Various Foreshore Reserves

- I, Steven Marshall Crabb, Her Majesty's Minister for Conservation and Environment, for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978 do hereby apply the regulations made on 16 July 1990 (vide Government Gazette of 18 July 1990) for or with respect to the Portarlington Foreshore Reserve to the following reserves:
- 1. Bellarine Foreshore Reserve (Harvey Park). The land in the Parish of Paywit being that portion of the area permanently reserved for public purposes as indicated by red colour on plan marked P/30.11.88 attached to Department of Conservation and Environment Correspondence number Rs 10456 and known as Harvey Park Reserve.

- 10. Indented Head/St. Leonards Foreshore Reserve. The land in the Parish of Paywit being that portion of the area permanently reserved for public purposes as indicated by red colour on plan marked PW/30.1-1.88 attached to Department of Conservation and Environment Correspondence number Rs 5154.
- 11. Breamlea Foreshore Reserve. REGULATIONS

Reserve for Conservation of an Area of Natural Interest

I, Steven Marshall Crabb, Her Majesty's Minister for Conservation and Environment in and for the State of Victoria, under the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978 do make the following Regulations for or with respect to Crown Allotment 59C, Parish of Tiega temporarily reserved as a site for the conservation of an area of natural interest by Order in Council of 14 August 1990 (hereinafter referred to as "the Reserve").

REGULATIONS

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge.
 - 2. In the Reserve no person shall-
 - (a) enter or remain who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;
 - (b) carry, use or discharge any firearm, air rifle or any other weapon;
 - (c) carry or use any trap, snare, net or other device for the capture of animals;
 - (d) disturb, interfere with or destroy any bird or other animal or its lair or nest;
 - (e) interfere with, mark, deface, or.damage any buildings, gates, fences, barriers, seats, signs or other improvements;
 - (f) leave or deposit any glass bottle, tin can, waste paper, refuse or any other rubbish except in receptacles provided for the purpose;
 - (g) erect buildings, nor sell or offer to sell or hire any article or commodity;
 - permit any dog unless such dog is at all times controlled by a chain, cord or leash.
- 3. In the Reserve no person shall, unless authorised in writing by the Regional Manager, Mildura Region of the Department of Conservation and Environment-

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- (a) interfere with, mark, deface or damage, pick or injure any tree, shrub, flower, plant or any other vegetation;
- (b) light or cause to be lit any fire except in any properly constructed fireplace provided for that purpose;
- (c) camp;
- (d) drive any vehicle other than on a formed road or car park open to the public;
- (e) put or allow to remain any sheep, horses, cattle, pigs or other animals;
- (f) organise or take part in any public entertainment,game or sport;
- (g) disturb or remove any soil, sand, humus, gravel or rock-(Rs 14202).

Water Act 1989 NOTICE OF SALE OF ADDITIONAL WATER RIGHTS

Notice is hereby given under section 229 (4) that I, John Langford, General Manager of the RWCV, as delegate of the Minister, have decided to sell additional water rights from the Macalister Irrigation Districts at auction under section 229 (3) of the Water Act 1989.

- 1. I declare that the water rights are available for purchase by any person holding the qualifications specified below:
 - (a) Ownership or leasehold land shown within the orange border on Plan No. 250015 which is available for inspection between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. at the RWCV's Regional Office, 2 Pearson Street, Maffra.
 - (b) Satisfactory completion of the Preregistration form available from the RWCV Maffra office and lodgement of the form at this office by 4 p.m. Friday, 15 February 1991. My decision on whether the form has been satisfactorily completed will be final.
 - (c) Satisfactory compliance with eligibility criteria:
 - (i) Location of Holding-Landholders wishing to purchase irrigation water right must have access to suitable freehold land within or adjacent to the existing Macalister Irrigation

- (ii) Supply Route—Landholders must demonstrate that they have a legal access between the proposed RWCV source of supply and freehold land on which the entitlement will be used. This access must be suitable for the location of appropriate supply works, including maintenance of required
- (iii) Supply Works—Landholders must agree to install at their cost, and to RWCV standards, works for the supply of water to lands on which the entitlement will be used. Where entitlement is to be taken through existing supply works, the suitability of these works will be assessed and upgraded as necessary at the landholder's cost.
- (iv) Maximum Entitlement—Land-holders who purchase water for irrigation purposes would not normally be eligible to purchase volumes greater than that consistent with a maximum unit entitlement rate of 10 megalitres per hectare of suitable land. Bidders wishing to purchase volumes in excess of this upper limit must obtain specific approval of the RWCV prior to auction.
- (v) Salinity and Drainage—The land on which the entitlement will be used must be appropriately drained, either by access to RWCV drains or by means of a natural drainage course. Additional allocations would not be made in areas with rising water tables, or existing salinity problems.
- (vi) Protection of Existing Water Entitlements—The allocation of additional entitlement will be limited to areas supplied from distribution channels capable of supplying the additional commitment, without adverse effect on the supply of preexisting entitlement.

My decision on whether landholders have satisfactorily complied with eligibility criteria will be final.

- (d) Signing of written agreement to comply with terms and conditions of the sale.
- 2. The details of the method by which the water rights are to be sold are—
 - (a) Sale by auction to highest qualified bidder.

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- (b) Auction to be held on Friday, 15 March 1991 at 10.30 a.m. at the Memorial Hall, Foster Street, Maffra.
- (c) Terms of sale at auction are-

Payment of 10% on fall of hammer. Balance in 28 days from date of account.

Purchaser to accept water right subject to vendor's terms and conditions.

- 3. The conditions subject to which the water rights are to be sold are—
 - (a) The demonstration by purchasers that they have satisfactorily complied with eligibility criteria.
 - (b) The acknowledgement by purchasers that newly allocated water will be available after completion of the sale and construction of any necessary new supply works. Sales and restrictions will apply to these new water rights for 1990-91 and subsequent seasons as for existing allocations.
 - (c) The acknowledgement by purchasers that from the commencement of 1991-92 season changes will be made for the water as permanent entitlement based on a common seasonal allocation.
 - (d) The published Auction Conditions and Procedures (form reference No. bbd12rv0) which are available from the RWCV's Maffra Office.







SHIRE OF HAMPDEN



- 2. After clause 2 of the Principal Order insert:

 "2a. For the purposes of better achieving the objects of the Institute of Catholic Education, the Institute may affiliate with the Australian Catholic University Limited in order to participate in the Unified National System of higher education being implemented by the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, and for such purpose to enter into an agreement with Australian Catholic University Limited for the management and conduct by Australian Catholic University Limited of the Institute's Campuses and its activities thereon."
- 3. In clause 6 (a) of the Principal Order delete "half the maximum number of" and insert "8".
- 4. For clause 6 (c) of the Principal Order substitute—
- "(c) the Council shall meet at least once in each year.".
 - 5. In clause 7 of the Principal Order insert-
- "(w) do all such things as are necessary or incidental for the purposes of clause 2A of this Constitution.".

Post-Secondary Education Act 1978 AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF HAWTHORN INSTITUTE OF EDUCATION

Whereas the Governor in Council by an Order (hereinafter called "the Principal Order") made pursuant to section 23 of the Post-Secondary Education Act 1978 (hereinafter called "the Act") published in the Government Gazette on 16 December 1981 constituted a Council to manage and control the Hawthorn Institute of Education (hereinafter called "the Institute").

And whereas the Council of the Institute and the Council of the University of Melbourne (hereinafter called "the University") have, by Heads of Agreement dated 22 December 1989, agreed to investigate closer co-operation and association on the basis of the general principles set out in the Heads of Agreement, and to pursue as far as practicable the implementation of those principles.

And whereas the Council of the University and the Council of the Institute have now agreed upon the manner and method of this closer cooperation and association.

- And whereas sub-section 4 of section 23 of the Act provides that the Governor in Council may, on the recommendation of the Victorian Post-Secondary Education Commission (hereinafter called "the Commission") made at the written request of a Council, by any subsequent order made in relation to the Council make further provision or amend or vary any provision of a previous order relating to the Council so as to—
- (a) make such provision for or with respect to the membership of the Council as he thinks fit;
- (b) confer on the Council such powers as he thinks necessary or expedient for the purpose of managing and controlling the Institute; and
- (c) make such other provisions for or with respect to the constitution, powers, duties and functions of the Council, as in his opinion are necessary or expedient.

And whereas the Council of the Institute has written to the Commission requesting that further provision be made and that the provisions of the Principal Order be varied and amended in the terms hereinafter contained.

And whereas the Commission has recommended to the Governor in Council that further provision be made and that the provisions of the Principal Order be varied and amended in the terms hereinafter contained.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, does by this Order provide as follows:

- 1. Paragraph 1 of the Principal Order is amended as follows:
 - (a) After the definition of "Academic Staff"
 - "award courses" means courses of study or units in courses of study which would, if successfully completed, lead to higher education award;
 - (b) After the definition of "Students" insert the following definition:
 - "University" means the University of Melbourne within the meaning of Melbourne University Act 1958.".

- 2. Paragraph 2 of the Principal Order is amended by inserting after sub-paragraph (b)—
 - "(c) to provide facilities for services for study, research or education;
 - (d) to undertake research, development, consultancy or other services for commercial organisations, public bodies and individuals."
- 3. After section 5 of the Principal Order
- "5A. During the period I January 1991 to 31 December 1991 the Council and the Members thereof appointed pursuant to paragraph 5 shall not exercise any of the powers conferred by paragraph 17 or 18 or discharge any of the duties imposed by paragraph 19 and during that period the Council shall not meet.".
- 6B. During the period 1 January 1991 to 31 December 1991 the provisions of paragraphs 11 to 19 shall be construed as if a reference to the Council were a reference to the Board of Directors established by paragraph 6c.
- 6c. There shall be a Board of Directors of the Institute consisting of 12 members appointed or elected as follows:
 - (a) Three persons appointed by the Council of the University:
 - (b) Two persons appointed by the Governor in Council, but no person who is a salaried employee of the Institute or an enrolled student of the Institute or the University is eligible to be appointed under this subparagraph;
 - (c) The Institute's Director as a member ex officio;
 - (d) One person appointed by the Minister for Education in the State of Victoria;
 - (e) One person who is a full-time member of the academic staff, elected by the academic staff in the manner prescribed by the Board of Directors, so long as the person remains a full-time member of the academic staff;
 - (f) One person who is a full-time member of the general staff, elected by the general staff in the manner prescribed by the Board, so long as the person remains a full-time member of the general staff;
 - (g) One person who is an enrolled student, elected by the enrolled students in the manner prescribed by the Board of Directors, so long as the person remains an enrolled student.
 - (h) Two persons appointed by the Board of Directors for their knowledge of technical and further education or of the training of skilled personnel for industry and

commerce or such other matters as the Board of Directors considers of value to the Institute, but no person who is a salaried employee of the Institute is eligible to be a director under this paragraph.

- 6D. (1) Any person appointed to the Board of Directors as a director may be removed—
 - (a) by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Council of the University; or
 - (b) by the person or body having the authority to make the appointment.
- (2) The provisions of sub-paragraph (3) of paragraph 7 shall apply to directors.
- (3) Directors appointed under paragraph 6c shall hold office until 31 December 1991.
- (4) Any casual vacancy in the office of an elected or appointed director shall be filled by the election or appointment as the case may be of a person to fill the vacancy.

Provided that if any casual vacancy occurs after 1 October 1991 the vacancy shall not be filled.

- 6E. During the period 1 January 1991 to 31 December 1991 the provisions of sub-paragraph (3) of paragraph 15 shall apply as if for the words "ten members of the Council as specified in clause 5" there were substituted the words "seven members of the Board of Directors as specified in clause 6c".
- 4. Paragraph 17 of the Principal Order is amended by inserting after paragraph (b)—
 - "(b) may, with the approval of the Minister given after considering the advice of the Commission, enter into arrangements and agreements with the Council of the University under which the Council of the Institute will provide services, including the services of staff, and facilities for the teaching of courses and administrative support related to the teaching of courses offered by the School of Technology Education and Development (Hawthorn Institute) of the University's Institute of Education;".
- 5. After paragraph 2 of the Principal Order insert—
- "2A. During the period 1 January 1991 to 31 December 1991 the objects of the Institute must not be promoted in relation to award courses.".
- 6. This Order shall come into effect on I January 1991.
- 7. This Order shall be revoked and have no further force or effect on and from 1 January 1992.
