Shop Trading Act 1987

PROCLAMATION

**Exemption of Shops from the Closing
Provisions of Part 2 of the Act**

I, Sir John McIntosh Young, Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council and under sections 8 (8) and 8 (9) of the *Shop Trading Act 1987*, by this proclamation exempt shops located in—

- (a) the municipalities mentioned in Schedule Five to the *Public Service Act 1974*; and
- (b) the Geelong Urban Area as defined in section 5 (4) of the *Shop Trading Act 1987*—

from the closing provisions of sections 7 (1) and 7 (3) of the Act, between the hours of 10.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. on Sunday 2 December, Sunday 9 December, Sunday 16 December and Sunday 23 December 1990.

This proclamation does not exempt shops for the sale of motor cars from the closing provisions of section 7 (2) and has no effect on the sale of liquor subject to the *Liquor Control Act 1987*.

TEACHERS REGISTRATION BOARD REGULATIONS 1990

Title

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Teachers Registration Board Regulations.

Commencement

2. These Regulations shall come into operation on 1 November 1990.

Objective

3. The objective of these Regulations is to provide for the registration of persons as teachers.

Authorising Provision

4. These Regulations are made under section 52G of the *Education Act 1958*.

Revocation

5. The Teachers Registration Board Regulations 1989 and the Teachers Registration Board (Amendment) Regulations 1990 are revoked.

Definitions

6. In these Regulations:

"Act" means the *Education Act 1958*.

"Board" means the Teachers Registration Board.

"Approved" means approved by the Board.

"Register" means the Register of teachers kept pursuant to the Act.

"Tertiary Study" except where otherwise approved means study above Year 12 level.

"Teacher Training" means pre-service professional studies in foundation education subjects, teaching methodology and supervised practice teaching.

"Industrial Experience" means being engaged in an approved occupation of a non-teaching nature.

"Qualification" means an award granted by a tertiary institution or other body on completion of a course of study or a course of training or both.

GENERAL REGISTRATION

7. Primary

7. (1) The Board must grant primary registration to an applicant who holds approved qualifications requiring at least 3 years of approved tertiary study including an approved course of teacher training of at least one year's duration incorporating approved methods and practice of primary teaching.

7. (2) The Board must grant primary registration to an applicant who applies prior to 1 July 1991 and—

(a) has successfully completed an approved course of teacher training of at least one year's duration which incorporates approved methods and practice of primary teaching; and

(b) holds the Bachelor of Special Education at Monash University or an approved equivalent.

8. Secondary

The Board must grant secondary registration to an applicant who:

(1) Holds approved qualifications requiring at least 4 years of approved tertiary study including—

(a) an approved course of teacher training of at least one year's duration; and

(b) at least two and one-third years of approved academic study; or

(2) Has completed:

(a) an approved trade course; and

(b) approved industrial experience; and

(c) an approved course of teacher training of at least one year's duration; and

(d) one year of approved study in addition to the studies required for the trade course.

PROVISIONAL REGISTRATION

9. (a) The Board must grant provisional registration to a person who—

(i) holds approved qualifications; and

(ii) has received an offer of employment from the Ministry of Education to teach in a State school; and

- (iii) where appropriate, is enrolled in an approved course of study leading to general registration.
- (b) The Board must grant an extension of provisional registration to a person who—
 - (i) continues to be employed to teach in a State school; and
 - (ii) where applicable, makes satisfactory progress in the course of study.

CATEGORY REGISTRATION

10. *Primary*

The Board must register in the category Teacher (Special Education) a person who applies prior to 1 July 1991 and who—

- (i) holds the Bachelor of Special Education at Monash University or an approved equivalent; and
- (ii) has successfully completed an approved course of specialised teacher training of at least one year's duration.

11. *Secondary*

(1) The Board may register a person in any of the following categories:

- (a) Remedial Support Teacher in accordance with sub-regulation (2);
- (b) Instrumental Music Teacher in accordance with sub-regulation (3).

(2) The Board must grant registration in the category of Remedial Support Teacher to any person holding an approved three-year Diploma of Teaching (Primary) or its approved equivalent together with an approved Graduate Diploma in Special Education (Learning Disabilities) or its approved equivalent providing the Board receives an application for registration on or before 28 February 1991.

(3) The Board must grant registration in the category Instrumental Music Teacher to a person who provides approved evidence that he/she has attained the necessary competence to perform the duties of an Instrumental Music Teacher.

TEACHING EXPERIENCE

12. (1) In determining whether a person is suitably qualified to teach, the Board must take into account approved teaching experience.

(2) The teaching experience shall only be accepted where there is a shortfall in the supervised practice teaching component of an approved course of teacher training.

(3) The shortfall must not be greater than one-third of the supervised practice teaching requirement of the Board.

(4) The teaching experience must occur after successful completion of the course of teacher training.

DOCUMENTATION

13. (1) An applicant must—

- (a) complete the "Application for Teacher Registration" form as approved by the Board; and
- (b) attach to the application original documentary evidence including—
 - (i) evidence of successful completion of any courses of study;
 - (ii) academic transcripts listing subjects studied and results;
 - (iii) where appropriate the quantity of supervised practice teaching undertaken within the teacher training component of the course of study;
 - (iv) evidence of teaching experience or industrial experience where appropriate.

(2) The Board may, in special circumstances, accept documentation that is not original.

(3) (i) If an applicant is able to satisfy the Board that the original evidence required in sub-regulation (1) cannot be obtained the Board may accept credits granted to the applicant by an approved training institution on the basis of the claimed qualification.

(ii) The applicant must successfully complete a course of study in accordance with the Board's Regulations to be eligible for any registration pursuant to sub-regulation (3).

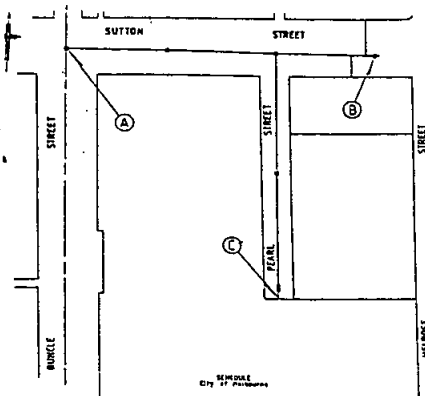

**ROAD SAFETY (TRAFFIC) (PARKING
CONTROL) REGULATIONS 1990**

In accordance with the provisions of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1962* notice is given of the proposal to make regulations to be known as the Road Safety (Traffic) (Parking Control) Regulations 1990.

A regulatory impact statement has been prepared as required by the Subordinate Legislation Act.

**LAND CONSERVATION COUNCIL
VICTORIA'S RIVERS AND STREAMS**
Publication of Proposed Recommendations
The Council's proposed recommendations for Victoria's rivers and streams will be available from Friday, 23 November 1990.

These recommendations describe proposals for the use of Victoria's rivers, and the protection of their nature conservation, recreation, scenic, and cultural heritage values. They apply only to public land and propose the establishment of a Heritage River system and protection of Essentially Natural Catchments.

The principal objective of the proposed regulations is to increase the contribution which park users make to the cost of maintaining National, State and Regional Parks on the basis of services and facilities available in those parks.

2. investigate measures to improve the safety of motorcycling on Victorian roads, including the role of information campaigns and public education, and having particular regard to all road users;
3. investigate ways of reducing the cost to the community of accidents involving motorcycles;
4. report on the status and effectiveness of motorcycle training programs and licensing practices operating in Victoria including investigating the merit of schemes to encourage participation in rider training;
5. investigate the relationship between accident risk and engine capacity of motorcycles for Transport Accident Charge purposes;
6. define a light motorcycle and report on any appropriate changes to existing driver licensing and registration requirements for the safe operation of such vehicles;
7. investigate the potential of motorcycle conspicuity measures (including the mandatory operation of headlamps during daytime) to reduce the risk of accidents, to identify problems which might arise as a result of such measures, and in this regard to consider recent proposals to introduce an Australian Design Rule requiring daytime operation of headlamps;
8. report on the efficiency and effectiveness of consultation between relevant Government road safety bodies and representative motorcycle rider and industry groups;
9. assess the benefits from the creation of an advisory body on motorcycle safety issues and to consider the composition and constitution of such a body.

The purpose of the Local Law is to—

- (a) provide for the peace, order and good government of the municipal district of the City of Brighton; and
- (b) provide for those matters which require a Local Law under the *Local Government Act 1989* and any other Act; and
- (c) provide for the administration of Council powers and functions; and
- (d) prohibit, regulate and control activities, events, practices or behaviour in places so that no detriment is caused to the amenity of the neighbourhood, nor nuisance to a person nor detrimental effect to a person's property.

The general purport of the various parts of the Local Law is:

Part 1—Preliminary Provision

To detail the authorising provisions, set the operation date of the Local Laws, set the revocation date of the Local Laws and definitions to be used in the Local Laws.

Part 2—The Council

Division 1—Common Seal

To regulate the use of the common seal and prohibit unauthorised use of the common seal or any device resembling the common seal as required by section 5 (3) (c) of the *Local Government Act 1989*.

Division 2—Election of Mayor

Part 3—Council Administration
