## CITY OF MELBOURNE Proposed Local Law Public Activities (Amendment) Local Law 1994

Notice is given that at a meeting of the Council of the City of Melbourne held on 17 May 1994, the Council resolved to propose to make a Local Law titled Public Activities (Amendment) Local Law pursuant to the provisions of the Local Government Act 1989.

The objective of this Local Law is to amend the Public Activities Local Law (No. 15 of 1992) to not allow spruiking by the crying of wares or the soliciting of trade in or on a road, public place or premises adjacent to and to reduce the permissible level for noise emanating from premises by amplification. Further it is proposed to amend the Local Law to allow the higher noise level applicable to approved activities taking place in the City Square to also apply to approved activities taking place in or on any road or public place.

A copy of the Local Law can be obtained, free of charge, from the Legal Services Branch, 3rd Floor, Town Hall, Swanston Street, Melbourne, during the hours 8.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. daily from Monday to Friday.

Written submissions relating to the proposed Local Law by any person affected by it may be made under section 223 of the Local Government Act 1989 and must be received by the Council within 14 days after the publication of this public notice.

The Council has determined that the Planning and Review Committee will consider any written submissions received within this time and hear any persons who may wish to be heard in support of their written submission, either in person or by a person acting on their behalf. Persons making written submissions should clearly state whether they wish to be heard in support of their submission. Persons heard may address the Committee only in respect of matters which support their submissions.

Submissions should be addressed to the Manager, Legal Services, Town Hall, Swanston Street, Melbourne 3000. Persons making written submissions will be notified in writing of the Council's decision and reasons for the decision following consideration of the submissions.

## TRANSPORT (ROADS AND PROPERTY) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1994

In accordance with the provisions of the Subordinate Legislation Act 1962, notice is given of the proposal to make regulations to be known as the Transport (Roads and Property) (Amendment) Regulations 1994.

A Regulatory Impact Statement has been prepared as required under the Subordinate Legislation Act 1962.

The objectives of the proposed regulations are to—

- (a) limit the display of roadside distractions such as hoardings and advertisements on or in the vicinity of declared roads;
- (b) prevent the unauthorised removal of timber from road reservations;

- (c) ensure the safe movement of traffic over the West Gate Bridge.

The Regulatory Impact Statement concludes that the proposed regulations provide the most cost effective means of achieving the objectives.
