Police Regulation Act 1958

VICTORIA POLICE FORCE

Determination No. 546 of the Police Service Board

The Police Service Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Police Regulation Act 1958*, hereby makes the following Determination (that is to say):

1. The Determination No. 179 of the Police Service Board of 14 December 1971, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 25 January 1972, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:

1.1 In the Table of Contents, by deleting reference to "Sub-division I—Special Duties Allowances 8–15" as contained under the heading of Division III.

1.2 In the Table of Schedules, by deleting reference to Schedules "5—Non Commissioned Communications Centres Allowance", "7—Qualifications for Special Duties Allowances", "12—Police Air Wing Salaries" and by replacing Schedule 11—"Members with Tertiary Qualification Special Duties Allowances" with the following new title "Tertiary Qualification Allowances" and by inserting reference to a new Schedule "13—Transitional Provisions".

1.3 By inserting after paragraph 2 the following new paragraph:

"2A. POLICE AIR WING DEFINITIONS

"Chief Pilot" means the pilot (Rotary or Fixed Wing) designated by the Chief Commissioner and authorised by the Civil Aviation Authority to perform the duties and responsibilities of a Chief Pilot within the meaning of the Act or Regulations.

"Senior Pilot" means the pilot in charge other than the Chief Pilot who at the direction of the Chief Commissioner and authorised by the Civil Aviation Authority to supervise the duties of other pilots in addition to flying duties performed for the Victoria Police Force.

"Check and Training Pilot" means a pilot directed by the Chief Commissioner and authorised by the Civil Aviation Authority to conduct flight proficiency tests for the issue and renewal of pilots licences and ratings and who certifies to the competency of pilots so tested in addition to flying duties performed for the Victoria Police Force.

"Line Pilot 3 years plus with C.I.R." means a pilot who is a holder of a Commercial or Senior Commercial Pilots Licence with a minimum of three years flying experience with Command Instrument Rating and is authorised by the Chief Commissioner to perform flying duties for the Victoria Police Force.

"Line Pilot less than 3 years with C.I.R." means a pilot who is a holder of a Commercial or Senior Commercial Pilots Licence with less than three years flying experience with Command Instrument Rating and is authorised by the Chief Commissioner to perform flying duties for the Victoria Police Force.

"Line Pilot" means a pilot who is a holder of a Commercial or Senior Commercial Pilots Licence and is authorised by the Chief Commissioner to perform flying duties for the Victoria Police Force.

"Chief Engineer" means the member designated by the Chief Commissioner to perform the duties and responsibilities associated with the operation of the Engineering Section of the Victoria Police Force.

"Maintenance Supervisor" means a member other than the Chief Engineer designated by the Chief Commissioner to supervise the duties of personnel within the Engineering Section in addition to other duties associated with the repair, maintenance and overhaul of the Victoria Police Airwing fleet.

"L.A.M.E. Grade 3" means a Licensed Aircraft Maintenance Engineer who holds a minimum of three current licences issued by the Civil Aviation Authority in Airframe, Engine and Group 2 rating for Electrical and Instruments undertakes the repair, maintenance and overhaul of applicable Aircraft operated by the Victoria Police Force.

"L.A.M.E. Grade 2" means a Licensed Aircraft Maintenance Engineer who holds a minimum of two current licences issued by the Civil Aviation Authority in Airframe or Engine and undertakes the repair, maintenance and overhaul of applicable Aircraft operated by the Victoria Police Force.

"L.A.M.E. Grade 1" means a Licensed Aircraft Maintenance Engineer who holds one current licence issued by the Civil Aviation Authority in Airframe, Engine or Group 1 rating for Electrical and Instruments undertakes the repair, maintenance and overhaul of applicable Aircraft operated by the Victoria Police Force.

"A.M.E." means an Aircraft Maintenance Engineer who under supervision undertakes the repair, maintenance and overhaul of applicable Aircraft operated by the Victoria Police Force.

1.4 By deleting paragraph 7 as contained within DIVISION II and substituting therefor the following new paragraph 7:

"SALARIES AND COMMUTED PENALTY LOADINGS AND RATES

7. Save for other commuted penalty rates prescribed elsewhere in this Determination the salaries and commuted penalty loadings and rates to be paid to members designated in this paragraph shall be in accordance with the following scales:

SKILL BANDS DEFINITIONS

Band 1

This Band applies to all non-commissioned police positions where general police training and duties is the accepted minimum requirement in the successful performance of duty and includes all positions not specified elsewhere within these definitions.

Band 2

This Band applies to all non-commissioned police positions where general police training is supplemented by significant additional skills, knowledge and experience and where there is a requirement to perform regular duties beyond normal operational requirements.

Members seeking progression to this Band have to be predominantly active in operational, or operational support duties, and either successfully completed the relevant approved course or have qualified at such course in line with the relevant position description. This Band also applies to non-commissioned police engaged as instructors provided the approved Instructors Course has been successfully completed.

Band 3

This Band applies to all non-commissioned police positions where general police training is supplemented by significant advanced skills, knowledge and experience and where there is a requirement to perform regular duties beyond normal operational requirements.

Members seeking progression to this Band have to be predominantly active in investigations, prosecutions, or the Special Operations Group and must have successfully completed the relevant approved course as set out in the relevant position description. In the case of the Internal Investigation Department, members must have the experience deemed relevant, in accordance with the gazetted position, for the performance of duties in that position.

In Charge

"In Charge" means a Senior Sergeant gazetted in charge of a general duties police station where there is a second Senior Sergeant gazetted as Sub-charge and where there is responsibility for a geographic area. A Senior Sergeant deemed In Charge shall be placed on the skill band above that for which they would normally qualify.

7. (e) For the purposes of sub-paragraph 7 (d), the following are relevant approved courses:

7. (f) (i) Progression to Band 2 or Band 3 is dependent upon the successful completion of the approved training course.
- (ii) A member will automatically proceed to the appropriate skill Band if the Victoria Police Force has not afforded the member the opportunity to commence the appropriate approved course within one year of appointment to the position.
- (iii) Members of the State Forensic Science Laboratory and members engaged in duties at the Fingerprint Bureau, Audio Visual Section, Radio Electronics Division, Instrument Development and Maintenance Section and Video Graphics will be paid the appropriate Band 2 rates after 3 years and will be paid the appropriate Band 3 rates after 5 years, provided that, in all cases, they have completed the relevant training course.
7. (g) **TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS**—Notwithstanding the aforesaid provisions the members referred to in the Thirteenth Schedule hereof shall be paid the salaries and loadings as are specified therein.
7. (h) (i) All Officers and Sub-Officers who held their respective ranks and were entitled to be paid the Increment for 1st or 2nd year of service as of 11 July 1992, shall continue to be paid the base salary and commuted penalty loadings in sub-paragraphs 7 (a) and 7 (b) above at the rates specified for 1st or 2nd year of service. Further Increment progression will occur on the anniversary of their promotion.
- (ii) All Officers and Sub-Officers who were entitled to be paid the Increment for 3rd year of service as of 11 July 1992, shall continue to be paid the base salary and commuted penalty loadings in sub-paragraphs 7 (a) and 7 (b) above at the rates specified for 3rd year of service.
7. (i) All Officers and Sub-Officers who have been promoted to their respective ranks on and from 12 July 1992, shall be paid the base salary and commuted penalty loadings in sub-paragraphs 7 (a) and (b) above at the rates specified for 1st year of service. Further Increment progression will occur on the anniversary of their promotion.
7. (j) (i) All Senior Constables and Constables as of 11 July 1992, will be placed on the Increment based on year of service in that rank at that date. Further Increment progression for these Senior Constables and Constables will occur on the anniversary of that date.
- (ii) Members promoted to Senior Constable or appointed as Constables on and from 12 July 1992, will establish Increment progression on the anniversary of that promotion or appointment.
7. (k) For persons appointed to the rank of Senior Sergeant and below the increment location within the Bands in these ranks is determined by the years of service within each rank.
7. (l) For the purpose of paragraph 7 (b) a person who has been reappointed to the Force in the rank of Constable after having ceased to be a member of the Force for a period of not more than five years shall be credited with the years of previous service, up to a maximum of three years, for the purpose of salary as a Constable, but for no other purpose under this Determination.

7. (m)**POLICE AIR WING**

The following classifications shall be paid the relevant total salary prescribed for the below-mentioned Levels and Bands by paragraphs 7 (a) and 7 (b) hereof:

7. (n) OVERTIME—For the purposes of calculating the rates for the payment of overtime, under paragraph 37 (2) for all members of the Police Air Wing, with the exception of Chief Pilot, Senior Pilot and Check and Training Pilot, "base salary" shall be taken to mean "total salary" less 13 per centum.

7. (o) LEAVE LOADING—Leave loading payments under paragraph 83 for members of the Police Air Wing shall be calculated in the following manner:

- (i) Chief Pilot, Senior Pilot and Check and Training Pilot at the rate as set out in paragraph 83 (b).
- (ii) For all other members at the rate as set out in paragraph 83 (a).
- (iii) For the purposes of sub-paragraph (ii) above, "base salary" shall be taken to mean "total salary" less 13 per centum.

7. (p) For the purpose of this amending Determination (Determination No. 546) only:

- (i) Persons appointed to the Air Wing as at 11 July 1992, will be placed on the Increment based upon years of service at the Air Wing at that date. Further Increment progression will occur on the anniversary of that appointment.
- (ii) Members promoted within the Air Wing as from 12 July 1992, will be placed at Increment 1 within that new classification. Increment progression will occur on the anniversary of the date of promotion.
- (iii) Members who are employed as L.A.M.E.s Grade 1 and Check and Training Pilots, shall, when promoted to the next classification, retain their Incremental status.
- (iv) Persons appointed to the Air Wing as from 12 July 1992, will be placed at the classification as determined by reference to qualifications and experience.
- (v) Persons appointed as Aircraft Maintenance Engineers will be appointed to the appropriate salary point as determined by reference to qualifications and experience.

7. (q) All appointments and promotions to the Police Air Wing will be determined by the Chief Commissioner on the basis of the member's relevant qualifications and experience.

1.5 By deleting paragraphs 8-15 Special Duties Allowances.

1.6 In paragraphs 26 (a), 27 (a) and 28 (a), by deleting the words "daily base salary of a Senior Constable who is in his twelfth year of service and after" and substituting therefor the following: "daily base salary of a Senior Constable, Band 1, Increment 3."

1.7 By deleting from paragraph 29D (2) (a) the words "For the purposes of . . ." to the words "... Provided that:" and substituting therefor the following:

"29D. (2) For the purposes of sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph:

- (a) "Fortnightly Salary" means the base salary of a member together with any allowances payable under the Eleventh Schedule, or, where applicable, the higher base salary payable pursuant to paragraphs 22-24 hereof, but shall not include the additional salary provided for in paragraph 83 hereof. Provided that:".

1.8 In paragraph 29D (2) (a) (i), by deleting the numeral "84" and substituting therefor the numeral "83".

1.9 In paragraph 33 (1), by deleting the amounts "\$5063" and "\$4455" and substituting therefor the following new amounts "\$5596" and "\$4811".

1.10 In paragraph 34 (1), by deleting the amount "\$2556" and substituting therefor the following new amount "\$2668".

1.11 By deleting from paragraph 37 (2) the words "For the purpose of . . ." to the words "... recreational leave" and substituting therefor the following:

"37. (2) For the purpose of sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph, "Fortnightly Salary" means the base salary of a member with any allowances payable under the Eleventh Schedule or, where applicable, the higher base salary payable pursuant to paragraphs 22-24 hereof, but shall not include the additional salary, provided for in paragraph 83 hereof for a member while on recreational leave."

1.12 In paragraphs 41b (1) and 41d (1), by deleting the words "Senior Constable in his fifth and sixth years of service" and substituting therefor the words "Senior Constable, Band 1, Increment 3".

1.13 In paragraph 132, by deleting the words "will be required to transfer to Force Reserve for the period of the trial" and substituting therefor the words "will be required to be seconded to the Equal Employment Opportunity Unit, Personnel Department, for the period of the trial".

1.14 By deleting the Fifth and Seventh Schedules.

1.15 In the Eighth Schedule by deleting the words as contained in sub-paragraph (i) "(inclusive of any other Special Duties Allowance except that provided by part (iii))" and substituting therefor the following: "(inclusive of the allowance as provided for in part (iii))" and by deleting in sub-paragraph (iii) the words "(in addition to other Special Duties Allowances)".

1.16 In the Eighth Schedule, sub-paragraph (v) by deleting reference to the following members: INGLIS, J. A. 18288, COMRIE, S. J. 20324, BICKLE, K. M. 16279, JANSEN, F. 20838 and WHITTLE, R. 22508.

1.17 In the Eighth Schedule, by inserting the following new sub-paragraph (vi):

"(vi) A member whose allowance is determined according to sub-paragraph (i) above shall be paid according to the terms and conditions of this paragraph except for overtime, standby, shift duty and rostered time off, ordinary duty performed during weekends or on public holidays for which Public Service Determination Nos 10.1, 10.4, 10.5, 10.6, 10.8, 10.9, 14.8, 19.1 and 19.2 shall apply.

Provided that in the application of Public Service Determination No. 91.1 (2) (d) and its provisos, the member may be paid an allowance only at the rate of 50% of the appropriate hourly rate for each hour of duty and the total recreation leave shall not exceed the entitlement of Paragraph 82 of the Police Service Board Determinations."

1.18 By deleting the Eleventh Schedule and substituting therefor the following new Schedule:

"ELEVENTH SCHEDULE

A. TERTIARY QUALIFICATION ALLOWANCES

There shall be paid to a member while holding the position specified below and appointed to that position prior to 1 April 1991, an allowance at the following rate:

Any Officer admitted to practice as a Barrister and Solicitor in the State of Victoria or who has a degree in law (however it may be described and from whatever University or other tertiary institution within or without the State of Victoria) which is recognised by the Council of Legal Education pursuant to the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1958* as being sufficient academic qualification when combined with such further requirements as may be specified by the said Council before such admission is permitted.

(3) Payments under sub-paragraph 5 hereof shall commence when a member is recalled to duty, or, if on duty, from the commencement of that ordinary duty shift. If recalled to duty after completion of a shift that day, entitlement to the provisions of sub-paragraph (5) shall commence at either sub-paragraph (5) (b), (5) (c) or (5) (d), as appropriate.

(4) The payments under sub-paragraph 5 hereof shall cease when the member returns to his or her place of employment or residence after being relieved from the Restrictive Duty Assignment.

(5) Where a member is required to take part in a Restrictive Duty Assignment as defined in sub-paragraph (1), the member shall be entitled to payment in the following manner for all hours of the Restrictive Duty Assignment:

- (a) First 8 hours at ordinary time rates;
- (b) Next 3 hours at one and a half ordinary time rates;
- (c) Next 5 hours at double time rates;
- (d) All remaining hours of the Restrictive Duty Assignment are to be paid at one and a quarter ordinary time rates.

(6) Where possible, the application of this paragraph shall occur in a manner whereby necessary rest periods are incorporated into the assignments on a daily basis.

(7) The terms of this paragraph do not apply to members in receipt of Commuted Penalty Rates under paragraph 33."

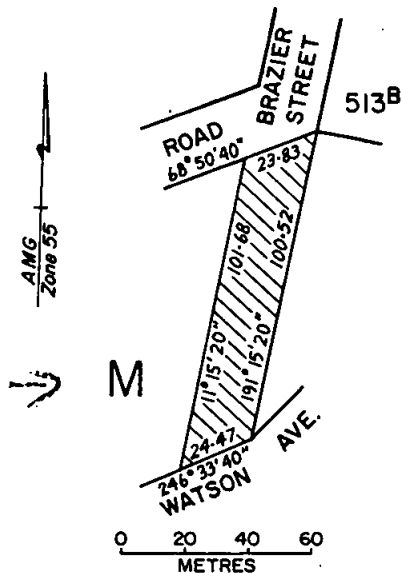

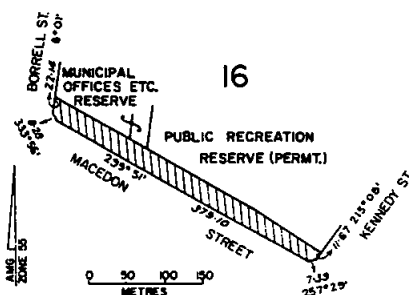

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF KEILOR

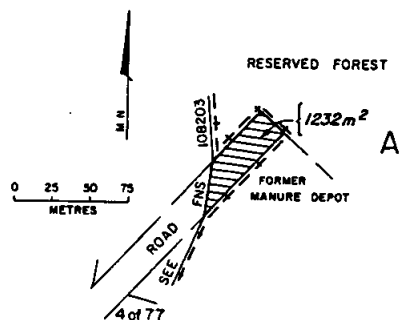
KEILOR—The road in the Township of Keilor, Parish of Maribymong as indicated by hatching on plan hereunder—(K24(2)) (Rs 3755).

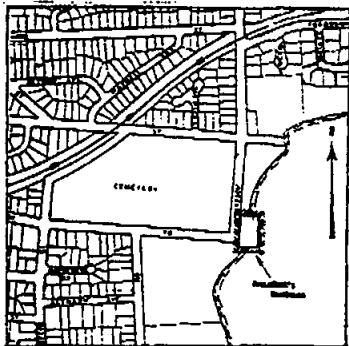
