Water Act 1989

I, Charles Geoffrey Coleman, as Minister administering the Water Act 1989, make the following Order:

CONSTITUTION OF THE OVENS REGION WATER AUTHORITY ORDER 1994

Citation

1. This Order is called the Constitution of the Ovens Region Water Authority Order 1994.

Enabling Powers

2. This Order is made under the powers conferred by Division 2 of Part 6 of the Water Act 1989 and all other available powers.

Date of Effect

3. This Order takes effect on the date it is published in the Government Gazette.

Definitions

- 4. In this Order:
- "Act" means the Water Act 1989.
- "Authority" means the Ovens Region Water Authority constituted in Clause 5 of this Order.
 - "Former Authorities" means
 - (a) the Benalla Water Board constituted by an Order in Council dated 27 September 1983 and published in the Government Gazette on 28 September 1983;
 - (b) the Bright District Water Board constituted by an Order in Council dated 5 June 1984 and published in the Government Gazette on 6 June 1984;
 - (c) the Milawa Shire Council as the successor in law to the City of Wangaratta, appointed as a water Authority by an Order in Council dated 29 May 1984 and published in the Government Gazette on 30 May 1984;
 - (d) Moira Shire Council as the successor in law to the Shire of Yarrawonga, appointed as a water Authority by an

Order in Council dated 29 May 1984 and published in the Government Gazette on 30 May 1984.

Constitution of Ovens Region Water Authority

- 5. On and from the date this Order takes effect:
 - (a) there is constituted a new Authority; and
 - (b) the corporate name of the new Authority is the Ovens Region Water Authority.

Takeover of Former Authority

- 6. On and from the date on which this Order takes effect:
 - (i) the Authority is appointed to take over the whole of the property, rights, liabilities, obligations, powers and functions under the Act of the Former Authorities including the management and control of the existing water districts named below: Wangaratta Waterworks District Wangaratta Urban District Wangaratta Rural District Glenrowan Waterworks District Glenrowan Urban District Springhurst Waterworks District Springhurst Urban District Yarrawonga Waterworks District Yarrawonga Urban District **Bright Waterworks District Bright Urban District** Harrietville Urban District Porepunkah Urban District Wandiligong Urban District Moyhu Waterworks District Moyhu Urban District Whitfield Waterworks District Oxley Urban District Benalla Waterworks District

Membership of the Ovens Region Water Authority

- 8. (a) The membership of the Ovens Region Water Authority is five members appointed by the Minister in writing.
- (b) In appointing persons as members, the Minister must ensure that the members, collectively, have qualifications relevant to, or experience in each of the following:
 - (i) the business of the new Authority;
 - (ii) public finance or economics
 - (iii) engineering;
 - (iv) business management;
 - (v) commerce;
 - (vi) banking;
 - (vii) environment and water resource management;
- (viii) law.

Abolition

9. The Former Authorities are abolished as Authorities under the Act.

Pre-requisites for Making this Order

- 10. (a) This is an Order referred to in section 98 (2) (a) of the Act.
- (b) Under section 100 (2) (a) of the Act, the affected authorities, the Milawa Shire Council, the Moira Shire Council, the Bright District Water Board and the Benalla Water Board have applied to me for this Order to be made.

- (c) Under section 98 (2) (a) of the Act, I have agreed to the terms and conditions with the affected Authorities.
- (d) Under section 100 (2) (b) (i) of the Act, I have consulted with the Minister administering the Local Government Act 1989 as a council is affected.

- (d) the Wellington Shire Council as the successor in law to the City of Sale appointed as a Water Authority by an Order in Council dated 27 September 1983 and published in the Government Gazette dated 28 September 1983.
