Saleyards Local Law

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Ballaarat proposes to make a Local Law pursuant to the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1989*.

The purpose of the proposed Local Law is to provide for the administration and management of the Ballarat Livestock Selling Yards (Saleyards).

The objectives of the proposed Local Law are to—

- (a) enable the Council to collect fees from vendors selling stock in the Saleyards and to prescribe the level of those fees;
- (b) enable the Council to prescribe the days and hours during each day on which sales can be held at the Saleyards;
- (c) protect Council assets and facilities at the Saleyards;
- (d) encourage selling practices which promote competition;
- (e) control and prevent behaviour which is a nuisance, or which may be detrimental to health and safety;
- (f) control the use of dogs at the Saleyards;

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- (g) regulate smoking and the consumption of alcohol at the Saleyards; and
- (h) control the quality of livestock products through the fair and reasonable treatment of animals and application of adequate animal husbandry practices.

A copy of the proposed Local Law can be obtained from the Town Hall, Sturt Street, Ballarat during normal office hours.

Any person affected by the proposed Local Law may make a written submission to the Council. Submissions received by the Council within 14 days of the publication of this notice will be considered by the Council (or a committee of the Council appointed for that purpose) in accordance with section 223 of the *Local Government Act 1989*.

Any person who wishes to be heard in support of a submission should indicate in the written submission that he/she wishes to be heard. BROADMEADOWS PLANNING SCHEME
Explanatory Statement
Amendment L35

This amendment has been prepared by the City of Broadmeadows and includes changes to the Local Section of the Broadmeadows Planning Scheme.

The amendment replaces a 5.4 hectare portion of the existing Reserved General Industrial (IN6) Zone at International Drive, Tullamarine with a new Freight Business Zone (see attached zoning plan).

The rationale for the introduction of the new Freight Business Zone is to recognise the changing nature of freight operations at Melbourne International Airfreight Centre. Over a number of years the freight business activities undertaken on the site have changed in emphasis to a point where Bond Storage and general storage operations have decreased somewhat whilst demands for additional administrative/office facilities by existing tenants have increased.

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The proposed amendment seeks to respond to these demands by enabling a greater provision for office floor space. This will be achieved by applying an "as-of-right" (ie. no permit required) office floor space limit for each tenancy of 1000 square metres. This may be exceeded subject to planning permit but only to an overall ceiling of 4000 square metres for each tenancy.

All permissible office uses on the site must be able to demonstrate to the satisfaction of the responsible authority, a service or support linkage to freight business operations. The clear intention of the zone is to maintain the current freight business use of the land.

The new zone also incorporates the same building, setback and height controls as the existing Reserved General Industrial Zone, designed to ensure that the maximum building heights and setbacks of buildings from frontages enhance the amenity of the area should any development on the site take place. It is noted however, that no new development is envisaged on the site in the foreseeable future. Rather, the rezoning seeks to enable proper recognition of the changing nature of freight business operations and remove the possibility of future planning conflicts arising from such changes.

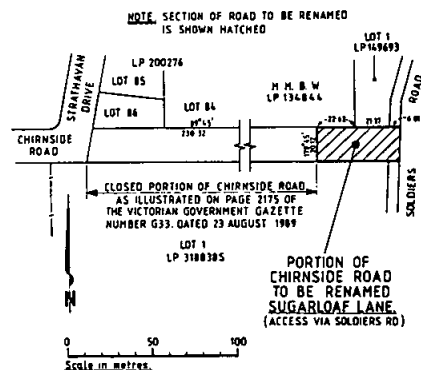

Proposed Local Law No. 13—Roads and Streets

The objectives of this Local Law are as follows:

- (a) To provide a safe and healthy environment in which the residents of the municipal district enjoy a quality of life that meets the general expectations of the community;
- (b) To prohibit, regulate, preserve and protect Council's assets on roads and streets within the City of Croydon by regulations relating to the following activities:
 - (i) Vehicle crossings;
 - (ii) Temporary vehicle crossings;
 - (iii) Clothing locker bins;
 - (iv) Damaging council land;
 - (v) Connecting into drains—kerb and channel;
 - (vi) Interference with water courses, drains, etc.;
 - (vii) Trees or plants causing damage to roads or Council land;
 - (viii) Property numbers;
 - (ix) Leading of horses on shared footways;
 - (x) Occupation of road for works;
 - (xi) Collections on roads;
 - (xii) Discharge and spillage on roads;
 - (xiii) Banners or like across roadway.

**Proposed Local Law No. 14—Public Reserves
and Recreation Lands**

The objectives of this Local Law are—

- (a) to develop Council's parks and reserves to maximise the opportunities for all ages and groups to enjoy a range of recreational needs;
- (b) to protect remnant indigenous vegetation, trees, shrubs, ground covers and grasses;

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- (c) to protect indigenous fauna;
- (d) to provide a safe and healthy environment in which the residents of the municipal district enjoy a quality of life that meets the general expectations of the community;
- (e) to prohibit, regulate and control the use of reserves within the municipal district and activities which may be dangerous or unsafe or detrimental to the quality of life in an environment of the municipal district;
- (f) to regulate and control the behaviour and conduct of persons using such reserves;
- (g) to facilitate the provision of recreational and cultural services and other services in a way which enhances the environment and quality of life in the municipal district;
- (h) to provide for the peace, order and good government of the municipal district of the City of Croydon.

Proposed Local Law No. 15—Refuse
Receptacles and Refuse Collection

The objectives of this Local Law are—

- (a) to provide for the peace and good government of the municipal district of the City of Croydon;
- (b) to promote a physical and social environment free of hazards to health;
- (c) to maintain the municipal district at all times in a clean and sanitary condition free of hazards to health;
- (d) to prevent and regulate the deposit of refuse and rubbish upon streets, all other lands and places under the control of the Council;
- (e) to provide for the hire of rubbish hoppers.

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Morwell proposes to make the following Local Laws:

Municipal Places Local Law No. 2

Environment—Local Law No. 3

Streets and Roads—Local Law No. 4

The purpose of the proposed Municipal Places Local Law No. 2 is—

- (a) to allow and protect the quiet enjoyment by people of Municipal Places within the Municipal District; and
- (b) to enable people in the Municipal District to carry out their day to day activities and to enjoy their recreational pursuits without having their peace and enjoyment interfered with or destroyed; and
- (c) to recognise and respond to community expectations relating to the quality of life they expect and require and are capable of influencing; and
- (d) to control and prevent behaviour which is a nuisance, or which may be detrimental to health and safety or which affects the enjoyment of recreational or other facilities; and
- (e) to enable the community and visitors and their families who use Municipal Places that are available to the public to be confident in their choice of the use of those facilities or places; and
- (f) to protect the Council and community assets and facilities on or in Municipal Places; and
- (g) to provide generally for the peace, order and good government of the Municipal District.

The General purport of the proposed Municipal Places Local Law No. 2 includes—

- (i) specifications of the ways the Local Law will be administered, including Permits, fees and the repeal of previous Local Laws;

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- (ii) the control of behaviour in Municipal Places which is boisterous, offensive, intimidating, dangerous or threatening of which for other reasons, is inappropriate in a Municipal Place;
- (iii) to prohibit the consumption of liquor in designated Municipal Places without a Permit;
- (iv) provision for enforcement and penalties in relation to the proposed Local Law.

The purpose of the proposed Environment Local Law No. 3 is—

- (a) to provide a safe and healthy environment in which the residents of the Municipal District enjoy a quality of life that meets the general expectations of the community; and
- (b) to prohibit, regulate and control activities which may be dangerous or unsafe or detrimental to the quality of life in an environment of the Municipal District; and
- (c) to facilitate the provision of general public services, health and other community services, property services, recreational and cultural services and other services in a way which enhances the environment and quality of life in the Municipal District; and
- (d) to control nuisance and noise, odour and other discharges to the environment which may adversely affect the enjoyment of life within the Municipal District or the health, safety and welfare of persons within the Municipal District.

The general purport of the proposed Environment Local Law No. 3 includes—

- (i) specifications of the ways the Local Law will be administered, including Permits, fees and the repeal of previous Local Laws.
- (ii) controls over dangerous and unsightly land, storage of machinery, second hand vehicles and second hand goods, incinerators, lighting of fires, burning offensive materials, advertising, bill posting and junk mail.
- (iii) controls over camping, temporary dwellings, circuses and carnivals.

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- (iv) regulating the keeping of animals and birds.
- (v) regulating the disposal of waste and the use of tips, the dumping of ice chests, drainage tapping, interfering with water courses and portable toilet systems on building sites.
- (vi) provision for enforcement and penalties in relation to the proposed Local Law.

The purpose of the proposed Streets and Roads Local Law No. 4 is—

- (a) to control traffic and the use of roads by persons, vehicles and animals and to regulate the parking of vehicles for the safe and unfair use of parking areas by people in the Municipal District;
- (b) to provide for the peace, order and wellbeing of people in the Municipal District;

- (d) to establish mechanisms for adequate consultation to accompany major changes to traffic arrangements and the discontinuation of roads; and
- (e) to control various types of vehicles and animals for the safety and convenience of road users;
- (f) to preserve and protect as far as possible the Council's assets from damage which may be caused from extraordinary use of streets and roads within the Municipal District; and
- (g) to control and regulate secondary activities on roads in a fair, equitable and safe manner which does not compromise the primary need for the passage and repassage of people and goods; and
- (h) to provide free and safe access for people with sight and movement impairment or disabilities; and
- (i) to provide for the safe and efficient management and control of parking on roads in the Municipal District; and
- (j) to provide mechanisms to manage and control parking so as to cause minimal

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disruption, danger or nuisance to the users of Council's parking facilities.

The general purport of the proposed Streets and Roads Local Law No. 4 includes—

- (i) a specification of the ways the Local Law will be administered, including Permits, fees and the repeal of previous Local Laws.

- (iii) the approval on changing of road names and a requirement to display property numbers; and
- (iv) the requirement of the installation or removal of vehicle crossings; and
- (v) a requirement to maintain effective fencing to contain livestock; and
- (vi) regulating the driving and grazing of livestock on roads; and
- (vii) regulating the use of shopping trolleys; and
- (viii) controlling the use of toy vehicles; and
- (ix) regulating the riding of horses on reservations; and
- (x) regulating the parking of heavy vehicles on private property in residential areas; and
- (xi) regulating advertising signs, roadside trading, goods for sale and outdoor eating facilities; and
- (xii) regulating the placing of bulk rubbish containers on roads; and
- (xiii) regulating the use of roads for works and reinstatement; and
- (xiv) prohibiting the repair of vehicles and deposited substances on roads; and
- (xv) regulating the use of streets and roads for street parties, festivals and processions; and
- (xvi) regulating collections on roads; and
- (xvii) controlling the Disabled Person Parking Scheme; and
- (xviii) provision for enforcement and penalties in relation to the proposed Local Law.

It was never intended that buildings would be prohibited if those requirements were not met.

The need for the amendment has been highlighted by a recent decision by the A.A.T.

The amendment inserts a new Clause 143-5 relating to demolition of significant buildings and a new Clause 143-5A relation to buildings on sites abutting significant buildings.

Clause 143-5A is based on a similar clause in proposed Amendment L24 which introduces Prahran Character Areas.

Amendment L28

The planning authority for this amendment is the City of Prahran.

LOCAL SECTION

The local section is amended as follows—

For Clause 143-5 substitute—

“143-5 Significant Buildings

A permit is required to demolish or remove a significant building.

A permit may only be granted if one or more of the following applies—

The responsible authority is satisfied the building is structurally unsound.

The removal of part of the building would restore or enhance its significance.

A permit has been granted or an application for a permit has been made for use or development of the land after the building has been demolished or removed.

143-5A Sites abutting Significant Buildings

Except in accordance with a permit, a building on a site abutting the site of a significant building must comply with the following requirements—

Building Height

If the site abuts significant buildings on more than one side and if—

The significant buildings are the same height, the buildings must not exceed that height.

The significant buildings are not the same height, the building must not exceed the height of the lower significant building.

If the site abuts a significant building on only one side, the height of the building must not exceed the height of the significant building.

Building Setback

The setback from the frontage should generally conform with the setback from the frontage of any abutting significant building.”

 - (iii) the consumption of alcohol in designated areas;
 - (iv) smoking in specified circumstances and places; and
 - (h) to provide generally for the peace, order and good government of the municipal district; and
 - (i) to provide for the administration of the Council's powers and functions; and
 - (j) to repeal existing By-Laws No. 19, 20, 60 and 63.

CITY OF SPRINGVALE Local Laws

Notice is hereby given that Council of the City of Springvale proposes to make the following Local Laws.

Local Law No. 13—Camping Local Law

The purpose of this Local Law is to regulate camping within the municipality both on Council and private land, by means of a permit. This only applies to situations where tents or caravans are used for a period in excess of 8 continuous hours. The Local Law also imposes penalties for breaches of these provisions.

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Local Law No. 14—Environmental Health (Animals and Birds) Local Law

The purpose of this Local Law is to control the keeping of animals on private property. A permit will be required to keep—

- (i) more than two (2) dogs;
 - (ii) more than two (2) cats;
 - (iii) more than two (2) birds, (other than canaries, budgerigars or finches);
 - (iv) more than five (5) canaries, budgerigars or finches;
 - (v) any reptile; and
 - (vi) more than five (5) rodents; and
- on land under 1/2 hectare—
- (i) any pigs, swine or other animals;
 - (ii) more than two (2) domestic birds; and
 - (iii) more than ten (10) poultry.

Provisions are also included covering the form of structures in which to keep animals and the condition of the surrounding land. This Local Law also includes provisions covering impounding of stray animals and release or disposal of these conditions that may be imposed on permits and set penalties for contravention of the Local Law.

Local Law No. 15—Municipal Buildings Local Law

The purpose of this Local Law is to control use of and access to the municipal offices, City Hall, meeting rooms, swimming pool, public conveniences and other municipal buildings. The Local Law covers conduct of persons within these buildings and creates offences for breaches of conditions covering such conduct.

Prohibited conduct includes smoking, carrying any firearm, behaving in a disorderly manner, taking part in a fight or disturbance, using offensive or indecent language offending against decency by reason of dress or conduct, entering or remaining in the building or premises whilst intoxicated and remaining in the building after having been lawfully directed to leave.

This Local Law will also enable the Council to grant leases or licences to use Council buildings and imposes conditions upon such use.

Local Law No. 16—Municipal Reserves Local Law

The purpose of this Local Law is to regulate the use of reserves within the City used for both passive and active recreation. The Local Law

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controls access to these reserves and imposes penalties for breaches of certain conditions covering use of them.

The Local Law details activities that cannot be conducted within a reserve without Council permission, such as selling or consuming intoxicating liquor, holding any carnival or fair, celebrating any wedding, erecting any advertised, holding any public gathering, flying any model aeroplane, conducted, organising or participating in any competitive game or sport and operating any amusement or form of gambling for which a charge is made.

Local Law No. 17—Building Controls Local Law

The purpose of this Local Law is to supplement the provisions of the Victoria Building Regulations 1983 and the Victoria Building (Building Code of Australia) Regulations 1990.

The Local Law adopts minimum siting requirements for various classes of buildings and covers matters such as open living space, removal and re-erection of buildings, illuminated signs, hoardings and overhead projections and fences.

Local Law No. 18—Recreational Vehicles Local Law

The purpose of this Local Law is to regulate the use of recreational vehicles on land other than highways, streets, reserves and places of public recreation or resort.

The Local Law requires persons to apply for a permit to use a recreational vehicle or to allow land under their control to be used by recreational vehicles.

Local Law No. 19—Municipal Amenity Local Law

The purpose of this Local Law is to regulate the times during which building works may be performed, prevent buildings falling into dilapidated conditions, prevent the deposit of spoil from building sites onto roads, regulates the use of land for storage, dismantling and repair of heavy motor vehicles and generally preserves the amenity of the city. The Local Law defines offences and sets penalties for these.

Local Law No. 20—Protection of Council Assets Local Law

The purpose of this Local Law is to protect various physical assets of the Council such as drains, sewers, gutters, watercourses, bridges

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and fences. The Local Law requires owners and occupiers of land to ensure that trees and plants do not interfere with such assets and requires prior approval before interfering with such assets. The Local Law also creates offences for breaches of certain conditions and imposes penalties for such breaches.

Local Law No. 21—Control of Vehicles Local Law

The purpose of this Local Law is to control the impounding and subsequent disposal of abandoned vehicles and provides control over vehicles causing an unlawful obstruction or unlawfully parked so that these vehicles may be removed.

The Local Law includes provisions for affixing notices to abandoned vehicles, notification to persons who appear to own them and surrender of vehicles.

Local Law No. 22—Streets and Roads (Parking) Local Law

The purpose of this Local Law is to provide for a system of resident parking schemes, disabled persons parking permits and control of ticket parking areas. The Local Law controls resident parking schemes by issue of permits and requires holders of "disabled persons" parking motorist permits to exhibit them in accordance with the appropriate code.

Local Law No. 23—Open Air Burning and Incinerators (Further Amendment) Local Law

The purpose of this Local Law is to further amend Local Law No. 2 by insertion of a dispensation clause enabling the Council to exempt persons from any or all of the provisions of the Local Law.

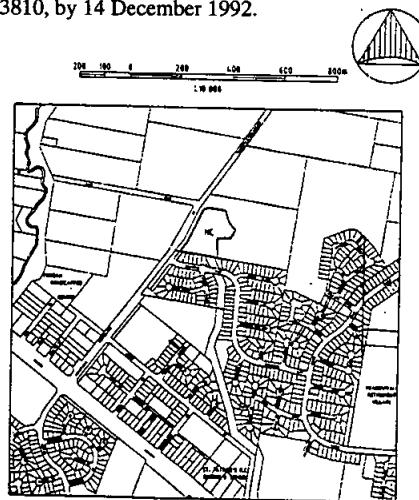

The purpose of this Local Law is to regulate the use of reserves within the municipal district.

Local Law No. 6—Administration,
Enforcement and Penalties

The purpose of this Local Law is to provide for the administration and enforcement of and prescribe penalties for contravention of Local Laws made by Council.

Local Law No. 7—Camping

The purpose of this Local Law is to regulate camping on roads and other public places.

Local Law No. 8—Streets and Roads (General
Regulations)

The purpose of this Local Law is to regulate the exhibition of merchandise on pavements, placement of seats, tables and chairs on pavements, the exhibition of advertising signs, vehicle advertising, protruding materials, shopping trolleys, skateboards, dog litter, street furniture, electoral advertising, naming of roads, allocation of property numbers, control of vegetation on or over roads, obstructions on roads, requirements for vehicle crossings and requirements to adequately provide fences to contain animals.

Local Law No. 9—Recreational Vehicles

The purpose of this Local Law is to regulate the use of recreational vehicles on land within the municipal district.

Local Law No. 10—Environmental Health
(Animals and Birds)

The purpose of this Local Law is to regulate for the keeping of a variety of animals including dogs, horses and cattle, other animals, domestic birds and poultry, pigeons, bees, rodents and reptiles. This Local Law is generally intended to ensure that animals kept within residential or rural residential areas do not cause a nuisance to other owners in the area. This Local Law does not apply to a person who occupies a farm which is rated as such.

Local Law No. 11—Environmental Health
(Refuse Disposal)

This Local Law provides for the control of depositing of waste outside properties and the

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general disposal of household refuse. This Local Law also requires waste to be contained in adequate containers and prohibits without a permit the installation of waste containers within a street boundary.

Local Law No. 12—Streets and Roads (Traffic)

The purpose of this Local Law is to provide for a number of measures associated with control of activities on road, reserves, including permanent closures, temporary closures, erection of obstructions and barriers, prevention of injury to persons and damage to property, processions and public ceremonies and functions, traffic diversion experiments, declaration of shopping malls, control of heavy motor vehicles, installation of speed limits.

Local Law No. 13—Control of Vehicles

The purpose of this Local Law is to deal with vehicles on or adjacent to the roadway including unregistered and abandoned vehicles, power to impound vehicles, power to dispose of abandoned vehicles, prohibiting of painting or repairing vehicles on the road, control of advertising vehicles for sale.

Local Law No. 14—Municipal Buildings

The purpose of this Local Law is to provide for the control of public activities in municipal offices, municipal buildings, and public convenience. It is intended to ensure the proper standards of conduct are observed within municipal facilities at all times.

Local Law No. 15—Parking

This Local Law provides for the control of parking, particularly the establishment of fixed term parking areas and the issue of infringements related to offences against fixed term parking areas.

Part 2—Specified Roads

Part 3—Mass Limits

A vehicle must comply with the mass limits specified in this Part.

Tyres

3.1 The load on a tyre must not exceed—

- (a) the manufacturer's load rating for the tyre; or
- (b) in the case of—
 - (i) a wide profile tyre (not less than 375 millimetres wide) on a non-steering single axle—3.85 tonnes; or
 - (ii) for any other tyre—3.20 tonnes, whichever is the lesser.

Axles and Axle Groups

3.2 The load on any axle or axle group must not exceed the limits specified by the manufacturer, or the limit referred to in Clause 3.3 or 3.4, whichever is the lesser.

3.3 The load on an axle group without a load sharing suspension system (other than a twin steer axle group) or on a trailer with only a single axle or axle group (pig trailer) must not exceed the mass limits specified in regulations 705 to 713 of the Road Safety (Vehicles) Regulations 1988.

3.4 The load on an axle, or on an axle group with a load sharing suspension system, must not exceed the applicable mass limits set out in the following table:

Gross Mass

- (c) any manufacturer's mass limits.

The gross mass of a trailer (other than a semi-trailer) must not exceed the gross mass of the towing motor vehicle.

Part 4—Other Conditions

This permit does not authorise a vehicle to travel on a particular road or bridge if the vehicle exceeds the mass limits fixed for and displayed on a sign in the vicinity of the road or bridge.
