REGULATORY IMPACT STATEMENT
Park Regulations 1992

A Regulatory Impact Statement has been prepared in relation to the proposed Park Regulations 1992.

The draft Regulations proposed are to replace the National Parks Regulations 1975 and the Park Regulations 1984. The National Park Regulations are due to sunset on 30 June 1992 and are required to be replaced. It was decided to take the opportunity to consolidate all regulations relating to land managed under the *National Parks Act 1975* into a single set.

The objectives of the proposed Regulations are to provide for—

- (a) the presentation and protection of flora, fauna and natural and cultural features; and
- (b) the safety, enjoyment, recreation and education of visitors—

in parks and lands managed under the *National Parks Act 1975*.

The Regulatory Impact Statement examined voluntary codes of practice as an alternative to the proposed Regulations. The Regulatory Impact Statement concluded, however, that the proposed Regulations are the best means of achieving the objectives.

REGULATORY IMPACT STATEMENT
Land Conservation (Vehicle Control)
Regulations 1992

A Regulatory Impact Statement has been prepared in relation to the proposed Land Conservation (Vehicle Control) Regulations 1992.

The proposed Regulations are required to replace the Land Conservation (Vehicle Control) Regulations 1973 which are going to sunset on 30 June 1992.

The objectives of the proposed Regulations is to regulate the use of motor vehicles on public land to—

- (a) protect the environment from damage to vegetation and to control erosion; and
- (b) protect the rights and well being of other visitors and users of public land particularly from disturbance, nuisance and risk of injury.

The Regulatory Impact Statement examined the introduction of voluntary codes of practice as an alternative to the proposed Regulations. The Regulatory Impact Statement concluded, however, that this alternative would only partially meet the objective and that the proposed Regulations were the most effective means of achieving the objective.
