DAIRY INDUSTRY ACT 1984

In accordance with the provisions of the Dairy Industry Act 1984, the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority does, by this notice:

As the imbalance in the current ridings is clearly inconsistent with the principles outlined in the legislation I have decided to exercise powers given to me under Part II of the Local Government Act 1958 to initiate changes to the Shire's internal boundaries.

The proposed three riding/nine councillor structure will see a voter population of approximately 1700-1800 in each riding and a brief summary of the proposal is as follows:

Bright Riding-the Parish of Bright which includes the townships of Bright, Germantown and Wandiligong;

Mt. Beauty Riding-commencing on the shire boundary at Mt. Cope, the eastern boundary of the Shire to Mountain Creek Road, the Kiewa River, Sullivans Lane, the Kiewa Valley Highway, Quarry Creek Lane, the SEC transmission line, the Kiewa Valley Highway and the Kiewa River to the southern boundary of the Parish of Darbalang which includes the townships of Mt. Beauty, Falls Creek, Tawonga and Tawonga South; and

Bucklands Riding-a rural encompassing the balance of the municipal

district which includes the townships of Harrietville and Porepunkah.

A draft copy of the map of the proposal is available for inspection at both the Shire Offices in Bright and Mt. Beauty and the Ministry's Melbourne Office.

Under section 24F of the Act, notice is given that after the expiration of one month from the publication of this notice in the Government Gazette and in a newspaper generally circulating in the municipal district of the Shire of Bright, it is my intention to recommend to the Governor in Council that an order be made to come into operation on and from 1 April 1992 to give effect to the proposal without referring it to a Division of the Local Government Commission for inquiry and report.

REGULATIONS

Special Regulations for the Care, Protection and Management of "Albert Park" in the Municipal Districts of South Melbourne and St. Kilda

I, Steve Crabb, Her Majesty's Minister for Conservation and Environment for the State of Victoria, under the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the remaining portion of land in the Municipal Districts of South Melbourne and St. Kilda permanently reserved for a Public Park by Order in Council of 21 March 1876 (vide Government Gazette dated 24 March 1876) and hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

PRIVATE AGENCY AUTHORISATION FOR INTERCOUNTRY ADOPTION

To document policy and develop guidelines for the exercise of powers under section 23, Adoption Act 1984 to authorise agencies to arrange the adoption in Victoria of non-citizen children.

- 2. Background 2.1 The Adoption Act 1984 (section 21) and related Regulations, makes provision for the application for approval of adoption agencies. Responsibility for considering such applications is vested in the Director-General (section 22). Some of the relevant factors which may be taken into account are also listed. They include "the qualifications, experience, character and number of the persons taking part, or proposing to take part, in the management or control of the organisation".
- 2.2 Authorisation of an approved agency to make arrangements for the adoption of noncitizen children (intercountry adoption) is outlined in section 23. Whether or not the Act strictly requires the Director-General to consider the factors listed in section 22 when making a decision under section 23, these factors continue to be relevant.
- 2.3 Administration of the Adoption Act 1984 is the responsibility of CSV. In addition, CSV also directly provides an intercountry adoption service. The construction of this policy is based on CSV's responsibilities for administration of the Act.

3. Relevant Factors

- 3.1 In addition to the matters listed in section 22, a number of factors should be taken into account in considering the question of whether to authorise a private agency to place non-citizen children for the purpose of adoption. They
 - (a) Whether, in the light of the needs of overseas children as reflected in the numbers made available for intercountry adoption, an additional agency is warranted at the time of application.
 - (b) Whether there are special circumstances which persuade the Director-General to authorise a private agency, so overlooking recent advice to Government about the exercise of this discretion under the Adoption Act 1984.
 - (c) Whether the necessary conditions for effective service delivery as suggested in part by Regulation are met by an application.
 - (d) Whether an application by an agency can be restricted to non-citizen children or whether it must encompass placing local children for adoption.
- 4. (A) Needs and Availability of Overseas Children
- 4.1 The roles and responsibilities of an intercountry adoption agency include the preparation and assessment of applicants and the placement and support of children made

4.2 In recent years the number of placements for intercountry adoption have been falling:

- 4.3 In addition there are currently 83 applicants who have been assessed and educated and are awaiting the placement of a child. A further 58 applicants are in the process of being assessed, and 42 are currently deferred.
- 4.4 The reduction in placements reflects changing attitudes to intercountry adoption in a number of overseas countries, in particular Korea, which provided at its peak approximately 61% of all intercountry adoptions to Australia (approximately 50% to Victoria). In 1990-91 only six placements (7%) were made in Victoria from Korea.
- 4.5 Mr Kim, Hak-Joo, The Director of Eastern Child Welfare Society, the sole agency responsible in Korea for adoptions to Australia, has recently visited Victoria and confirmed the reduction of children available for intercountry adoption. He explained that in-country adoptions in Korea were increasing, reflecting changing community attitudes. It is also understood that there has been substantial criticism of intercountry adoption in Korea. In addition, India, which in 1988-89 was the most significant sending country for Victoria making a total of 11 placements (35%), has also reversed its attitude to intercountry adoption. As a condition of continued licensing, adoption agencies in India must adopt 50% of children locally. This requirement has been progressively increased in recent years and has significantly reduced the number of agencies licensed for intercountry adoption. Other overseas programs have tended to open and close from time to time dependent on the circumstances of the overseas country and the number of applications they have received.
- 4.6 Section 32 of the Adoption Act 1984 requires that "in all matters relating to the exercise of powers and the performance of duties under this Act, the Director-General and the principal officer of an approved agency shall have regard to adoption as a service for the child".

- 4.7 In the case of a decision under section 23, overseas children are the potential recipients of the service. Licensing an additional agency would not be desirable unless the needs and best interest of overseas children, as reflected in the number of placements being made, warranted such a response at the time of application.
- 5. (B) Advice to Government about the appropriateness of private agency authorisation.
- 5.1 Adoption Standards indicate that "where the Director-General is receiving information or advice which is confusing or which indicates conflict, the Director-General may engage an independent consultant to provide additional input which may help resolve the conflict".
- 5.2 In his "Review of the Intercountry Adoption Service 1989", Justice Fogarty indirectly criticised section 23 of the Adoption Act 1984 which allows for the authorisation of an intercountry adoption agency. He made the following observation:
 - "A number of people in consultations and submissions have suggested that the program should be handed over to the control of an independent, private agency or that it should be under the control of a 'semi-independent' body or that a statutory authority should be established. The Panel reiterates its firm belief that the administration of the program must be the direct responsibility of Government. The Victorian community and the Victorian Government has a fundamental responsibility for the proper management of this program because the children must be protected and the intentions of other governments must be safeguarded so it would be quite inappropriate to transfer the program to a private organisation."
- 5.3 In his "Follow-Up Review 1991" Justice Fogarty again canvassed this issue. He recommended that "provided overall responsibility for intercountry adoption is located in a Government agency and certain safeguards are in place, approval of an independent welfare organisation to undertake the arrangement of intercountry adoptions, may, at this point in the history of the intercountry adoption program in Victoria, be warranted". In addition he concluded that in implementing this advice "all decision making functions related to assessment allocation and placement must for the time being be located within Government".
- 5.4 This advice would preclude the operation of an intercountry adoption agency with the responsibilities for assessment and placement. These responsibilities should not be separated from the arrangement of intercountry adoptions.

- 5.5 In the light of advice by Justice Fogarty about the application of section 23 in his two reports any application should be considered most carefully. While applications will be accepted, the reservations expressed by Justice Fogarty suggest special circumstances would need to exist to support an application, before it could be granted.
- (C) Necessary Conditions for Effective Service Delivery
- 6.1 The Adoption Act 1984 provides the Director-General with wide discretionary powers in considering an application by a private agency. Relevant considerations listed in section 22 are "the qualifications, experience, character and number of the persons taking part...in the management or control of the organisation".
- 6.2 Adoptions Regulations 1987 associated with the Adoption Act 1984 identify the following information which must be provided by an agency seeking approval under section 22:
 - (a) The name and address of the organisation and location of the proposed agency;
 - (b) The membership and interests of members of any governing body of the organisation;
 - (c) A copy of the rules, constitution, memorandum or articles of incorporation, as the case may be, of the organisation and a copy of any instrument evidencing the trusts, if any, related to the organisation:
 - (d) The proposed method of financing the agency, including a financial statement and budget estimate;
 - (e) The reasons the organisation wishes to make arrangements for adoption of children;
- (f) The activities the organisation proposes to undertake in relation to arranging adoptions, and the provision of an Adoption Information Service;
- (g) The experience of the agency in adoption or related family welfare services.

The same factors would need to be applied under section 23 because of the requirements of the act and because they are relevant to such an application. Additional factors may be required under section 23 and these are not spelled out in Regulation.

6.3 Other critical factors which should be taken into account include the degree of public support for and confidence in the application by the private agency. Public confidence is particularly relevant for intercountry adoption because of the extremely sensitive nature of the program and the high level of public accountability that occurs through the close scrutiny by interest groups and the mass media.

When there is significant public dispute about the merit of an application by a private agency this would be likely to accentuate the difficulties which can be experienced in the management of the program. These difficulties have a significantly detrimental effect on the children and families who have been involved in intercountry adoption. Public confidence is a necessary pre-condition to the effective operation of a private agency.

- (D) Approval for Local and Intercountry Adoption
- 7.1 The Adoption Act 1984 allows the Director-General to authorise an approved agency for intercountry adoption. Legal advice from the Victorian Government Solicitor suggests such authorisation follows on from approval as an agency for local adoptions, and that approval cannot be granted solely for intercountry adoption.
- 7.2 In any case the linking of intercountry adoption with local adoption is consistent with Adoption Standards and the recommendations of Justice Fogarty which require intercountry adoption to operate according to the same standards as local adoption. Involvement in local adoptions would most clearly ensure that a similar standard would be applied in both programs.
- 7.3 In considering the need for agencies to operate in both areas, regard must be held for the reducing number of local adoptions. Over the past ten years the number of local adoption placements have reduced from 332 in 1980-81 to 75 in 1990-91. The numbers are continuing to decline.

8. Conclusion

In the light of the above the following policy will apply to applications received under section 23 of the *Adoption Act* 1984.

An application will not be granted unless-

- An additional agency is needed to meet the needs of children, as their numbers are predictable at the time from the numbers made available for intercountry adoption; and
- There are special circumstances which persuade the Department to overlook the reservations expressed about the exercise of this discretion in recent advice; and
- The necessary conditions for effective service delivery, particularly public confidence, are met by the application; and
- The applicant is authorised under the Act to arrange local adoptions.

For Orders in Council Declaration of Certain Electrical Appliances to be Proclaimed Electrical Appliances dated 23 June 1987 and 26 July 1988, substitute—

'The Governor in Council under section 57 of the State Electricity Commission Act 1958 on the recommendation of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria declares the following electrical appliances to be proclaimed electrical appliances from 1 February 1992:

- 1. All refrigerators, refrigerator-freezers and freezers which are appliances intended for household use described below:
 - (a) "refrigerator"—a self-contained assembly consisting of—
 - (i) a thermally insulated cabinet intended for the storage and preservation of foodstuffs at a temperature above 0 degree Celsius; and
 - (ii) an electrical refrigerating unit which operates on the vapour-compression principle arranged to extract heat from within the cabinet—

and which may contain a separate zone or compartment within the cabinet intended for ice-making or for the storage and preservation of foodstuffs at a temperature below 0 degree Celsius;

- (b) "refrigerator-freezer"—a self-contained assembly consisting of two or more separate thermally insulated cabinets—
 - (i) one of which is intended for the storage and preservation of foodstuffs at a temperature above 0 degree Celsius: and
 - (ii) another of which is intended for the storage and preservation of foodstuffs at a temperature below 0 degree Celsius—

together with an electrical refrigerator unit which operates on the vapourcompression principle arranged to extract heat from within both cabinets:

- (c) "freezer"—a self-contained assembly consisting of a thermally insulated cabinet intended for the storage and preservation of foodstuffs at a temperature below 0 degree Celsius with an electrical refrigerating unit operating on the vapourcompression principle arranged to extract heat from within the cabinet.
- 2. All dishwashers which are appliances intended for household use and are designed to wash, rinse and dry (when a drying process is included) dishware, glassware and cutlery (and in some cases, cooking utensils) by chemical, mechanical or electrical means or a combination of those means.
- All refrigerative air conditioners which are appliances intended for household use and which—
 - (a) are designed to provide delivery of cooled or, if applicable, heated air to any enclosed space, room, zone or zones through the operation of an electro-mechanical mechanism which operates on the vapour compression principle; and
 - (b) have an output capacity, as determined in accordance with Australian Standard 1861.1—1988, not greater than 7.5 kW for cooling or, if applicable, for heating;

and without limiting the generality of that description there is included the kinds of refrigerative air conditioners described below:

- (i) "Multi-split air conditioner"—a refrigerative air conditioner with a single refrigeration compressor and multiple evaporators or, if applicable, condensers which are not contained within a single encased assembly;
- (ii) "Package-ducted air conditioner" (including split-ducted air conditioner)—a refrigerative air conditioner the operation of which allows conditioned air to be ducted to multiple zones;
- (iii) "Reverse cycle air conditioner"—a refrigerative air conditioner which is intended for cooling and heating and where heating is not wholly dependent on electrical resistance heating;
- (iv) "Reverse cycle air conditioner with an electrical resistance heating element"—a refrigerative air conditioner where the heating output capacity can be augmented by electrical resistance heating which may be manually or automatically activated:
- (v) "Single cycle air conditioner with an electrical resistance heating

element"—a refrigerative air conditioner where the heating output capacity is wholly dependent on electrical resistance heating;

- (vi) "Single cycle air conditioner"—a refrigerative air conditioner which is intended for cooling only;
- (vii) "Split system air conditioner"—a refrigerative air conditioner where the refrigeration compressor and the evaporator or, if applicable, condenser are not contained within a single encased assembly;
- (viii) "Unitary air conditioner"—a refrigerative air conditioner where the refrigeration compressor and the evaporator or, if applicable, condenser are contained within a single encased assembly, including window/wall mounted and fascia units.

This Order does not apply to any appliance which has been used or operated otherwise than for the purposes of testing or demonstration.

This Order may be cited as the State Electricity Commission (Energy Efficiency Labelling) (Proclaimed Electrical Appliances) Order 1992.'.


