Stores and Material other than that provided for under these Contracts, Contracts now current or any Contracts which may subsequently be gazetted, must be obtained in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 84 of the Treasury Regulations 1981.

Articles which can be supplied from Departmental stock lists are not necessarily included in these Contracts. In this regard, Departments should pay particular attention to Instruction No. 86 of the Treasurer's Instructions and Determinations when issuing orders for the supply of stores or for works and services.

INDEX OF SCHEDULES

For particulars of items listed under the various Schedules and details of such Contracts, reference should be made to the *Government Gazette* indicated.

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1. Definitions:

- 1.1 "Board" means the State Tender Board.
- 1.2 "Contract" means the contract to which these conditions have been attached.
- 1.3 "Contract Price" means the price the Board has accepted for the supply of the Stores or the price of the Stores as varied by the Board in accordance with these General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.4 "Contractor" means the party specified in the contract as the "Contractor".
- 1.5 "Order" means a requirement in writing from the Purchaser to supply any of the stores which are subject to the Contract.
 - 1.6 "Month" shall mean calendar month.
 - 1.7 "Person" shall include a corporation.
- 1.8 "Schedule" means the Schedule (of which these conditions shall form part) to the contract.
- 1.9 "Purchaser" includes the Crown in right of the State of Victoria and any State Government Instrumentality or State Government Authority approved by the Board.
- 1.10 "Stores" means goods, supplies and requisitions and where the context so admits or requires, services.
- 1.11 Masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular to include the plural, and the plural the singular.
- 2. Supply of Stores:
- 2.1 During the Contract period Stores may be ordered by—
 - 2.1.1 any State Government Department; or
- 2.1.2 any State Government Instrumentality approved by the Board; or
- 2.1.3 any State or Local Government Authority approved by the Board
 - and shall be supplied by the Contractor in accordance with the terms and conditions herein.
- 2.2 Under this Contract, Stores may be ordered by any Department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the Contractor to supply.
- 3. Ordering of Stores:
- 3.1 Except where definite quantities are specified the Purchaser shall not be bound to order from the Contractor all the Stores enumerated in the Schedule, but only those Stores and such quantities of those Stores as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Purchaser, however, require a larger supply of Stores than the estimated quantity stated in the Schedule, the Contractor shall nevertheless be bound to supply the same at the Contract Price.
- 3.2 Orders shall be issued by the Purchaser as and when required over the period of the Contract.
- 3.3 The Purchaser reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the Contractor any of the items enumerated in the Schedule, the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.
- 3.4 The Contract is not to be considered as being broken, infringed or vitiated by any Stores being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

4. Price:

General Conditions of Contract

- 4.1 Subject to the provisions of Condition 5, the Contractor shall be paid the Contract Price for the Supply of Stores and the Contract Price shall, unless otherwise provided, include all patent rights and royalties and all duties of customs and excise and all other dues and charges incurred in connection with the Stores, or to which any of the materials forming part of the Stores may be subject prior to their delivery, and also the cost of all bags, packages, wrappings, drums, tins, barrels, casks, cases, and other containers covering the Stores, and of all bills of lading, both single and in duplicate, and of the passing of Customs entries, and every expense attending the packing and delivery of the Stores.
- 4.2 Where a recognised manufacturer's trade list price forms the basis of the Contract Price the Contractor shall identify the trade list referred to by date, number or other suitable reference.

5. Price Variations:

- 5.1 The Contract Price shall be firm unless otherwise stated in the Contract.
- 5.2 Where a Contractor has included a provision for a variation in the Contract Price in his tender no variation in the Contract Price shall be made by the Contractor unless first approved by the Board. No variation in the Contract Price shall be approved by the Board where it is based upon an increase in the cost of labour resulting from a wage rise awarded under the Restructuring and Efficiency Principle or other productivity-related award. The Board may on application by the Contractor approve a variation in the Contract Price in whole or in part.
- 5.3 The submission by the Contractor of a price variation circular to the Board shall not be accepted by the Board as sufficient application for the purpose of Condition 5.2.
- 5.4 An application by the Contractor for a variation in the Contract Price shall be supported by all necessary documents verifying the cost variations and other matters relied on.
- 5.5 Where an application for a variation in the Contract Price is based upon a variation in the exchange rate with the Australian dollar, the variation shall only apply to the imported portion of the Stores.
- 5.6 The Board may make such inquiries as it sees fit to verify any wage, material or other cost variations relied on.
- 5.7 Where an application for a variation in the Contract Price is approved by the Board the variation shall take effect 14 days after the date of application for variation, provided that where documents in support of an application for a variation are not submitted with the application the effective date of the variation shall be 14 days after the date of the submission of satisfactory supporting documents.
- 5.8 Notwithstanding the foregoing the Board may in its absolute discretion grant or refuse a claim for a variation in the Contract Price in whole or in part.
- 5.9 The Board may if it sees fit terminate this Contract upon an application for a variation in the Contract Price.

6. Copyright, Patent Rights, etc.:

- 6.1 The Contractor shall indemnify and at all times keep the Board, the Purchaser, its officers, servants and agents indemnified against any action, claim, suit or demand including costs or expenses associated therewith arising out of the use of the Stores or any part thereof in which it is or is proposed to be directly or indirectly alleged that there is or may be any liability for an infringement or alleged infringement of letters patent, trademark, design, copyright or other protected rights.
- 6.2 If all or any of the Stores or their use in accordance with or for the purposes of the Contract is in any such action, claim, suit or demand an infringement of such rights and as a consequence the use of the Stores is enjoined, or an order is made that the whole or any part of the Stores be delivered up, the Contractor at its election and expense, shall—
 - 6.2.1 procure for the Purchaser the right to continue using such Stores; or
 - 6.2.2 replace or modify the Stores so that they are not an infringement of the aforesaid rights; or
 - 6.2.3 grant to the Purchaser a full credit for such Stores upon their return to the Contractor.
- 6.3 In the event of any claim being made or brought against the Purchaser in respect of any of the matters set out in Clause 6.1 and Clause 6.2 the Purchaser shall notify the Contractor and the Contractor, whilst keeping the Purchaser fully informed, shall be given immediate and complete control of any such claim.

7. Quality:

- 7.1 All Stores shall be according to samples (if any) and/or the standards specified in the Contract.
- 7.2 Where no standards are specified, Stores shall be in accordance with the appropriate and current standard of the Standards Association of Australia and if there is no such standard then in accordance with the appropriate and current standard of the British Standards Institution or such other appropriate standard acceptable to the Board.
- 7.3 Notwithstanding Conditions 7.1 and 7.2 all Stores supplied by the Contractor shall be of merchantable quality.
- 7.4 In the event of the tender having been accepted for Stores manufactured within Australia, all such Stores supplied shall, if required by the Board, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for and, in addition, the Contractor may at any time during the currency of the Contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the Stores supplied.

8. Delivery Expenses:

- 8.1 Stores ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges. The Melbourne District shall be within a radius of 40 km from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. Outside that radius Stores shall be delivered free or free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.
- 8.2 All Stores delivered outside the Melbourne District shall, where railway facilities are available, be delivered by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are delivered and also the name of the Contractor by whom consigned.

- 8.3 When the Contractor is required to make delivery of Stores at a railway station for transmission by rail for any State Government Department excepting State Government Authorities, Local Government Authorities or Departments of the Commonwealth, he shall obtain a receipt for the Stores on a State Transport Authority consignment note as an authority for the State Transport Authority to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Department as shall be named therein. In all instances the Contractor shall state the Order number and description of Stores on the consignment note. Should the Stores thus delivered be rejected the Contractor must bear the cost of replacing such Stores for which service the Department must not be charged any additional freight costs.
- 8.4 Should the Order on the Contractor provide that the Stores are of a fragile character, or are liable to suffer loss by leakage, they shall be consigned at the risk, where possible, of the State Transport Authority, and the Contractor shall in such circumstances provide, in writing on the consignment note, that the Stores are of a fragile character or are liable to suffer loss by leakage failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the Stores, the amount thereof to be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the security money.

9. Delivery:

- 9.1 Stores ordered under the Contract shall be despatched or delivered within the time specified in the Order and if no time is specified in the Order then within a reasonable time.
- 9.2 A delivery note containing a reference to the number and date of the Order and a correct statement of the Stores delivered shall be handed by the Contractor or his representative to the Purchaser or his representative and the person receiving the Stores shall sign for the Stores delivered.
- 9.3 Responsibility for any damage, theft or loss of Stores after delivery but prior to acceptance shall remain with the Contractor except where the damage, theft or loss results from a negligent act or omission of the Purchaser, its agents or employees.
- 9.4 Where delivery commitments under the Contract cannot be maintained, the Board shall be immediately informed of the same by the Contractor and the Board may in its sole discretion terminate the Contract.

10. Acceptance of Stores:

- 10.1 The acceptance of the Stores shall be subject to the approval of the Purchaser.
- 10.2 The Purchaser shall be deemed to have accepted the Stores when an authorised officer intimates to the Contractor that the Purchaser has accepted the Stores or when after the lapse of fourteen (14) days the Purchaser retains the Stores without intimating to the Contractor that the Stores have been rejected.
- 10.3 Property shall not pass in the Stores until the Stores have been accepted by the Purchaser.

11. Rejection of Stores:

11.1 Where prior to acceptance being made, Stores are found to be not in accordance with the specification or not of merchantable quality or differing from those ordered (whether by brand, sample or quantity) the Purchaser may reject the Stores.

11.3 The Board shall have the right to have the rejected Stores redelivered at the Contractor's risk and expense to the Contractor's premises where the Contractor shall afford every facility to accept such delivery

11.4 Neither the Board nor the Purchaser shall be responsible for the care or custody of any rejected Stores not removed by the Contractor within the time fixed by the Purchaser.

11.5 Where Stores are rejected under the provisions of this clause or where the Contractor fails to despatch and deliver Stores within the time fixed for such despatch and delivery then in the event of the Contractor failing to replace the rejected Stores or deliver Stores conforming to the Contract following reasonable notice to do so, the Board shall have the right to purchase Stores in substitution therefor from another supplier and any additional expense incurred over and above the Contract Price shall be a debt due from the Contractor.

12. Sub-contracting:

The Contractor shall not assign or sublet the Contract or any part thereof or assign or mortgage, charge or encumber the Contract without first obtaining the written consent of the Board and the Board may make its consent subject to such terms and conditions as it thinks fit.

13. Bankruptcy etc. of Contractor

Where a Contractor-

- 13.1 assigns or sublets the Contract, or any part thereof, or assigns or mortgages, charges, or encumbers, attempts to assign, mortgage, charge, or encumber all or any of the moneys payable or to become payable under the Contract, or any other benefit whatsoever arising or which may arise under the Contract, without the consent in writing of the Board being first obained; or
- 13.2 being an individual becomes bankrupt; or
- 13.3 being a corporation enters into voluntary or compulsory liquidation; or
- 13.4 makes an assignment of his estate for the benefit of his creditors, or makes an arrangement or composition with his creditors-

then and in every such case the Board shall be entitled by notice in writing to terminate the Contract forthwith but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy which shall have accrued or which shall accrue thereafter in favour of the State of Victoria.

14.1 Should the Contractor fail to comply with any of these General Conditions of Contract, special conditions, or other specifications which form part of the Contract the Board may by notice in writing served on the Contractor specify the alleged non-compliance and may require that it be rectified within a stipulated time after service of the notice ("Notice of Default").

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Where Notice of Default has been served and noncompliance has not been remedied within the time stipulated in the Notice of Default the Board in writing may give notice of termination and upon such notice being given the Contract shall be terminated in accordance with the following provisions:

14.1.1 All orders by Purchasers received by the Contractor after termination shall be returned to the Purchaser;

14.1.2 All orders received by the Contractor prior to the notice of termination shall be completed in accordance with these General Conditions of Contract, special conditions and the specifications relating thereto.

14.2 All damages and expenses incurred under or by virtue of the provisions of Condition 13 or Condition 14.1 shall be ascertained and certified to by the Purchaser and shall be deducted from any money that may be then due, or may thereafter become due to the Contractor, or that may have been deposited by him as a security in respect of the Contract. If the money then due, or thereafter becoming due to the Contractor, or deposited by him aforesaid shall be not sufficient for that purpose, the balance remaining unpaid shall be a debt by the Contractor to the State of Victoria and may be recovered from the Contractor in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

15. Payment:

15.1 The Contractor shall furnish an invoice in respect of each consignment of Stores. Accounts for payment shall specify the Purchaser's Order number and the Contractor's invoice reference number, be accompanied by essential supporting documents, and be rendered to the Purchaser.

15.2 Where specific creditor's terms are not positively stated in writing and accepted by the Board the following terms of payment shall apply:

"Settlement of accounts payable is scheduled to occur no later than 30 days after the end of the month in which a correctly rendered invoice is received provided that the goods have been received or services rendered prior to the receipt of the invoice.

Where goods are received or services rendered after a correctly rendered invoice is received, payment will be scheduled to occur no later than 30 days after the end of the month in which the goods were received or the services were rendered.

16. Disputes:

Any dispute about the Stores, whether as to type, quantity, quality, delay in delivery or any other matter whatsoever in respect of or connected with the Contract shall be determined by the Board and its decision shall be final and binding upon the Contractor. If the Board considers it necessary so to do, it may refer to a "technically qualified person" any Stores the Purchaser considers to be not in accordance with the Contract. The decision of the technically qualified person shall be final and binding upon both parties, and the expenses of such reference shall be paid by the party against whom the decision is given.

17. Service of Notices:

Any notice, consent, approval or other communication to be given to or served upon the Contractor under the Contract shall be deemed to have

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been duly given or served if it is in writing signed for and on behalf of the Board and either delivered by hand or posted in a letter addressed to the Contractor at his usual or last known place of business or (in the case of the Contractor being a Company) at its registered office or usual place of business and any notice acknowledgement or other communication to be given or served by the Contractor under the Contract shall be deemed to have been duly given or served if it is in writing signed by or on behalf of the Contractor and is either delivered by hand or posted in a letter addressed to the Board at its address shown in the Contract.

18. Security:

Where a Contractor fails to observe a term or condition of the Contract the Board may forfeit the whole or any part of any security provided by the Contractor.

19. Return of Sales Information:

The Contractor shall at the expiration of each period of six months from the commencement of the Contract furnish a return to the Board setting out details of all sales of Stores made to Purchasers during the six-month period.

20. Property Damage:

The Contractor shall be liable for any damage to property of the Purchaser occasioned by the Contractor or any person engaged by the Contractor during the delivery of any Stores or the performance of any service required under the Contract.

21. Conditions of Labour.

Every person engaged in the performance of the Contract shall be paid such wages and employed subject to such labour conditions as are or may be determined by the relevant award of the Australian Conciliation and Arbitration Commission or the relevant award of the State Conciliation and Arbitration Board or Industrial Relations Commission of Victoria.

22. Disclosure of Information:

- 22.1 The Board retains a discretionary right whether to disclose successful tender details and prices or not.
- 22.2 The fact that the Contractor has been successful in obtaining the Contract shall not be the subject of any advertisement by the Contractor.

23. Governing Law:

The Contract shall be subject to and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Victoria.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

All Stores supplied under the Contract must be accompanied by a Laboratory Test Certificate from a National Association of Testing Authorities (NATA) Laboratory bearing NATA endorsement, certifying that the Stores have been tested and comply with the specifications. Where Stores supplied under the Contract are imported as the formulated material, a certificate of quality issued by the manufacturer will be acceptable subject to approval being obtained from the State Tender Board.

Except as otherwise stipulated in the sub-schedules—all containers shall comply with all regulations pertaining to transport by rail or road.

If, during the course of the Contract, the quality of the chemical is not considered by the Purchaser as being of the standard accepted, such chemical may at any time be subjected to analysis and, if found to be inferior in quality to the accepted product, will be rejected, the cost of such analysis to be borne by the Contractor.

Products shall be registered under the Agricultural Chemicals Act 1958 prior to any purchase. Each container shall, in addition to the requirements of that Act and other legislation, bear a Batch or Reference Number.

Schedule No. 1/03-continued

Where required, all containers shall be labelled durably and legibly in accordance with the requirements of the Agricultural Chemicals Act 1958 and also the Drugs, Poisons and Controlled Substances Regulations 1985 made under the Drugs, Poisons and Controlled Substances Act 1981 and comply with any standard proclaimed under the Act.

The Contractor shall supply, upon request by the Purchaser, "Material Safety Data Sheets" for those products supplied under this Contract.
