



NOTICE OF EXEMPTIONS FROM EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR RECREATIONAL VESSELS

Amending Notice

Notice is hereby given under regulation 603 (4) of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations made under the provisions of the *Marine Act* 1988, of exemptions as described in this Notice from the equipment requirements prescribed in regulations 603 (2) and 603 (3) of the Regulations.

1. In this Notice, the Notice published in the Government Gazette on 21 December 1988 in issue G.49 at page 3856 is called the Principal Notice.

Interpretation

- 2. After the definition of "Sailing Vessel" in the Principal Notice, insert—
- "Smooth or enclosed waters" has the same meaning as in regulation 603 (1) of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988.

Additions to Total Exemptions from Equipment Requirements

- 3. After clause 2 (/) of the Principal Notice, insert—
 - "(g) A canoe or kayak whilst engaged in competing in a marathon or long distance race or a sprint race, conducted by or with the approval of the Victorian Amateur Canoe Association (Inc.) or any club affiliated with that Association, not being a race any part of which is conducted on water forming rapids.
 - (h) A canoe or kayak each occupant of which is a person registered with the Victorian Amateur Canoe Association (Inc.) as a competitor eligible to compete in races of the kinds described in sub-clause (g), whilst engaged in bona fide training.
 - (i) All vessels engaged in competing in a power boat race on smooth or enclosed waters when under the supervision of the Australian Power Boat Association and the race is conducted in accordance with the Racing and Safety Rules of that Association and the operator of the vessel and any occupant being carried wears an approved personal flotation device type 1, type 2 or type 3, an approved lifejacket, an approved buoyancy vest or an approved buoyancy garment.
 - (j) All vessels fitted with a reinforced cockpit approved by the Australian Power Boat Association and engaged in competing in

a power boat race on smooth or enclosed waters when under the supervision of the Association and the race is conducted in accordance with the Racing and Safety Rules of that Association and the operator of the vessel and any occupant being carried wears an approved personal flotation device type 1, type 2 or type 3, an approved lifejacket, an approved buoyancy vest or an approved buoyancy vest or an approved buoyancy equipment or some other type of buoyancy equipment which the Association has specifically approved.".

ROAD SAFETY (DISABLED PERSONS) REGULATIONS 1990

In accordance with the provisions of the Subordinate Legislation Act 1962 notice is given of the proposal to make regulations to be known as the Road Safety (Disabled Persons) Regulations 1990.

A regulatory impact statement has been prepared as required by the Subordinate Legislation Act.

The objectives of the proposed regulations are to:

- (a) Improve parking facilities for people with disabilities;
- (b) Develop reciprocity of special parking arrangements for people with disabilities between municipalities and other States and Territories; and
- (c) Reduce the incidence of misuse of special bays for people with disabilities.

The regulatory impact statement concludes that proposed amendments to the Road Safety (Traffic) Regulations 1988 and Road Safety (Procedures) Regulations 1988, to allow establishment of a Statewide Disabled Persons Parking Scheme, are the most cost-effective means of achieving the objectives.

CODE OF PRACTICE FOR THE TETHERING OF ANIMALS

Introduction

This Code has been developed to assist people to tether animals correctly when circumstances make it a necessary method of confining and protecting animals.

The Code specifies the requirements for tethering horses, donkeys, sheep, goats, cattle, dogs and birds kept as companion animals. The requirements for the tethering of pigs are defined in the Code of Accepted Farming Practice for the Welfare of Pigs. This Code does not refer to exotic wildlife and other animals on exhibition, for example circus animals.

For the purposes of this Code, tethering is defined as the securing of an animal by an appropriately attached chain to a centre point or anchorage, causing it to be confined to a desired area. Tethering is used for longer term confinement (e.g. daily or overnight containment), and should not be confused with short-term tying up or with hobbling.

Tethering of animals may expose them to increased stress and danger. In particular, tethered animals are unable to evade predators, cannot obtain shelter from climatic extremes and do not obtain sufficient exercise. For these reasons, tethering of animals should be regarded as a temporary method of restraint and one that requires a higher standard of animal husbandry.

Tethering can be a useful method of containing animals under conditions which may otherwise cause them injury, endanger them in some way or permit them to stray. When animals are maintained on tethers for periods longer than a day they should be given regular, daily exercise.

Animals such as horses, donkeys, sheep, goats, cattle and dogs should never be tethered in conditions where they are vulnerable to heatwaves, severe cold, driving rain or predators and should never be tethered without adequate shelter under these conditions.

All animals should be trained to be tethered before being left alone on a tether and only chain tethers should be used as they provide greater security; rope and other tethers may tangle, fray or break.

GENERAL

1. Site

A suitable tethering site should:

Be reasonably flat (steep sites are unsuitable); Have an area of shade provided in hot weather and if no natural protection is available, some form of shelter should be provided in windy or wet weather;

Be clear of obstructions that may cause the tether to become entangled or cause injury to the animal. An animal can be choked when the tether becomes entangled or be hung when the animal jumps over or off obstacles.

A suitable tethering site should not:

Be waterlogged;

Cross a footpath or be close to any roadway where there is fast-moving traffic. The proximity of people or vehicles should not be such that animals will take fright.

2. Type of Tether

2.1 Horses, Donkeys, Cattle, Goats and Sheep Tethering by the leg or foot is unacceptable. A leather neckband or leather headcollar should be fitted with a swivel to which the tether is attached; the tether in turn should be firmly attached to an appropriate anchorage with a 360° swivel fitted at ground level, allowing the animal to cover the area without tangling.

2.2 Dogs

A leather neckband or collar should be fitted to a swivel attached to a tether of approximately 3 metres in length. The other end of the tether should be firmly attached via a swivel to:

A strong wire which should be about 1.5 metres above ground level. The wire should be firmly secured at either end to trees, fences or posts but must have stops at either end to ensure that the running tether cannot become entangled or injure the dog; or

An appropriate anchorage with a 360°C swivel fitted at ground level, allowing the animal to cover the area without tangling.

2.3 General

The metal chain should be of an appropriate weight and strength for the animal to be tethered, i.e. chains for dogs would obviously be lighter than those used for cattle and should not be so heavy as to cause an animal a problem in moving.

3. Animals

3.1 Horses, Donkeys, Cattle, Goats and Sheep The site should permit a minimum tether radius of six metres.

The site should be well grassed and provide adequate grazing at all times especially if grass is to be the sole source of food. It should be free from poisonous plants, shrubs and trees. Horses, donkeys and cattle are fastidious feeders and goats may require two or more changes per day. All sites should be changed at least every 24 hours.

Horses or donkeys less than two years old should not be tethered.

Mares in season should not be tethered near stallions.

Mares about to foal or with a foal should not be tethered.

Stallions should not be tethered near any other horses.

The temperament and exercise needs of cattle, goats and sheep are such that they should not be tethered if under 6 months of age. Young animals need more exercise than a tether would permit and they are likely to resist the tether and sustain injuries.

3.2 Dogs

The site should provide a minimum of 6 metres run.

Dogs less than 4 months old should not be tethered.

Bitches in season should not be tethered where entire males may have access.

Bitches about to give birth should not be tethered.

Tethered dogs should have ready access to a kennel, shed or other protection from the elements and for sleeping.

The kennel should be of an appropriate size for the particular animal and provide no threat of entanglement.

3.3 Birds

Should not be tethered under any circumstances.

4. General Tethering Requirements

Frequency of Inspection: Tethered animals require greater supervision than others and should be inspected at least twice in each 24 hours during daylight hours. This should be increased to three times in very hot weather.

Water: Clean, wholesome, fresh water should be available at all times in troughs or heavy containers which are firmly fixed on the perimeter of the tether.

Food: Dogs should receive a fresh supply of food daily. Other tethered animals should receive supplementary feeding where grazing is not adequate.

Whereas the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth, by and with the advice of the Executive Council has deemed it expedient that a Commission should issue to The Honourable Sir Albert Edward Woodward, O.B.E., Q.C.; Douglas Gilbert Williamson, R.F.D., Q.C. and William Patrick Curry in the terms set out below.

Now therefore the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council appoints and constitutes you The Honourable Sir Albert Woodward, O.B.E., Q.C., Douglas Gilbert Williamson, R.F.D., Q.C., and William Patrick Gurry, Esquire to be Our Commissioners:

And hereby appoints The Honourable Sir Albert Edward Woodward, O.B.E., Q.C., to be Chairman of the Royal Commission. To inquire into and report upon the affairs of, and transactions engaged in, by the corporations described in the attached Schedule hereto ("the Tricontinental Group") and, in particular, without limiting the generality of the foregoing—

- 1. Whether any person (which expression shall include any corporation) has committed any offence under or has contravened or failed to comply with the provisions of:
 - (i) the Companies (Victoria) Code, the Securities Industry (Victoria) Code and Futures Industry (Victoria) Code, the Companies (Acquisition of Shares) (Victoria) Code and corresponding legislation in the participating States and Territory; or
 - (ii) the criminal law of Victoria or of any other State or Territory:

in the course of or in relation to the affairs of or transactions engaged in by any of the corporations in the Tricontinental Group.

- 2. Whether any officer of any of the corporations in the Tricontinental Group in the course of or in relation to the affairs of or transactions engaged in by any of the corporations in the Tricontinental Group has engaged in illegal, corrupt or improper activities or conduct or has acted in breach of any duty owed by that officer to any corporation in the Tricontinental Group.

And we declare that you are authorised to conduct you inquiry into the matters mentioned aforesaid under these our Letters Patent in combination or together with:

- (i) you appointments as inspectors pursuant to Part VII of the Companies (Victoria) Code;
- (ii) you authorisations pursuant to s. 45 of the National Companies and Securities Commission Act 1979 of the Commonwealth and s. 12 of the National Companies and Securities Commission (State Provisions) Act 1981; and
- (iii) any other appointments or authorisations you receive under the laws of the Commonwealth or of any State or Territory of the Commonwealth to conduct an investigation concerning the affairs of or transactions engaged in by corporations in the Tricontinental Group.

And we require you as expeditiously as possible to make your inquiry and to furnish—

- (i) an interim report by 30 June 1991; and
