*Crimes (Amendment) Act 1987*  
DECLARATION OF CORRESPONDING  
COMMONWEALTH, QUEENSLAND AND  
TASMANIAN LAW

Under the powers found in section 4 of the  
*Crimes (Amendment) Act 1987*, the  
Administrator in Council declares—

- (a) Part X Division 2 of the *Crimes Act 1900* of the State of New South Wales in its application to the Australian Capital Territory; and
- (b) the *Criminal Investigation (Extra-Territorial Offences) Act 1985* of the State of Queensland; and
- (c) the *Criminal Investigation (Extra-Territorial Offences) Act 1987* of the State of Tasmania—

to be laws that make provision substantially similar to the provisions of section 4 of the *Crimes (Amendment) Act 1987*.

## **Crimes (Extra-Territorial Offences) Regulations 1989**

### **Title**

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Crimes (Extra-Territorial Offences) Regulations 1989.

### **Commencement**

2. These Regulations come into operation on 27 June 1989.

### **Objective**

3. The objective of these Regulations is to prescribe the form of notice of execution of a search warrant to be given under section 342 (6) of the *Crimes Act* 1958.

### **Authorising provision**

4. These Regulations are made under section 345 of the *Crimes Act* 1958.

### **Form**

5. A notice under section 342 (6) of the *Crimes Act* 1958 must be in the form set out in the Schedule.

### **SCHEDULE**

#### **NOTICE OF EXECUTION OF SEARCH WARRANT UNDER PART IIA OF THE CRIMES ACT 1958**
