Notice of Decision

I, Barry Pullen, Minister for Conservation and Environment, give notice under section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1962*, as follows:

The proposed Fisheries (Recreational) Regulations 1992 have been the subject of a Regulatory Impact Statement.

Public comments were invited and 100 submissions and three petitions and standard letters were received.

After consideration of these submissions, I have decided that the proposed Regulations, with some modifications and the following more substantial changes, should be made:

- (a) the general bag limit of 30 fish per day has been removed;
- (b) the number of lines permitted to be used has been altered from 4 lines with three hooks, baits or lures in all Victorian waters to 4 lines with two hooks in marine waters and 2 lines with two hooks in inland waters;
- (c) the reduction in entitlement from 10 to 5 amateur hoopnets has been restricted to particular waters; and
- (d) the bag limit for bream in Bemm River and Sydenham Inlet has been removed.

WILDLIFE REGULATIONS 1992

Notice of Decision

I, Barry Pullen, Minister for Conservation and Environment, give notice under section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1962*, as follows:

The proposed Wildlife Regulations 1992 have been the subject of a Regulatory Impact Statement.

Public comments were invited and approximately 2500 submissions were received. These submissions were largely made up of three standard forms of letter.

After consideration of these submissions, I have decided that the proposed Regulations, should be made, with a number of modifications.

In particular the following substantial changes have been made:

- (a) the intent of the provision relating to hybridisation has been clarified to provide that persons must not interbreed species that would not hybridise in the wild and must not sell or dispose of hybrids;
- (b) the means of applying for an import/export permit has been included to provide for implementation of provisions relating to the import or export of wildlife contained in the *Wildlife (Amendment) Act 1990*;
- (c) the transaction limits for private wildlife licences have been replaced with a requirement to hold any wildlife bought or acquired for six months prior to sale;
- (d) the requirement to return unused record books to the Director-General has been deleted;
- (e) the Regulations have been adjusted to allow for the continued trapping of three species of birds, provided the birds trapped are marked and a royalty is paid;
- (f) the proposed fees for licences for private wildlife (Category 2) and (Category 3) licences have been reduced to \$50 and \$120 respectively;
- (g) the proposed fees for taxidermist licences have been reduced to \$200 for a type 1 licence and \$600 for a type 2 licence;
- (h) adjustments to commercial licence conditions have been made to clarify—
 - (i) responsibility in relation to the employment of assistants; and
 - (ii) the intent of other licence conditions;

- (i) a part 9 has been inserted in the Regulations which contains a transitional provision which saves the conditions of current licences which have not yet expired.

Zoological Parks and Gardens Act 1967
APPROVAL TO WAIVING OF ADMISSION
CHARGES TO THE ROYAL MELBOURNE
ZOOLOGICAL GARDENS AND THE SIR

The Governor in Council, under section 14A of the *Zoological Parks and Gardens Act 1967*, approves the waiving of admission charges to those members of the public specified in the Schedule at those times specified in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

- (i) At all times—
- (a) children aged three years and under;
 - (b) registered financial members of the society known as "Friends of the Zoos" on presentation of a current membership card;
 - (c) persons or groups of persons holding current complimentary tickets or life tickets issued by the Board.
- (ii) On weekdays (except Public Holidays) and Saturdays—
- (a) teachers and supervising parents accompanying children on official visits from educational institutions on a one to six basis;
 - (b) teachers and student teachers on teacher training courses;
 - (c) socially, physically or mentally disabled persons, accompanied by persons who are not socially, physically or mentally disabled.
