



Accordingly I propose to implement a three riding resubdivision of the municipal district which will see the existing North and Central ridings combined and returning six councillors, the existing West Riding returning four Councillors and the existing South Riding

returning three councillors. It is intended that this proposal will be gazetted and effective as of 1 October 1992.
