Education Act 1958 TEACHERS REGISTRATION BOARD REGULATIONS 1992

1. Title

These Regulations may be cited as the Teachers Registration Board Regulations.

2. Commencement

These Regulations shall come into operation on 1 January 1993.

3. Objective

The objective of these regulations is to provide for the registration of persons as teachers.

4. Authorising Provisions

These regulations are made under section 52g of the *Education Act* 1958.

5. Revocation

The Teachers Registration Board Regulations 1990 are revoked.

6. Definitions

In these Regulations-

"Academic Study" means study of a discipline at a higher education institution, other than professional study, which may provide the basis for teaching courses constituting a component of the school curriculum.

"Act" means the Education Act 1958.

"Approved" means approved by the Board.

"Board" means the Teachers Registration Board

"Industrial Experience" means being engaged in an approved occupation of a non-teaching nature.

"Qualification" means an award granted by a Higher Education Institution or other body on completion of a course of study or a course of training or both.

"Register" means the register of teachers kept pursuant to the Act.

"Study at a Higher Education Institution" except where otherwise approved, means study above Year 12 Level.

"Teacher Education" means pre-service professional studies in foundation education subjects, teaching methodology and supervised practice teaching.

"Year 12" means the end of a final year of study in Victorian secondary school, or equivalent level in another education system.

7. Primary

(1) The Board must grant primary registration to an applicant who applies prior to

1 January 1995 and who holds approved qualifications requiring at least 3 years of approved study at a higher education institution including an approved course of teacher education of at least one year's duration incorporating approved methods and practice of primary teaching.

(2) The Board must grant primary registration to an applicant who applies on or after 1 January 1995 and who holds approved qualifications requiring at least 4 years of approved study at a higher education institution including an approved course of teacher education of at least one year's duration incorporating approved methods and practice of primary teaching.

8. Secondary

The Board must grant secondary registration to an applicant who—

- (1) Holds approved qualifications requiring at least 4 years of approved study at a higher education institution including—
 - (a) an approved course of teacher education of at least one year's duration; and
 - (b) at least 2 years of approved academic study including:
 - (i) a major comprising sequential study over 3 years, or equivalent, including one-third of a year of study at third-year level of a Bachelor Degree or Diploma;
 - (ii) a sub-major comprising sequential study over 2 years, or equivalent, including one-quarter of a year at second-year level of a Bachelor Degree of Diploma.

OR

- (2) Has completed-
- (a) an approved trade course; and
- (b) approved industrial experience; and
- (c) an approved course of teacher education of at least one year's duration; and
- (d) one year of approved study in addition to the studies required for the trade course.

9. English Language Skills

Applicants for registration under regulation 7 and regulation 8 must be able to demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Board that they possess skills in English language communication appropriate for teaching in a State school.

- 10. Provisional Registration
- (1) The Board must grant provisional registration to an applicant who—
 - (a) holds approved qualifications; and
 - (b) has received an offer of employment from the Department of School Education to teach in a State school; and
 - (c) where appropriate, is enrolled in an approved course of study leading to general registration.
- (2) The Board must grant an extension of provisional registration to a person who—
 - (a) continues to be employed to teach in a State school; and
 - (b) where applicable, makes satisfactory progress in the course of study.

11. Secondary Category Registration

The Board must grant registration in the Category Instrumental Music Teacher to an applicant who applies prior to 1 January 1993 and provides approved evidence that he/she has attained the necessary competence to perform the duties of an Instrumental Music Teacher.

12. Teaching Experience

- (1) In determining whether a person is suitably qualified to teach, the Board must take into account approved teaching experience.
- (2) The teaching experience shall only be accepted where there is a shortfall in the supervised practice teaching component of an approved course of teacher education.
- (3) The shortfall must not be greater than one-third of the supervised practice teaching requirement of the Board.
- (4) The teaching experience must occur after successful completion of the course of teacher education.

13. Documentation

- (1) An applicant must-

Weekdays—12.00 a.m. to 7.00 a.m.; and 9.00 p.m. to 12.00 p.m.

Saturday—12.00 a.m. to 7.00 a.m.; and 7.00 p.m. to 12.00 p.m.

Sunday and Public Holidays—12.00 a.m. to 9.00 a.m.; and 5.00 p.m. to 12.00 p.m.

Division 3—Dilapidated Buildings General Prohibition

Prohibits the owner and occupier of land on which a building is located allowing that building to become dilapidated.

Division 4—Spoil from Building Sites General Prohibition

Prohibits a person from driving a motor vehicle from any building site abutting a street unless the wheels and tyres of that motor vehicle are clear and free of all soil, earth, clay and debris, and, similarly, prohibits the owner and occupier of a building site from causing or allowing such event to occur.

Division 5—General Amenity Unsightly and Dangerous Premises

Prohibits the owner and occupier of any land allowing the land to become unsightly or detrimental to the amenity of the area in which the land is located, or allow a noxious weed to grow on the land.

Provides for the serving of Infringement Notices by an Authorised Officer where contravention occurs.

Heavy Motor Vehicles

Prohibits the owner and occupier of any land without a permit to keep, dismantle, repair or paint a heavy motor vehicle on the land.

Division 6—General Provisions Consideration of Applications

Before considering any Application under this Local Law, Council may require the applicant to give notice of the Application to any persons whom Council considers may be detrimentally affected by the grant of the Application, and also give public notice of the Application in a local newspaper.

The notice given or published must indicate that all persons affected by the grant of the

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Application may send a written submission to Council within 14 days of the date of the notice, and that such submissions received will be taken into account in the determination of the Application.

Correction of Permit

Council may correct a permit if it contains a clerical error, omission or mistake, and Council must give notice of the correction to the permitholder.

Revocation of Permit

Council may revoke a permit, if in its opinion—

- (a) a permit-holder has failed to comply with any conditions of the permit;
- (b) a permit-holder has, by reason of building works, emitted or caused to be emitted objectionable noise;
- (c) there has been a material misstatement or concealment of fact in relation to the grant of the permit;
- (d) there has been a material change of circumstances since the grant of the permit.

Currency of Permit

Unless revoked or renewed, a permit will continue in force for the period specified in the permit or for 12 months from the date of issue of the permit if no period is specified.

Register of Permits

A register of all permits issued by Council must be kept.

Infringement Notices

Provides for the serving of Infringement Notices by an Authorised Officer as an alternative to prosecution.

Offences and Penalties

A person who contravenes this Local Law is guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty—

Local Law Number 2-Environment

The purpose of the Local Law is to provide a safe and healthy environment, to prohibit, regulate and control activities which may be dangerous unsafe or detrimental to the quality of life, to facilitate the provision of services in a way which enhances the environment and quality of life, to control nuisances and noise, odour and smoke emissions and other discharges to the environment which may adversely affect the enjoyment of life or the health safety and welfare of citizens, to provide for the peace order and good government of the municipal district and to provide for the administration of Council's powers and functions.

In furtherance of the above objectives the Local Law prohibits, regulates and controls activities and circumstances associated with smoke emission, recreational vehicles, fire hazards, dangerous and unsightly land, maintenance of swimming pools, advertising bill posting and junk mail, camping and caravans, circuses carnivals and festivals, sale of goods, water quality and drainage tappings, disposal of waste, the municipal landfill, the siting of dwellings and the siting, number and area of outbuildings.

Local Law Number 3-Streets and Roads

The purpose of the Local Law is to provide for and control the management of traffic and use of roads by persons, vehicles and animals and to regulate the parking of vehicles for safety and fair use, and to provide for the peace, order and well being of people in the municipal district.

Part 5 attends to the safety and convenience of road users by prohibiting obstructions to the free passage of people and goods, regulating road names and property numbers, and requiring vehicle crossings and effective fencing.

Part 6 controls various types of vehicles and animals for the safety and convenience of road users and protects the Council's assets from damage caused by extraordinary use of streets and roads by regulating the leaving of shopping trolleys, use of toy vehicles, and riding of horses on footpaths and naturestrips.

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Part 7 controls and regulates secondary activities on roads including trading, the placing of goods, signs, outdoor eating facilities and equipment, repairs to vehicles, parties, festivals, processions and collections in a fair, equitable and safe manner which does not compromise the primary need for the passage of people and goods and provides free and safe access for people with sight and movement impairment and disabilities.

Part 8 provides for the safe and efficient management and control of parking on roads and provides mechanisms to manage and control parking so as to cause minimal disruption, danger or nuisance to the users of Council's parking facilities, including a disabled persons parking scheme, fee-payment parking and time limit parking, tow-away of unlawfully parked or abandoned vehicles and removal of similar obstructions, and parking and public safety.





Local Law No. 2-Enforcement

The general purpose of this Local Law is to establish procedures for, the administration of Local Laws, the issue of Notices to Comply, Notices of Impounding, Infringement Notices and for the setting of fees and charges in relation to all Shire of Strathfieldsaye Local Laws.

This Local Law sets out a schedule of permit fees and infringement notice penalties.

Local Law No. 3—Keeping of Animals

The general purpose of this Local Law is to ensure animals, poultry or birds do not generate any noise, dust, odour or other condition which is a nuisance to any person, and do not endanger any person. This Local Law requires permits to keep more than two dogs, two cats and ten poultry on a single residential property, and sets out requirements for the keeping of large animals and construction of fowl houses.

Local Law No. 4—Streets and Roads

The general purpose of this composite Local Law is to regulate and/or control—parking in limited duration areas, the occupation of roads for works, works on vehicles on roads, livestock on roads, vegetation growing on road reserves and adjacent to roads, display of property numbers, pavement advertising and roadside trading; and to establish procedures for issue of Disabled Parking Permits, tow-away of unlawfully parked vehicles and abandoned vehicles, construction of vehicle crossings and issue of permits for temporary vehicle crossings.

This Local Law prohibits the dismantling or painting of a vehicle on a road, the uncontrolled wandering of stock on roads, interference with Council trees and shrubs without a permit and requires minimum clearances for vegetation for a clear view at intersections, pedestrian/vehicle conflict areas and traffic control items. This Local Law also requires a permit for roadside

Local Law No. 5-Environment

The general purpose of this composite Local Law is to regulate and/or control disposal of

domestic waste in rubbish receptacles and waste hoppers, open air burning and incinerators, burning of offensive materials, motorised vehicles on Council land, tapping of drains under the control of the Council, lighting fires on Council land, interference with Council property by trees and plants, offensive or unsightly land, parking of heavy vehicles in residential zones, destruction of wasp nests and connection of properties to sewer mains.

This Local Law prohibits without a permit the lighting of incinerators or open fires on any day other than Tuesday or Saturday and sets out other requirements for using incinerators. This Local Law also requires a permit for housing of a vehicle exceeding 5500 kg GCM in a residential area.

Local Law No. 6—Temporary Accommodation

The general purpose of this Local Law is to regulate and control the temporary occupation while a permanent dwelling is being constructed. This Local Law requires a permit for the occupation of a caravan or mobile dwelling for a period exceeding 28 days and sets out conditions which a permit may be granted.

Local Law No. 7-Siting Requirements for Buildings

The general purpose of this Local Law is to regulate and control siting requirements for Class 1 and 10 buildings. This Local Law sets minimum requirements applying to an allotment and provides for variations to those minimum siting requirements to be considered by Council.
