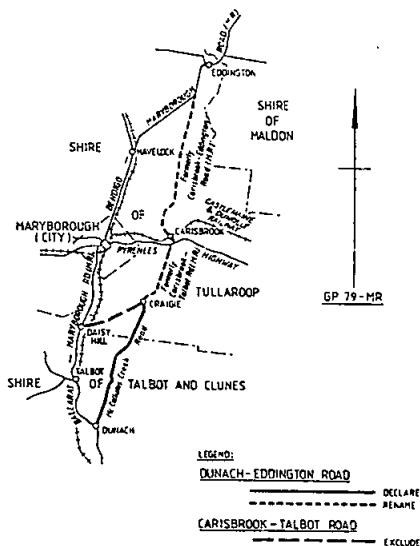

FUNCTIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING

In pursuance of the powers conferred by section 22 of the *Public Service Act 1974*, the Governor in Council by this Order specifies the functions of the Department of Employment and Training.

(1) The principal functions of the Department of Employment and Training are—

- (a) to advise and assist in the development and implementation of employment policies and programs;
- (b) to advise and assist in the development and implementation of vocational education and training policies and programs and of technical and further education policies and programs;
- (c) to constitute the staff of the State Training Board, of the Vocational Education and Training Accreditation Board and of other relevant authorities staffed under the *Public Service Act 1974*.

(2) The functions of the Office of the State Training Board in the Department of Employment and Training are—

- (a) to advise and assist in the development and implementation of policies for vocational education and training determined by the Government, the Minister, and the State Training Board;
- (b) to manage the State Training System;
- (c) to negotiate, on behalf of the State Training Board, performance agreements with TAFE institutions and Industry Training Boards and to negotiate, on behalf of the Board and the Government, resource agreements with the Commonwealth;
- (d) to provide staff of the Office of the State Training Board to assist the Board to carry out its functions;
- (e) to register private and non-College providers of training to improve the quality of training and to provide opportunities for these providers to participate in the delivery of State-accredited courses;
- (f) to provide a range of executive services to the Minister, State Training Board and the General Manager, Department of Employment and Training, including correspondence, briefings, co-ordination of Cabinet and related matters;
- (g) to manage an industry supported accreditation system which ensures the maintenance of educational standards;
- (h) to develop programs to increase the participation of disadvantaged and under-represented groups in training;
- (i) to support and fund Industry Training Boards and work to translate industry training plans into programs to be delivered by the State Training System;
- (j) to identify the skills demands of priority industries in Victoria and develop training

strategies in collaboration with industry to meet these demands;

- (k) to manage all regulated training in Victoria to ensure that the supply of trained labour meets industry needs;
- (l) to work with TAFE Colleges to develop performance improvement strategies to increase the performance, accountability and flexibility of the network of TAFE Colleges;
- (m) to identify and negotiate reforms to the development, delivery and recognition of training to ensure that national competency standards are met, workplace reform is supported and the economy and efficiency of the training system is enhanced;
- (n) to publicise, promote and sponsor the need for industry to increase its commitment to training and market the State Training System to industry and to overseas students;
- (o) to actively participate in national forums to achieve consistent reforms to training across Australia and to ensure that Victorian reforms are compatible with those in other States and Territories;
- (p) to collaborate with the Division of Further Education to ensure effective joint planning and delivery of further education programs; and
- (q) to identify for the Victorian Education Foundation those funding proposals which are supported by the State Training Board.

(3) The functions of the Office of Employment in the Department of Employment and Training are—

- (a) to advise and assist in the development and implementation of employment policies determined by the Government and the Minister;
- (b) to advise and assist the State Training Board on the development of responses to Government requests for advice on employment matters;
- (c) to manage labour market programs focussed on disadvantaged groups, including career counselling and placement services;
- (d) to advise on employment policy, particularly in respect to those priority industries which provide opportunities for employment expansion, by—
 - monitoring the labour market,
 - undertaking research and providing information on labour market conditions,

developing policy options in response to short term labour market changes, forecasting longer term labour market trends and identifying barriers to long term growth,
developing initiatives to achieve systematic change, to increase labour market flexibility and to reduce barriers to labour market participation and opportunity,
evaluating labour market programs operated or funded by the Department,
providing improved labour market opportunities for women and young people, and
monitoring the achievement of EEO objectives in the public sector.

(4) The functions of the Policy Secretariat in the Department of Employment and Training are—

- (a) to provide a communication and community relations function to co-ordinate and strengthen communication between portfolio agencies and various external groups, and
- (b) to develop processes for reviewing the effectiveness of programs and for addressing strategic policy issues.

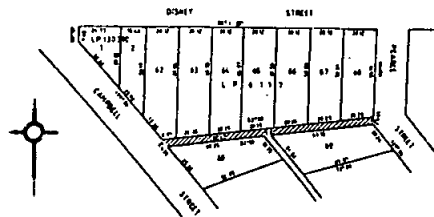

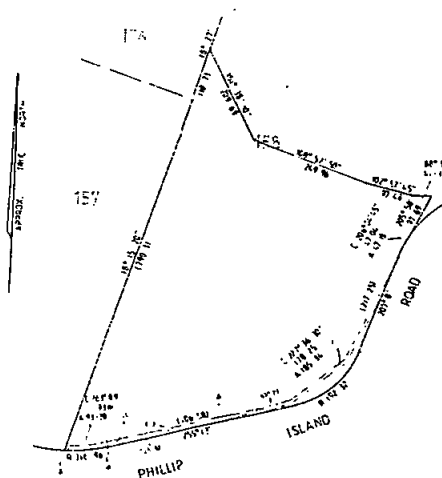
