ROAD SAFETY (TRAFFIC) REGULATIONS 1988

Approval for Australia Post vehicles to be ridden on footpaths, bicycle paths and reservations.

Regulation 1604 (2) (h) of the Road Safety (Traffic) Regulations 1988 enables the Roads Corporation by notice in the Government Gazette to specify people or vehicles to whom the prohibition against driving a vehicle on a footway, bicycle path or reservation (including nature strips) is not to apply.

G 7 14 February 1990 453

In accordance with that regulation, I Maxwell Lay, delegate of the Roads Corporation, specify Australia Post people and vehicles which meet the following criteria:

- 1. The person riding the vehicle-
- (a) gives way to all pedestrians; and
- (b) takes adequate precautions to avoid collision with or danger or obstruction to any person or thing on or adjacent to the footpath; and
- (c) is engaged in the delivery of postal articles.
- 2. The vehicle is a bicycle or a motorcycle with an engine capacity not exceeding 110cc.
- 3. The vehicle does not exceed a speed of 7 km/h while being ridden on a footway, bicycle path or reservation.
- 4. The vehicle is not ridden on a footway, bicycle path or reservation within 5 metres of a shop, elderly citizens' or disabled persons' centre, or a kindergarten or centre for pre-school children.

ROAD SAFETY (LARGE VEHICLE) REGULATIONS 1990

In accordance with the provisions of the Subordinate Legislation Act 1962 notice is given of the proposal to make regulations to be known as the Road Safety (Large Vehicle) Regulations 1990.

A regulatory impact statement has been prepared as required by the Subordinate Legislation Act.

The objectives of the proposed regulations are-

to reduce excessive speed and driver fatigue so as to reduce the risk and severity of collisions involving prime movers, long distance buses and trucks carrying dangerous goods;

to require operators to be accountable for the hours of work of drivers using their vehicles and for the speed at which their vehicles are driven;

to improve driver behaviour by monitoring large vehicle speed;

to limit the top speed capability of specified large vehicles and so reduce the number and severity of accidents;

to deter unsafe driving of large vehicles by increasing the penalties for the more dangerous offences; to provide a detailed record of large vehicle operations immediately prior to collisions, for use in accident analysis;

to use available enforcement resources more effectively.

The proposed regulations will require owners of specified large vehicles to limit the maximum speed capability and to monitor the operations of their vehicles and ensure that their drivers comply with speed and driving hours regulations. The regulations also increase penalties for drivers of large vehicles who commit speeding and other offences related to road safety.

The regulatory impact statement concludes that the proposed measures are justified and that possible alternatives such as industry self-regulation or increased enforcement would be ineffective and more costly.



- (vi) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Check and Training Pilot—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a Check and Training Pilot.
- (vii) A pilot who is designated by the Chief Commissioner as Chief Pilot—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a Chief Pilot.
- (viii) A pilot who is designated by the Chief Commissioner as Senior Pilot—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a Senior Pilot.
- (ix) A pilot who is designated by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Check and Training Pilot and who is also Chief Pilot—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a pilot who is a Check and Training Pilot and who is also a Chief Pilot.

- "Pilot" means a member attached to the Police Air Wing, who is the holder of a Commercial or Senior Commercial Pilot's Licence and who is performing duty as a pilot.
- "Pilot in Charge" means the Senior Pilot, other than the Chief Pilot, who, at the direction of the Chief Commissioner supervises the duties of other pilots in addition to his regular duties.
- "Training Pilot" means a pilot other than a Check Pilot who is appointed to perform training duties.
- "Year of Service" means year of service as a pilot in the Air Wing.

(B) Flying Allowance

There shall be paid to a member appointed or seconded by the Chief Commissioner to the Air Wing to perform the duties of a pilot (helicopter) and whilst occupying

that position, an allowance (inclusive of any other Special Duties Allowance) equivalent to the amount by which the salary for the appropriate classification as specified and as fixed from time to time by the Award exceeds the base salary and allowances, except the allowance for uniform, prescribed or hereafter to be prescribed for the rank of such member by any Determination of the Police Service Board.

(C) Additional Allowances

In addition to the salary and allowances referred to in paragraph (B) above, the following allowances shall be paid to the member as applicable:

- (i) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to hold, and who holds, a Multi-Engine or Single-Engine, Command or Co-Pilot Instrument Flying Rating, an allowance as prescribed for that Rating by the Award.
- (ii) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to hold, and who holds, a Senior Commercial Pilot's Licence—an allowance as prescribed by the Award.
- (iii) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, the Senior Pilot and is required to supervise up to 3 helicopter pilots—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for Pilot in Charge.
- (iv) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, the Senior Pilot and is required to supervise more than 3 helicopter pilots—an allowance as prescribed by the Award for Pilot in Charge.
- (v) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Check and Training Pilot-an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a Check and Training Pilot.
- (vi) A pilot who is required by the Chief Commissioner to be, and who is, a Check and Training Pilot and Instrument Rating Examiner-an allowance as prescribed by the Award for a Check and Training Pilot who is an Instrument
