary Public Recreation Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Corporation of the Shire of Mornington as Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

Regulations Title

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Balcombe Estuary Public Recreation Reserve Regulations 1988.

Application

2. These Regulations shall apply to the whole of the Reserve.

Definitions

- 3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—
- "Minister" means Minister for Conservation, Forests and Lands.
- "Act" means the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978, as amended.
- "Authorised Officer" means any person appointed, in writing, by the Committee as an authorised officer for the purposes of these Regulations and (except for the purpose of receipt of any fees or the grant variation or revocation of any permit) also includes any member of the Police Force and any Bailiff of Crown Lands.
- "Camp" without limiting the generality of the verb, includes:
 - (a) Erect, occupy or use any tent, or any temporary, makeshift or similar form of accommodation, or
 - (b) Park, occupy or use any caravan or other movable form of accommodation.
- "Firearm" includes any rifle, gun, pistol, air pistol, gun or like thing using gas cartridges, catapult, bow and arrow or cross bow, and any

other implement designed to discharge missiles capable of injuring or destroying animal life.

"Permit" includes any authority, approval, consent, permission, receipt, ticket or the like given, granted or issued under the Act of these Regulations.

"Vehicle" includes any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, cart, horse drawn vehicle, trailer or water

Behaviour

- 4. No person shall:
- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct;
- (b) Commit or create or knowingly permit or allow to continue any public or private nuisance or any annoyance to the public or any person lawfully in the Reserve whether such nuisance or annoyance takes place in a public or private building, tent or other structure or in any enclosed or unenclosed space in the Reserve or do or suffer to be done any act which in the opinion of an authorised officer is, or is likely to be to the annoyance or disturbance of any persons using the Reserve:
- (c) Except within any area set apart for the purpose, play any game in which a hard ball is used or engage in any game or sport likely to cause interference, disturbance or danger to others using the Reserve.

Shooting &c

- 5. No person shall in the Reserve, except in accordance with a written permit:
 - (a) Shoot, trap, maim, injure, kill or destroy any bird or animal;
 - (b) Have in his possession, carry or use any firearm, poison, trap or snare.

Firearms &c

6.

- (a) Any person carrying or using any firearm, poison, trap or snare in the Reserve, without a permit shall surrender the same on demand to any authorised officer who shall issue a receipt therefor.
- (b) The person apparently entitled to any such article may collect it from the office of the Committee after completion of investigations and legal proceedings (if any) by the Committee in relation to any offence alleged against the person who surrendered the same.

,

(a) No person, except with a permit, shall in the Reserve, remove, cut, damage, displace, deface or interfere with any rock, timber, tree, shrub, plant, wild flower or other vegetation, or any sign, notice board, seat, table, gate, post, fence, bridge, building, structure, or any other thing of like nature to any of the foregoing.

Damage

(b) No person shall dig or remove from or take into the Reserves any gravel, stone, shell-grit, sand, soil or loam.

Missiles

No person shall roll or throw any stone or any other substance or missile within the Reserve.

Camping

9. No person shall camp in any part of the Reserve.

Refuse and Litter

10. No person shall within the Reserves deposit or cause to be deposited (except in a receptable provided for the purpose) any bottle, glass object, vessel or other container, broken glass, tins, waste paper, foodstuff, vegetable matter, offal or other refuse or litter.

Glass &c

11. No person shall intentionally break any glass, bottle or other container within the Reserve.

General

- 12. No person shall in any part of the Reserves, except in accordance with and upon the terms of a permit in writing—
- (a) Sell or offer for sale any article whatsoever;
- (b) Give out, distribute, erect, leave, set-up or display any handbills, placards, notices, pamphlets, books, papers, advertising matter or any like thing;
- (c) Occupy use or enter any building, booth, shed, stand or enclosure, unless the same is set aside for public use;
- (d) Erect or place therein any building, booth, shed, or other structure;
- (e) Solicit or collect money or orders for goods or services;
- (f) Take part in or advertise any entertainment for gain;
- (g) Preach, declaim, harangue or deliver any address of any kind or use any amplifier, public address system, loud hailer or similar device;
- (h) Let for hire any article, device or thing;
- (i) Take photographs for gain or commercial purposes;

- (j) Ply any vehicle for hire or carry passengers for fee or reward;
- (k) Conduct any school or provide any form of instruction for gain;
- (1) Advertise for sale or trade or hire any article, device, service or thing.

Dogs

- 13. No person shall cause, suffer or permit any dog belonging to him or in his charge:
 - (a) To be brought into or to enter or to remain in any camping area or any portion of the Reserve except where and when permitted by notice; and
 - (b) To be brought into or to enter or remain in the Reserve unless such dog is and continues to be at all times under proper control on a chain, cord or leash, and unless such dog be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person and from damaging or interfering in any way with any property in the Reserve.

Horses

14. No person shall, except in accordance with a written permit from the Committee, ride, drive or lead any horse upon the Reserve.

Animals Generally

- 15.
- (a) Save aforesaid, no person shall cause or suffer or knowingly permit any animal belonging to him or in his charge to be brought into or enter or remain in the Reserve without a permit;
- (b) Any animal found in the Reserve contrary to these Regulations may be seized by an authorised officer and impounded or destroyed, and the owner or custodian therof shall be liable to pay compensation for any damage done by such animals to the property of the Committee.

Enclosures

16. No person shall, except where and upon conditions authorised by the Committee, enter any areas in the Reserve which is enclosed for plantation of young trees, shrubs or grass plots or for the growth or preservation of native flora.

Fires and Solid Fuel Barbeques

17. No person shall without permit light a fire or solid fuel barbeque within the Reserves, except in a fireplace provided by the Committee for the purpose, and any person who lights a fire in the Reserve shall take all reasonable and proper precautions to ensure that the fire does not escape from control; nor shall any person wilfully, carelessly, or negligently do make or permit any act or omission which may result or be likely to

result in damage by fire or hot coals to anything growing or being thereon.

Roadways &c

18. No person shall unless authorised by the Committee drive, ride, push, pull, place or leave any vehicle in or on the Reserve except in or upon such roadways or areas as are set aside for the purpose, and no person shall allow any vehicle to remain stationary in any position where it may cause undue or unreasonable obstruction to the lawful passage of others.

Parking

- 19. No person shall park any vehicle within the Reserve except—
 - (a) in an area set apart for the purpose and clearly defined by signs, or
 - (b) as and where directed or authorised by the Committee or an authorised officer,
 - (c) upon payment of such fees (if any) as may be prescribed.

Stranded Vehicles

20. An authorised officer may remove or cause to be removed or order the removal of any parked, stranded or broken down vehicle from any roadway or area within the Reserve:

Provided that the removal of any vehicle:

- (a) Shall be at the sole risk of the owner of the vehicle who shall be deemed to have accepted such risk as a condition of entry to the Reserve, and
- (b) May be effected in such manner as the authorised officer deems fit.

Abandoned Vehicles

21. Any vehicle left unattended within the Reserve for a continuous period exceeding 48 hours may be removed by the Committee at the risk and expense of the owner.

Use of Facilities

- 22. No person shall:
- (a) Use any kitchen, laundry, change-room, shower, toilet or other convenience or any part thereof in the Reserve except for its proper and upon payment of such fees (if any) as may be prescribed;
- (b) Enter or use or permit any child under his care or control to enter or use any place, room, convenience, or structure set apart for the use of the opposite sex: Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to a child under the age of six years, when accompanied by an adult of the opposite sex.

Directions by Sign

23.

- (a) The Committee may, by clear notices or signs establish in such prominent position or positions as the case requires, prohibit or regulate any act, matter or thing within the Reserve or any part thereof.
- (b) No person shall erect or remove any such notice or sign except with the authority of the Committee.
- (c) No person shall disobey the directions indicated in any such notice or sign.

Permits

24.

- (a) The holder of any permit shall observe and comply with all conditions thereof.
- (b) Any person purporting to hold any permit shall produce the same on demand by any authorised officer, and unless such permit is thereupon produced that person shall not be entitled to claim the benefit of any such permit.

Direction to Leave

25.

- (a) Any authorised officer may direct a person who in his opinion offends against any of these Regulations forthwith to leave the Reserve or any place therein.
- (b) Every person who fails to comply forthwith with any such direction shall be guilty of an offence and may be removed from the Reserves or such place.

Giving of Name

26. If, in the opinion of an authorised officer, any person has contravened or failed to comply with any provision of these Regulations then such officer may demand and receive the name and address of such person and any person who refuses to furnish his name and address or who then furnishes an incorrect name and address shall be deemed to have committed an offence.

Obstruction of Officers

27. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with any authorised officer or any employee of the Committee in the execution of his duty in the Reserve.

General Powers

- 28. The Committee may-
- (a) Provide and maintain conveniences, facilities and amenities of any description in any part of the Reserves, or arrange for the provision and maintenance thereof and may from time to time determine or vary the conditions of entry or use thereof.

Permits

- 29. The Committee may issue permits for purposes provided for in these Regulations which are not otherwise provided for in the Act.
 - (a) Any permit may be granted for such period and subject to such terms, conditions and fees consistent with these Regulations as the Committee may from time to time determine, either generally or in the particular case.
 - (b) No permit shall be transferable.
 - (c) Any permit (other than a permit granted by or pursuant to a document under seal) may be revoked or withdrawn at the discretion of the Committee or at the direction of the Minister (Rs 4898).

These Regulations are made in lieu of all previous Regulations made for or with respect to the abovementioned Reserves, which are hereby revoked.

I, Joan Elizabeth Kirner, Her Majesty's Minister for Conservation, Forests and Lands in and for the State of Victoria in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978, do hereby apply the Regulations for and with respect to the reserved Crown Land in the Township of Mornington, Parish of Moorooduc, being the land indicated by red colour on plans marked M/27.4.31 and M/22.4.36 attached to Departmental correspondence Rs5207 and known as the "Mornington Foreshore Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Corporation of the Shire of Mornington as Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

Regulations

Title

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Mornington Foreshore Reserve Regulations 1988.

Application

2. These Regulations shall apply to the whole of the Reserves.

Definitions

3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter-

"Minister" means Minister for Conservation, Forests and Lands.

"Act" means the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978, as amended.

"Authorised Officer" means any person appointed, in writing, by the Committee as an authorised officer for the purposes of these Regulations and (except for the purpose of receipt of any fees or the grant variation or revocation of any permit) also includes any member of the Police Force and any Bailiff of Crown Lands.

"Camp" without limiting the generality of the verb, includes:

No person shall without permit light a fire or solid fuel barbeque within the Reserves, except in a fireplace provided by the Committee for the purpose, and any person who lights a fire in the Reserve shall take all reasonable and proper precautions to ensure that the fire does not escape from control; nor shall any person wilfully, carelessly, or negligently do make or permit any act or omission which may result or be likely to result in damage by fire or hot coals to anything growing or being thereon.

Roadways &c

18. No person shall unless authorised by the Committee drive, ride, push, pull, place or leave any vehicle in or on the Reserve except in or upon such roadways or areas as are set aside for the purpose, and no person shall allow any vehicle to remain stationary in any position where it may cause undue or unreasonable obstruction to the lawful passage of others.

Parking

- 19. No person shall park any vehicle within the Reserve except—
 - (a) in an area set apart for the purpose and clearly defined by signs, or
 - (b) as and where directed or authorised by the Committee or an authorised officer,
 - (c) upon payment of such fees (if any) as may be prescribed.

Stranded Vehicles

20. An authorised officer may remove or cause to be removed or order the removal of any parked, stranded or broken down vehicle from any roadway or area within the Reserve:

Provided that the removal of any vehicle:

- (a) Shall be at the sole risk of the owner of the vehicle who shall be deemed to have accepted such risk as a condition of entry to the Reserve, and
- (b) May be effected in such manner as the authorised officer deems fit.

Abandoned Vehicles

21. Any vehicle left unattended within the Reserves for a continuous period exceeding 48 hours may be removed by the Committee at the risk and expense of the owner.

Use of Facilities

- 22. No person shall:
- (a) Use any kitchen, laundry, change-room, shower, toilet or other convenience or any part thereof in the Reserve except for its proper and upon payment of such fees (if any) as may be prescribed;
- (b) Enter or use or permit any child under his care or control to enter or use any place, room, convenience, or structure set apart for the use of the opposite sex: Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to a child under the age of six years, when accompanied by an adult of the opposite sex.

Directions by Sign

23.

- (a) The Committee may, by clear notices or signs establish in such prominent position or positions as the case requires, prohibit or regulate any act, matter or thing within the Reserve or any part thereof.
- (b) No person shall erect or remove any such notice or sign except with the authority of the Committee.
- (c) No person shall disobey the directions indicated in any such notice or sign.

Permits

24.

- (a) The holder of any permit shall observe and comply with all conditions thereof.
- (b) Any person purporting to hold any permit shall produce the same on demand by any authorised officer, and unless such permit is thereupon produced that person shall not be entitled to claim the benefit of any such permit.

Direction to Leave

25.

- (a) Any authorised officer may direct a person who in his opinion offends against any of these Regulations forthwith to leave the Reserves or any place therein.
- (b) Every person who fails to comply forthwith with any such direction shall be guilty of an offence and may be removed from the Reserves or such place.

Giving of Name

26. If, in the opinion of an authorised officer, any person has contravened or failed to comply with any provision of these Regulations then such officer may demand and receive the name and address of such person and any person who then furnishes an incorrect name and address shall be deemed to have committed an offence.

Obstruction of Officers

27. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with any authorised officer or any employee of the Committee in the execution of his duty in the Reserves.

General Powers

- 28. The Committee may-
- (a) Provide and maintain conveniences, facilities and amenities of any description in any part of the Reserves, or arrange for the provision and maintenance thereof and may from time to time determine or vary the conditions of entry or use thereof.
- (b) Make such arrangements as it deems necessary or desirable for or in connection with the proper and efficient management and operation of the Reserves or any portion thereof.

Permits

- 29. The Committee may issue permits for purposes provided for in these Regulations which are not otherwise provided for in the Act.
 - (a) Any permit may be granted for such period and subject to such terms, conditions and fees consistent with these Regulations as the Committee may from time to time determine, either generally or in the particular case.
 - (b) No permit shall be transferable.
 - (c) Any permit (other than a permit granted by or pursuant to a document under seal) may be revoked or withdrawn at the discretion of the Committee or at the direction of the Minister (Rs 5207).

These Regulations are made in lieu of all previous Regulations made for or with respect to the abovementioned Reserves, which are hereby revoked.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF CROWN LANDS PLACED UNDER THE CONTROL OF THE HISTORIC BUILDINGS MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Minister for Conservation, Forests and Lands, acting under section 13 of the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978, makes the following Regulations for the Crown lands (called the "Reserve") listed in Schedule 1, which have been placed under the control of the Historic Buildings Management Committee (called the "Committee").

Regulations

- (. Definitions:
- "Authorised Officer" means any person appointed by the Committee to be its agent and includes all Regional Managers for the time being of the Department of Conservation, Forests and Lands and their delegates.
- 2. The Reserve shall be open to the public on such days and hours and at such admission charges as are determined by the Committee.
 - 3. No person shall-
 - (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who, in the opinion of an Authorised Officer may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct;
 - (b) place any advertisement, placard or notice upon any tree, structure or path in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee:
 - (c) sell or offer for sale any article or solicit or gather money or hand out literature within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee:
 - (d) interfere with any person lawfully using the Reserve;
 - (e) interfere with or damage any building, structure or other property or any tree, shrub or plant within the Reserve;

- (f) leave or deposit any rubbish in the Reserve except in receptacles provided for the purpose:
- (g) light a fire in the Reserve except at such places as are set aside for the purpose by the Committee or any Authorised Officer and at such times as allowed by the Country Fire Authority:
- (h) carry or discharge any weapon within the Reserve without the written consent of an authorised officer:
- (i) snare or destroy any animal or bird within the Reserve without the consent of an Authorised Officer:
- (j) transmit by radio or television from within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee:
- (k) occupy any building within the Reserve for any private or public activity without the written permission of the Committee;
- (1) camp in the Reserve or erect any structure within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee or any Authorised Officer:
- (m) except on lawful occasions, enter any enclosed area or building, or any other structure within the Reserve;
- (n) remain within the Reserve or in any property therein when lawfully directed to leave the same by any member of the Police Force or an Authorised Officer;
- (o) bring into the Reserve any dog, unless securely held;
- (p) bring in or allow to remain in the Reserve any other animal, without the permission of the Committee.
- 4. The Committee shall have authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as defined by the Pounds Act 1958.
- 5. The owner of any animals found wandering in the Reserve, except with permission of the Committee, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.
- 6. (i) No motor car or other vehicle shall be taken onto the Reserve, except-
 - (a) with the permission of the Committee or an Authorised Officer; or
 - for the purpose of using an area specially set aside by the Committee as a car park.
- (ii) The use of any car park shall be subject to such conditions and arrangements as the Committee may determine.

- 7. No alterations, additions or other works shall be undertaken on the Reserve or any structures thereon without the written approval of the Committee.
- 8. Any person may take still or moving photographs or films in the Reserve for private use, but if for publication or sale, the written consent of the Committee must be obtained prior to publication or sale and, a fee may be charged conditions imposed, and including acknowledgement of the source.
- 9. Every person within the Reserve shall comply with any lawful direction of any member of the Police Force or officer or employee of the Committee or an Authorised Officer.
- 10. Any officer or employee of the Committee or an Authorised Officer may remove or exclude from the Reserve any person who commits a breach of these Regulations.
- 11. Any permit, agreement or licence issued by the Committee may be for such period and subject to such terms, conditions and fees consistent with these Regulations as the Committee may determine.
- 12. The foregoing Regulations shall not restrict any servants, agents or workmen of the Committee in the proper execution of their duty or work in the Reserve.

Joan Elizabeth Kirner, Her Majesty's Minister for Conservation, Forests and Lands, in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Crown Land in the Parish of Carrah (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve") temporarily reserved for the purpose of Preservation of Species of Native Plants (vide Government Gazette 1983, P 261).

Regulations

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge.
 - 2. A person shall not, in the Reserve-
 - (a) be either unclothed, or clothed in an indecent manner:
 - (b) use any profane, indecent or obscene language;
 - (c) use any threatening, abusive or insulting words, or
 - (d) behave in a riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening or insulting manner.
- 3. A person shall not, in the Reserve, roll or throw a stone or other substance or missile.
- 4. (a) A person shall not, in the Reserve, shoot, trap, catch or otherwise destroy or interfere with wildlife.
- (b) A person shall not, in the Reserve, use any poison, trap, snare or net.
 - 5. A person shall not, in the Reserve-
 - (a) damage, deface, remove or otherwise interfere with any rock or any natural feature; or
 - (b) dig or remove from, or take into the Reserve gravel, stone, shell, grit, sand, soil or loam; or
 - (c) remove, cut, damage, displace, deface or interfere with a memorial, sign, notice, board, seat, table, gate, post, fence, bridge, building or any other thing constructed or erected in the Reserve.
- 6. A person shall not, in the Reserve, leave or deposit any glass, bottle, tin, carton, package, food, paper or any other refuse or rubbish except in receptacles provided for the purpose in the Reserve.
- 7. A person shall not, in the Reserve, erect or construct a building (other than a building erected or constructed in accordance with a tenancy or permit granted under the Act or a tent erected in accordance with these Regulations).
- 8. A person shall not, in the Reserve, occupy, use or enter a building—
 - (a) unless the building is set aside for public use the occupation, use or entry is in the building in accordance with the purposes for which it is so set aside; or
 - (b) except in accordance with a tenancy or permit held under the Act.
 - 9. A person shall not-
 - (a) bring a dog into the Reserve or allow a dog under his control to enter or remain in the Reserve except in accordance with this clause.

- (b) Nothing in this clause prohibits a blind person having in the Reserve a dog that is bona fide used as a guide dog.
- (c) A person may have a dog in the Reserve if the dog is kept under control, is on a leash, chain or cord and is restrained from causing annoyance to persons or damage to property.
- 10. Subject to the Act, a person shall not, in the Reserve, pick remove, destroy or otherwise damage any wildflower, plant shrub, tree or other vegetation.
- 11. A person shall not, in the Reserve, excavate, remove, deface, damage or otherwise interfere with any archaeological or aboriginal remains or relics.
- 12. A person shall not, in the Reserve, light a fire except in accordance with the *Forests Act* 1958.
- 13. A person shall not, in the Reserve, drive a vehicle except on roadways or in areas set aside for driving vehicles of that class.
- 14. A person shall not bring cattle or poultry or a sheep, goat, pig, ferret or pet bird into the Reserve.
- 15. (a) A person shall not bring a horse, donkey, or mule into the Reserve, or allow a horse, donkey or mule under his control to enter the Reserve except in accordance with this clause.
 - (b) A person may ride, drive or lead a horse, donkey or mule in the Reserve on roads, trails or other areas set aside for riding.
 - (c) A person shall not ride a horse, donkey, or mule in the Reserve, in a manner that may endanger a person or animal.
 - (d) A person shall not, in the Reserve, leave a horse, donkey or mule unattended.
- 16. A person shall not bring a cat into the Reserve or allow a cat under his control to enter or remain in the Reserve.
- 17. A person shall not, in the Reserve, play a game or take part in an activity likely to cause inconvenience, disturbance or annoyance to other persons.
- 18. A person shall not, in the Reserve, camp or erect a tent or use a caravan or other mobile structure for camping except in a place set aside for camping and in accordance with a permit under the Act.

Every person infringing these Regulations in any respect shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable. Given under my hand at Melbourne on 29 January 1988.

1, Joan Elizabeth Kirner, Her Majesty's Minister for Conservation, Forests and Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978 do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Crown Land in the Township of Daylesford, Parish of Wombat temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation by Order in Council of 25 November 1986 in respect of which a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") has been appointed.

Regulations

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
 - 2. No person shall:
 - (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve, who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
 - (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
 - (c) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
 - (d) Offer any article of food or drink, or any other commodity whatsoever, for sale, or bring intoxicating liquor into the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first being obtained.
 - (e) Obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person employed at the Reserve.
- (f) Climb, jump, get on or over any of the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, or stick bills or advertisements or cut names thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, furniture or fittings, gates, fences, seats, or other structures in the Reserve.
- (g) Interfere with, break, or damage in any way, any of the trees, shrubs or plants, or

- pluck any of the flowers, or walk on the beds or borders in the Reserve.
- (h) Leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, refuse or rubbish whatsoever therein, nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein, or leave anything therein that might injure any person.
- Light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee.
- (j) Carry or discharge any firearms or airguns in the Reserve or shoot, snare or destroy any game or birds therein without the consent of the Committee.
- (k) Bet publicly in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.
- (1) Erect any buildings, tent or structure or camp on any portion of the Reserve without permission in writing of Committee first obtained, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee.
- (m) Bring into the Reserve any dog without the permission of the Committee.
- (n) Do anything whatsoever in the Reserve for the purpose of producing a commercial or monetary return without the consent in writing of the Committee first obtained.
- 3. For the purpose of maintaining good order, any person authorised by the Committee, may refuse admission to the Reserve to any person.
- 4. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Committee to leave the same.
- 5. The Committee may enter into Agreements for the use of any portion or portions of the Reserve by any Club, Association or person for the purpose of holding football, cricket, or other matches, fetes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows or sports, or for playing football, cricket, lacross, hockey or other athletic games, or for athletic training or other physical recreation, subject to payment of such fees, and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations and may authorise any Club, Association or person to make a charge for admission thereto.
- 6. No person shall engage in any organised sport or game or training in relation thereto within the Reserve on Sundays, Anzac Day or Good Friday without obtaining consent of Committee.
- 7. No Club, Association or person shall hold or take part in any organised sport, entertainment, performance, show or ceremony

in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee first obtained.

- 8. No Club or Association of any kind having for its objects physical recreation, or any member or members of any club or association, nor any other person shall play, practice or train or engaged in any game or sport or athletic exercise within the Reserve, without the permission in writing of the Committee first obtained, unless any person is, at the time of playing, a member of any Club which is duly authorised by the said Committee to play in the said Reserve at such time.
- 9. No person except the Committee or its officers and employees on duty shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge is made for admission, without first paying the fees chargeable for admission.
- 10. No person shall drive or park a motor car or motor cycle within the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose; and on such days a charge is being levied for admission to that part of the Reserve, an additional charge of an amount as is from time to time determined by the Committee shall be payable for the parking of motor cars and motor cycles.
- 11. No person shall take or put, or allow to be taken or put in the Reserve, any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals or, being the owner or having the possession, care, custody, control or supervision thereof, shall suffer or allow such horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals to be in or graze or wander upon the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee.
- 12. The owner of any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals that are found wandering upon any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against the Regulations.
- 13. All animals and all poultry entering the Reserve must be under proper control, and the owner of any animal or poultry that causes damage within the Reserve shall be responsible therefor.
- 14. No person shall take or drive any carriage, cart, or any other vehicle drawn by a horse or other animal, into the Reserve without the permission of the Committee, and no horse or other animal drawing any such carriage, cart, or other vehicle shall, whilst in the Reserve, be detached or unharnessed therefrom, or left without a person in charge.
- 15. No person shall drive, push, pull or place on the Reserve any motor car or motor cycle, trailer or other vehicle except in such places as are set aside for such purposes by the Committee

unless such person obtains the permission in writing of the Committee.

- 16. No person shall enter any building in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee, and any person having entered such building shall leave the same on being requested so to do by any member or employee of the Committee, or by any member of the Police Force.
- 17. No persons except labourers and workmen employed on the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs or flowers.
- 18. Every person to whom a ticket has been issued authorising such person to enter upon the Reserve shall upon demand produce and, if required, surrender such ticket to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorised to demand such production or surrender of tickets.
- 19. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance or committing any act of indecency in the Reserve, or refusing to obey those authorised by the Committee or by any Club, Association, or persons renting or having been granted the use of the Reserve for the time being to keep order, shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom, notwithstanding that such persons may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto, and shall also be liable to prosecution for an offence against these Regulations.
- 20. No person shall camp in the Reserve other than at the specified camping area and after having duly paid the fees as may be determined by the Committee from time to time.

Every person infringing these Regulations in any respect shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable.










