PLANNING SCHEME AMENDMENT L59**

The City of Doncaster and Templestowe has prepared Amendment L59 to the Doncaster and Templestowe Planning Scheme.

The amendment proposes to change the Planning Scheme by not requiring a planning permit for a detached house, subject to conditions, in the Reserved Living Zone. It also proposes the introduction of additional conditions with which the "detached house" use must comply, if it is to be allowed without a permit in the Residential C Zone.

The amendment will facilitate the erection of detached houses on lots which are at least 450m<sup>2</sup> in area without a permit, provided various conditions relating to siting and services are met.

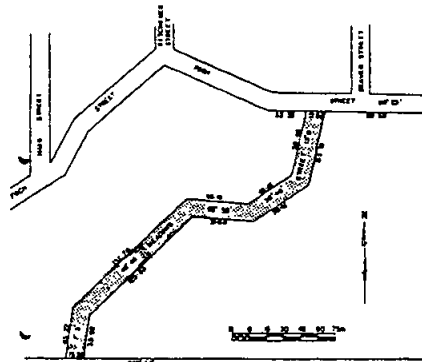

Road Discontinuance

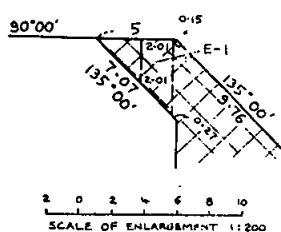

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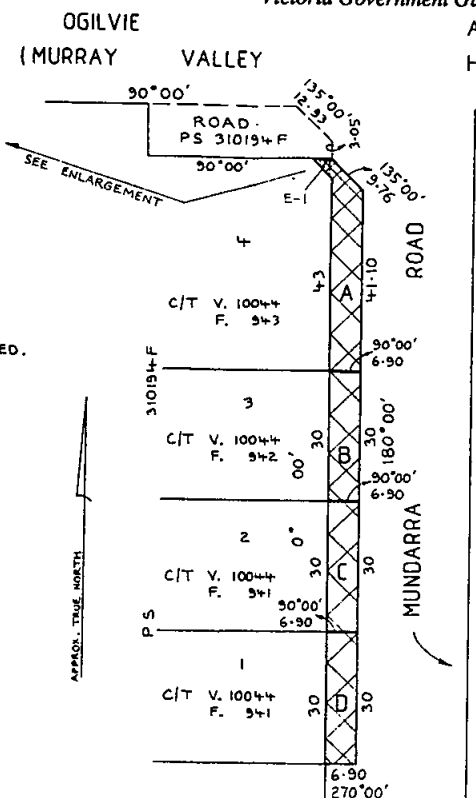
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LAND AFFECTED BY ROAD CLOSURE IS SHOWN CROSS-HATCHED.

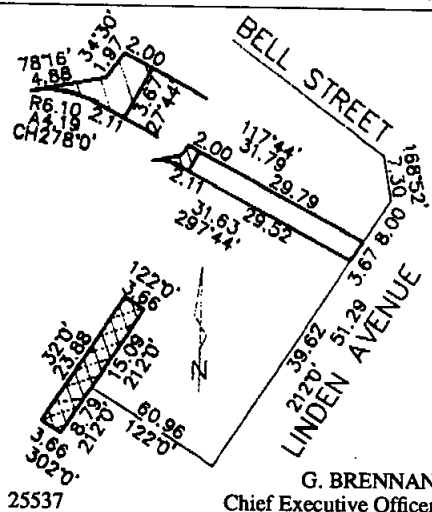

**CITY OF MALVERN**  
Notice of Making Local Law 9/93  
Control of Vehicles

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Malvern at its meeting on 5 July 1993, made local law 9/93—Control of Vehicles, having the following purposes.

1. Regulate and control the abandonment of vehicles within the municipal district.
2. Regulate and control the unlawful obstruction, parking and standing of vehicles within the municipal district.
3. To preserve the amenity of roads within the municipal district.
4. To provide for the peace order and good government of the municipal district.

In general, the local law proposes that Council may impound registered vehicles which appear to be abandoned in a street, parking area provided by Council or on any other land vested in or under the control of the Council. Further, the local law proposes an Authorised Officer of Council may cause a vehicle to be towed or removed to a pound where such vehicle is left standing in the street, parking area provided by Council or on any land vested in or under the control of the Council where such vehicle is causing an unlawful obstruction, unlawfully parked or in an area designated by the Minister responsible for administering the *Local Government Act 1989*.

The local law provides for offences to be prosecuted either by Court procedures or the issue of infringement notices and sets penalties for breaches of the local law.

Local Law 9/93 comes into force and effect throughout the municipal district on 16 July 1993.

- (g) allow the introduction of speed limits on roads.

**Local Law No. 15: Municipal Reserves**

The purpose of this Local Law is to regulate the use of reserves within the City of South Melbourne.

**Local Law No. 16: Library and Community**  
Information

The purpose of this Local Law is to—

- (a) regulate access to conduct within;
- (b) provide for membership and use of; and
- (c) define the rights and obligations of members of the library.

**Local Law No. 17: Parking**

The purpose of this Local Law is—

- (a) in relation to fixed items for parking areas—
  - (i) to establish for fixed terms—
    - (a) how they may vary is to be sufficiently indicated;
    - (b) when they are to come into operation;
  - (ii) to stipulate how parking fees are to be paid;
  - (iii) to constitute offences for contraventions of restrictions and requirements imposed by fixed terms;

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- (b) to constitute offences for other actions in parking areas; and
- (c) to provide generally for the control and management of parking areas.

These Local Laws come into effect on 15 July 1993.

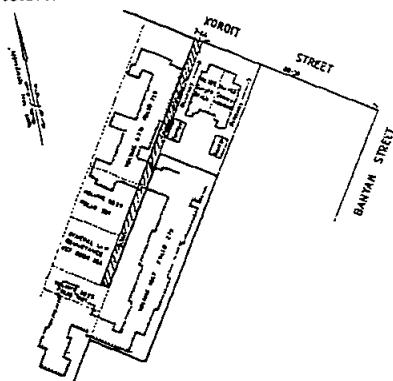

The Council of the United Shire of Beechworth proposes to make a Local Law to

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regulate or prohibit certain uses of streets, roads, lanes, public carparks and footpaths to protect public safety, convenience and amenity, preserve the integrity of the town streetscape and establish indemnity and to revoke Local Law No. 6.

Activities proposed to be prohibited are:

distributing handbills;  
wearing or carrying mobile advertising; and  
placing or keeping milk crates, bread crates, cardboard boxes and similar items between 8.00 a.m. and 8.00 p.m.

Activities for which it is proposed permits will be required are:

placing or keeping advertisements, goods for display or sale, signboards, tables, chairs and umbrellas;  
selling goods from stalls;  
selling goods from vehicles;  
displaying a sign or signwriting on a vehicle;  
using or playing a musical instrument, broadcasting equipment or a loud-hailer; and  
soliciting custom.

The proposed Local Law sets out areas to which the above prohibitions and permits apply, permit limitations, fees, application requirements, offences and penalties. It also sets up a procedure to require advertising of and the consideration of submissions on any permit application.

Notice of Proposed Local Law

The Council of the Shire of Huntly proposes to make a local law in order to satisfy the following objectives.

  - (ii) to preserve and protect as far as possible the Council's assets from damage which may be caused from extraordinary use of streets and roads within the municipal district;
- (e) in Part 7—
- (1) to control and regulate secondary activities on roads including—
    - (i) the placing of goods and equipment;
    - (ii) repairs to vehicles; and
    - (iii) parties, festivals and processions—  
in a fair, equitable and safe manner which does not compromise the primary need for the passage and repassage of people and goods; and
  - (2) to provide free and safe access for people with sight and movement impairment of disabilities; and
- (f) in Part 8—
- (i) to provide for the safe and efficient management and control of parking on roads in the municipal district; and
  - (ii) to provide mechanisms to manage and control parking so as to cause minimal disruption, danger of nuisance to the users of Council's parking facilities.

The proposed local law provides regulatory mechanisms to implement these objectives. Among these mechanisms are a requirement that permits be obtained for certain activities. Standards are provided for the Council to consider in determining whether or not to grant permits. The local law can be obtained from the Shire Office, Midland Highway, Huntly. #### BRIDGEWATER PUBLIC PARK RESERVE REGULATIONS

##### Title

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Bridgewater Public Park Reserve Regulations 1993.

##### Objective

2. The objective of these Regulations is to provide for the care, protection and management of certain reserved Crown lands at Bridgewater including the public park reserve, recreation reserve and public purposes (Loddon River) reserve.

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##### Authorising Provisions

3. These Regulations are made under section 13 of the *Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978*.

##### Commencement

4. These Regulations come into operation on the date they are published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

##### Definitions

5. In these Regulations—

“Act” means the *Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978*

“Committee” means the Committee of Management appointed to manage the reserve under section 14 of the *Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978*.

“Appointed Officer” means any person appointed in writing by the Committee as an appointed officer for the purposes of these Regulations and (except for the purpose of receipt of any fees or the grant, variation or revocation of any permit) also includes any members of the Police Force and any person appointed or deemed to be appointed an authorised officer under section 83 of the *Conservation, Forests and Lands Act 1987*.

“Camp” means:

(a) to erect, occupy or use any tent or any temporary, make-shift or similar form of accommodation, or

(b) to park occupy or use any caravan or other movable form of accommodation.

“Firearm” includes any rifle, gun, pistol, air pistol, air gun or like thing using cartridges, catapult, bow and arrow, crossbow and any other implement designed to discharge missiles capable of injury, damaging or destroying any person, animal or thing.

“Permit” includes any authority, approval, consent, permission, receipt, ticket or the like given, granted or issued by the Committee under these Regulations.

“Litter” includes any bottle, carton, package, paper, glass, food, offal, animal carcass, vegetable matter or other refuse or rubbish.

“Reserve” means the areas of reserved Crown land at Bridgewater on Loddon as indicated by red colour on the plan marked A/26.6.91 on Department of Conservation and Natural Resources file number 06/6596.

"Vehicle" means a car, motorcycle, bus, truck, trailer, caravan, boat, helicopter, bicycle, cart, horse-drawn vehicle, or balloon capable of conveying passengers whether registered for road use or not.

## REGULATIONS

### *Entry to the Reserve*

6. 1. Except as provided in these Regulations the reserve is open to the public free of charge.

2. The Committee may determine, in either general or specific terms, the times and days on which the whole or any part of the reserve will not be available for use by the public.

3. The Committee may enclose or set aside for a particular activity the whole or any part of the reserve and may include in that determination, conditions or restrictions relating to the use by the public of that area.

4. The Committee may determine the conditions of entry or use of any conveniences, facilities or amenities of any description in any part of the reserve.

5. The maximum fee which may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the reserve on such days as the reserve may be set apart for the purpose of shows, sport matches, fetes, sports carnivals, performances or amusements shall be determined by the Committee from time to time.

### *Permits*

7. 1. Any permit may be granted for such period and subject to such terms and conditions consistent with these Regulations as the Committee may from time to time determine either generally or in the particular case.

2. No permit shall be transferable.

3. Any permit may be revoked or withdrawn at the discretion of the Committee.

4. The holder of any permit shall observe and comply with all conditions thereof.

5. Any person purporting to hold any permit shall produce the same on demand by any appointed officer and unless such permit is thereupon produced that person shall not be entitled to claim the benefit of any such permit.

### *Directions to Leave*

8. Any appointed officer may direct any person who in his opinion offends against these Regulations forthwith to leave the reserve or any place therein.

### *Giving of Name*

9. If, in the opinion of an appointed officer, any person has contravened or failed to comply with any provision of these Regulations then such officer may demand and receive the name and address of such person. Any person who refuses when asked by such officer to furnish their name and address or who furnishes an incorrect name and address shall be deemed to have committed an offence against these Regulations.

### *Obstruction of Officers*

10. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with any appointed officer or any employee of the Committee in the execution of their duties in the reserve.

### *Behaviour*

11. Within the reserve a person must not—

- (a) behave in a riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening or insulting manner;
- (b) use any threatening, abusive or insulting words;
- (c) enter or remain thereon whilst under the influence of any intoxicating liquor or drug;
- (d) preach, declaim, harangue or deliver any address of any kind without the written consent of the Committee or an appointed officer;
- (e) play or operate any transistor radio, television, tape recorder, compact disc player, amplifier or any musical instrument which in the opinion of an appointed officer is likely to annoy or disturb other users of the reserve;
- (f) spit, expectorate, urinate or defecate except in a place set apart for that purpose.

### *Shooting and Trapping*

12. Within the reserve a person must not except in accordance with a written permit:

- (a) shoot, trap, maim, injure, kill or destroy any bird or animal;
- (b) have in their possession or carry or use any firearm, poison, trap or snare.

### *Firearms*

13. Any person carrying or using any firearm, trap or snare in the reserve without a permit shall cease to do so on demand by any appointed officer.

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*Damage*

14. Within the reserve a person must not, except in accordance with a written permit—

- (a) remove, cut, damage, displace, deface, or interfere with any fence, barrier, lamp, roadway, footway, stair, gate, pipe, tap, sign, noticeboard, seat, table, post, building, structure or any other thing of a like nature;
- (b) destroy, pick, cut down, gather, break, burn or remove any live or dead tree, bush, shrub, grass, flower, plant or the like or any part thereof;
- (c) dig or remove from or bring into the reserve any gravel, stone, sand, soil or loam.

*Games*

15. Within the reserve a person must not—

- (a) play any game in which a hard ball is used except in an area set aside for the purpose;
- (b) engage in any game, activity or sport likely to cause interference, disturbance, inconvenience or danger to others using the reserve.

*Camping*

16. A person must not camp in any part of the reserve without the written permission of the Committee being first obtained and only under such conditions as the Committee may determine.

*Litter*

17. 1. Within the reserve a person must not—

- (a) deposit or cause to be deposited any litter, except in a receptacle provided for the purpose;
- (b) intentionally break any glass bottle or other container.

2. Any person who breaks any glass in the reserve shall gather up the pieces and remove them or place them in a receptacle provided for litter.

3. A person must not bring into the reserve and deposit or allow to remain any domestic or household waste, car body, building material or other waste.

*Business and Advertising*

18. Within the reserve a person must not, except in accordance with a written permit—

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- (a) sell, trade, hire or offer for sale or service any device, article or thing whatsoever;
- (b) advertise for sale, trade or hire any service, article or thing whatsoever;
- (c) take photographs for gain;
- (d) ply or offer any vehicles for hire or carry any passengers for fee or reward;
- (e) operate or use any noise-generating device electric generating plant or any other equipment or plant driven by motors or engines;
- (f) conduct any school or provide any form of inspection for gain;
- (g) occupy, use or enter any pavilion, building, depot or workshop or other structure or facility unless the same are open to the general public;
- (h) erect, post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, mark, cut or affix or cause to be erected, exhibited, posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted, cut, marked or affixed any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, or any document, sign or thing whatsoever in any area upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, road, path, building, structure or any other facility or appliance or fixture;
- (i) distribute any pamphlet or printed matter.

*Dogs*

19. 1. (a) Dogs are not permitted in the reserve except when approved groups have obtained written permission from the Committee for same.

(b) Any dog(s) so allowed into the reserve must not be taken into pavilions and must remain clear of all food preparation and eating areas and be under proper control on a chain, cord or leash and restrained from causing annoyance to any person.

2. Nothing in this Regulation prohibits a blind person having in the reserve a dog that is used by that person as a guide dog.

*Horses*

20. No person shall ride, drive or lead any horse upon the reserve without a written permit from the Committee.



*Animals Generally*

21. Except as aforesaid, no person shall cause or suffer or knowingly permit any animal belonging to them or in their charge to be brought into or remain in the reserve without a permit.

*Enclosures*

22. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Committee or an appointed officer enter any area in the reserve which is enclosed or set aside for the reclamation of degraded areas or revegetation or for the protection of trees, shrubs, plants, flowers, grass or other vegetation.

*Fires*

23. No person shall without a permit light, kindle, maintain or keep alight any fire in the reserve except in a portable barbecue or in a fireplace provided by the Committee. Any person who lights a fire in the reserve shall take all reasonable precautions to ensure that the fire does not escape from control and damage anything growing or being on the reserve and is completely extinguished if abandoned.

*Vehicles*

24. Within the reserve a person must not except in accordance with a written permit—

- (a) drive, ride or use any vehicle in a manner dangerous to other reserve users or that would cause damage to any, road, track or vegetation;
- (b) drive any vehicle so as to cause noise which is unreasonable in the circumstances;
- (c) drive any vehicle at a speed greater than that indicated by any sign or notice.

*Parking*

25. No person shall park any vehicle within the reserve except—

- (a) in an area set apart for that purpose;
- (b) as and where directed or authorised by the Committee or an appointed officer;
- (c) upon payment of such fees (if any) as may be prescribed from time to time by the Committee.

*Roadways*

26. A person must not, unless authorised by the Committee drive, ride, push, pull or place any vehicle in or on the reserve except in or upon such roadways or areas set aside for the purpose

and no person shall allow any vehicle in their care to remain stationary in any position obstructing the lawful passage of others.

*Stranded Vehicles*

27. An appointed officer may remove or cause to be removed or order the removal of any parked, stranded or broken down vehicle from any roadway or area within the reserve. The removal of any vehicle—

- (a) shall be at the sole risk of the owner of the vehicle who shall be deemed to have accepted such risk as a condition of entry into the reserve; and
- (b) such removal may be affected in such a manner as the appointed officer thinks necessary.

*Abandoned Vehicles*

28. Any vehicle left unattended within the reserve for a continuous period exceeding forty-eight hours may be removed by the Committee or an appointed officer at the risk and expense of the owner.

*Use of Facilities*

29. No person shall—

- (a) use any change-rooms, showers, toilets, or other convenience or any part thereof for any purpose other than that for which they are intended by the Committee;
- (b) enter or use or permit any child under their control to enter or use any place, room, convenience, or structure set apart for the use of the opposite sex, provided that this Regulation shall not apply to a child under age of eight years when accompanied by an adult of the opposite sex.

*Signs*

30. 1. The Committee may, by clear notices or signs established in such prominent position or positions as the case may require, prohibit or regulate any act matter or thing within the reserve or any part thereof.

2. No person shall erect or remove or deface any such notice or sign except with the authority of the Committee.

3. No person shall disobey the directions indicated in any such notice or sign.

*Sports and Competitions*

31. 1. The Committee may allow any club, association, corporation or person the use of the reserve or any portion thereof for the purpose of

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sporting contests, fetes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows, sports training or other recreation subject to payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations and may authorise any club, association, corporation or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

2. Any sporting contest, fete, carnival, entertainment, musical performance or other organised amusement in the reserve shall be—

- (a) held strictly in accordance with the permit issued;
- (b) held in an area or building or part thereof set aside for that purpose;
- (c) subject to such fees and charges, in addition to the deposit monies as may be prescribed or charged.

3. The aforesaid deposit monies shall be returned after deduction of such amounts as are necessary to defray the costs of restoration or compensation for any damage whatsoever done or suffered by the property of the Committee or appertaining to the reserve during the conduct of any such events by whomsoever or whatsoever done, and the balance (if any) thereof shall then be refunded to the payer or payers of the said deposit monies. The determination as to whether or not any such damage has in fact been done or suffered and of the amount of value of the said restoration or compensation shall be in the sole, absolute and conclusive discretion of the Committee or an appointed officer and all persons and all organisation and the persons by or on whose behalf any such deposit monies shall have been paid shall be deemed to have expressly agreed to the provisions of this clause.

4. No person shall enter upon, use, occupy or remain upon any sporting or entertainment facility whilst the same is under hire from the Committee unless he or she be the hirer or have the approval or consent of the hirer to do so.

5. No person shall interfere with or interrupt any game, sport, competition, entertainment, amusement or practice in the reserve.

6. No person shall obtain or attempt to obtain admission to any part of the reserve when not entitled to admission under these Regulations.

7. No person on the reserve shall play or practise the sport of golf or any other sport which in the opinion of the Committee constitutes a danger or nuisance to other users of the reserve or to the owners or occupiers of nearby properties.

*Victoria Government Gazette*  
*Compliance*

32. 1. The Committee or an appointed officer shall have the power to undertake any reasonable and lawful action to ensure compliance with these Regulations and the conditions of any permit issued thereunder.

2. Nothing in these Regulations shall operate or prevent or restrict any appointed officer or servant, agent, employee or representative of the Committee in the proper execution of their duty or work in the reserve.

*Penalties*

33. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall be liable for the penalties prescribed in section 13 of the *Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978*.

*Revocation of Existing Regulations*

34. The Bridgewater Public Park Reserve Regulations made on 7 June 1961 are hereby revoked.

(2) The provisions of paragraph (1) (b) do not apply to persons proceeding to waters outside the closed area via the most direct route.

6. Any person who contravenes this Notice is liable to a penalty of 20 penalty units.

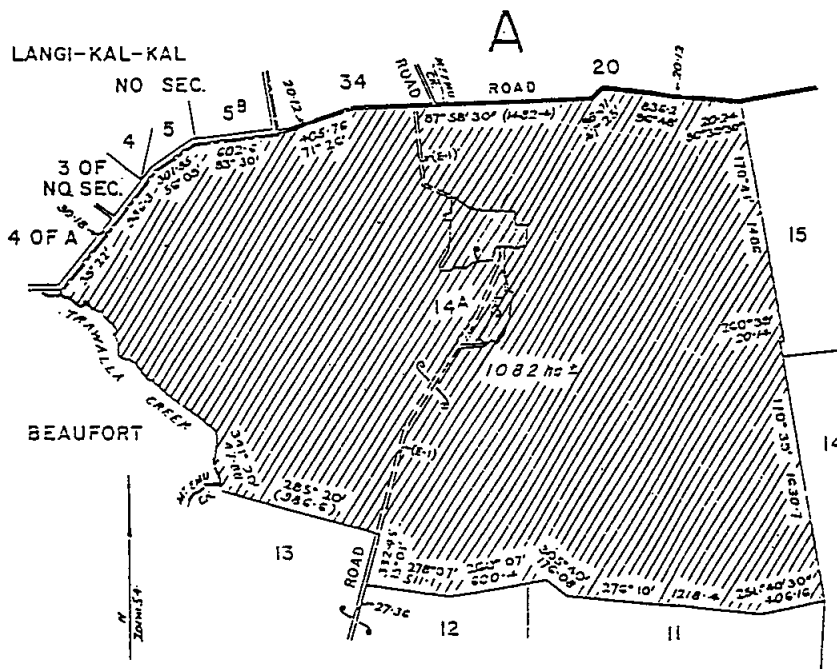

Credit Act 1984

CREDIT ORDER No. 80

Continuing Credit Contracts—Fees and Charges

The Deputy Governor in Council under section 19 of the *Credit Act 1984* makes the following Order:

## Citation

1. This Order may be cited as "Credit Order No. 80"—Continuing Credit Contracts—Fees and Charges".

## Commencement

2. This Order shall take effect on and from 1 August 1993.

*Exemption*

3. Pursuant to section 19 of the *Credit Act* 1984, it is declared that in relation to the provision of credit under a continuing credit contract, the provisions of that Act do not have effect so as to prevent—

- (a) the imposition and collection under the contract of charges or fees (in addition to interest) by the credit provider for the provision and operation of the continuing credit contract where the credit provider complies with clause 4 and, where applicable, clause 8 of this Order;
- (b) the variation of the contract and the giving of notice of such variation in accordance with clauses 3 (c) and 5 of this Order in lieu of the manner otherwise required under the Act;
- (c) a credit provider varying the contract without prior notice where the variation is limited to one or more of the following:
  - (i) a variation of the annual percentage rate which reduces the annual percentage rate; or
  - (ii) a variation which otherwise reduces the debtor's monetary obligation under the contract; or
  - (iii) a variation which increases the time for payment of the amount that is or may be standing to the debit of the account;
- (d) a credit provider from lawfully entering into an account kept for the purposes of the contract or from including in a statement of account an amount which exceeds the cash price as defined in the Act where the amount entered is the amount charged by the supplier for the supply of the goods or services to the debtor and in such circumstances the amount entered will be deemed to be the "cash price";
- (e) a credit provider from using a method which is permitted in clause 7 (2) of this Order to calculate the maximum amount of the credit charge for a billing cycle;
- (f) a credit provider from entering into an account under a new contract which was made in consideration of the discharge of a previous contract with the debtor:
  - (i) an amount equivalent to the amount owed under the previous contract at the time it was discharged; and
  - (ii) any additional amounts which could have been entered into the account kept by the credit provider for the purposes of the previous contract if that contract had not been discharged—

and without provision of a statement in writing pursuant to section 69 or a statement of net balance due pursuant to section 104.

4. The exemption contained in clause 3 (a) only applies if:

- (a) in the case of a contract entered into on or after 1 August 1993, the credit provider in or with the notice given to the debtor pursuant to section 59 discloses the cost of the credit to the debtor in the format or in a substantially similar format to that set out in Form 12 below which advises the debtor of:
  - (i) the amounts of all fees and charges or where this is incapable of specification supplies a brief description of the basis upon which these fees and charges are calculated; and
  - (ii) when all fees and charges will become payable;

- (b) the credit provider in any statement of account given pursuant to section 61 discloses when charged all fees and charges included in the closing balance on the relevant statement of account.

5. It is declared that a credit provider shall have given sufficient notice in respect of a variation pursuant to section S 60 (1) (a) for a variation to take effect on the expiry of the notice period if the credit provider:

- (a) (i) gives at least 28 clear days notice of the variation to the debtor by publishing a press advertisement outlining the variation in a newspaper circulating generally in Victoria; and
- (ii) advises the debtor of the variation in writing not later than the date when the next statement of account is given to the debtor pursuant to section 61 after the expiration of the 28 day notice period; or
- (b) gives at least 28 clear days notice of the variation to the debtor in writing.

6. It is declared that for the purposes of complying with section 58, a credit provider may include in the Form 6 Notice, in lieu of paragraph 5, the following—

"Generally, you get at least 7 clear days notice. However, if the change increases the interest rate, increases the credit charge, increases your repayments or shortens the time for repayment 28 clear days notice of the variation must be given, by press advertisement or in writing".

7. (1) For the purposes of this clause:

"Daily percentage rate", in relation to a continuing credit contract, means the rate determined by dividing the annual percentage rate under the contract by 365;

"Periodic percentage rate", in relation to a continuing credit contract, means the rate determined by dividing the annual percentage rate under the contract by the number of billing cycles that would occur under the contract if it were in force for one year.

2. It is declared that the maximum amount of the credit charge in respect of the billing cycle of a contract may be calculated:

- (a) as the sum of the amounts obtained by:
  - (i) applying the daily percentage rate to the unpaid daily balances during the billing cycle relating to any or all of the amounts owed by the debtor under the contract; or
  - (ii) applying the periodic percentage rate to any or all of the amounts owed by the debtor under the contract immediately before the commencement of the billing cycle; or
  - (iii) applying the periodic percentage rate to the average of the daily balances for the billing cycle relating to any or all of the amounts owed by the debtor under the contract; or
- (b) by applying a combination of the methods of calculation outlined in clause 7 (2) (a), but not so as to apply more than one method to any particular amount in respect of any particular period; or
- (c) by some other method of calculation so long as the maximum amount of credit charge in respect of a billing cycle derived using that method of calculation does not exceed the maximum amount which could become payable if any of the methods of calculation outlined in clause 7 (2) (a) or (b) were used.

8. (1) Where—

- (a) a credit provider varies a contract entered into prior to 1 August 1993 to impose for the first time an annual charge in reliance on the exemption contained in clause 3 (a) of this Order; and
- (b) the variation has effect so that the annual charge becomes payable without the debtor, after being notified of the variation, first agreeing in writing to such variation of the contract or using the contract to access further credit—

it is a condition of the exemption in clause 3 (a) that the credit provider shall cause the annual charge to be refunded to the debtor or recredited to the debtor's account if—

- (c) before two billing cycles have elapsed since being notified of the variation, the debtor advises the credit provider in writing that the debtor does not wish such variation to continue to have effect and returns all cards used to access credit under the contract; or

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(d) the credit provider withdraws the debtor's right to use the card and the debtor has not used the contract to access further credit since being notified of the variation.

(2) It is a further condition of the exemption in clause 3 (a) that an annual charge shall not become payable retrospectively.

9. It is declared that without limiting the generality of this Order the following sections of the *Credit Act* 1984 to the extent that they are inconsistent with the terms of this Order have no effect—sections 52, 53, 54, 55 (1), 59, 60, 61 including Schedule 7, 67 (1) (b) (i) 69, 75, 104 and 105.
