MAROONDAH CITY COUNCIL Environment Local Law No. 1

Notice is hereby given that of a meeting of the Maroondah City Council held on 11 December 1995. the Council resolved to make the Environment Local Law No. 1.

The purpose of this Local Law is:

- * to provide a safe and healthy environment in which the residents of the Municipal District enjoy a quality of life that meets the general expectations of the community;
- to prohibit. regulate and control activities which may be dangerous, unsafe or detrimental to the quality of life in the environment of the Municipal District;
- * to facilitate the provision of general public services. health and other community services, property services, recreational and cultural services, and other services in a way which enhances the environment and quality of life in the Municipal District:
- * to control nuisances and noise. odour and smoke emissions, and other discharges to the environment which may adversely affect the enjoyment of life within the Municipal District or the health, safety and welfare of persons within the Municipal District;
- to provide for the peace, order and good government of the Municipal District; and
- * to provide for the administration of the Council's powers and functions.

Among other things, this Local Law purports to prohibit, regulate and control activities and circumstances associated with:

- * smoke emission:
- * the use of recreational vehicles,
- * fire hazards:
- * dangerous and unsightly land;

- * advertising and bill posting;
- * camping;
- * circuses, carnivals and festivals;
- water quality, including interference with water courses;
- animals, including animal numbers and the keeping and control of animals; and
- * disposal of waste.

Municipal Places Local Law No. 2

Notice is hereby given that at a meeting of the Maroondah City Council held on 11 December 1995, the Council resolved to make the Municipal Places Local Law No. 2.

The purpose of this Local Law is:

- * to allow and protect the quiet enjoyment by people of Municipal Places within the Municipal District;
- * to enable people in the Municipal District to carry out their day to day activities and to enjoy their recreational pursuits without having their peace and enjoyment interfered with or destroyed:
- to recognise and respond to community expectations relating to the quality of life they expect and require and are capable of influencing;
- * to control and prevent behaviour which is a nuisance, or which may be detrimental to health and safety or which affects the enjoyment at recreational or other facilities:
- * to enable the community and visitors and their families who use Municipal Places that are available to the public to be confident in their choice of the use of those facilities or places;

- * to protect Council and community assets and facilities on or in Municipal Places:
- * to provide for the control and management of traffic, use of roads by persons, vehicles and animals and to regulate the parking of vehicles for the safety and fair use by people in the Municipal District;
- to provide for the regulation of the collection of used clothing and other goods in charitable recycling bins;
- * to provide generally for the peace. order and good government of the Municipal District; and
- * to provide for the administration of the Council's powers and functions.

Among other things, the proposed Local Law purports to prohibit, regulate and control activities and circumstances associated with:

- conduct in Municipal Places which is dangerous or threatening or which, for other reasons, is inappropriate in a Municipal Place;
- * trading. the placing of goods and equipment, busking and collections in a fair, equitable and safe manner which does not compromise the primary need for the passage of people and goods;
- * the place and times at which alcohol may be consumed; and
- smoking in municipal buildings.

CITY OF MELBOURNE Consumption of Liquor on Roads and Public Places (Amendment) Local Law 1995 (No. 2 of 1995)

Notice is given that at a meeting of the Melbourne City Council held on 11 December 1995, the Council made a Local Law titled "Consumption of Liquor on Roads and Public

Places (Amendment) Local Law 1995" (No. 2 of 1995) pursuant to the provisions of Local Government Act 1989.

The objective of the Local Law is to amend the Consumption of Liquor on Roads and Public Places Local Law 1994 (No. 3 of 1994) ("the Principal Local Law") made by the Council on 20 January 1994—

- (a) to extend the area to which the Principal Local Law applies, to increase fixed penalties under the Principal Local Law, to amend the offence provisions of the Principal Local Law and to provide for a 24 hours per day coverage of the areas to which the Principal Local Law applies, for the days/periods specified in amended clause 4 (1) (b) (i) to (v); and
- (b) to make consequential amendments to the Principal Local Law.

Area and times specified in the Local Law

The extended area to which the Local Law applies is that area bounded by, to the north, Flinders Street from Spencer Street to Swanston Street and then to the north and east the Yarra River from Princes Bridge to Swan Street Bridge; to the south, Spencer and Clarendon Streets to the Westgate Freeway intersection, and then Kingsway from the Westgate Freeway to Dorcas Street; to the south, Dorcas Street from Kingsway to St Kilda Road and Linlithgow Avenue from St Kilda Road to Alexandra Avenue; to the east, Swanston Street from Flinders Street to Princes Bridge and then the Yarra River banks, the Alexandra Gardens and the Queen Victoria Gardens

Clause 4 of the Principal Local Law is substituted to provide that the current arrangements for the "City Grid" area remain in place; that a 24 hours a day control over the consumption of liquor be put in place with respect to the City Grid area and the extended area during the designated special event periods of Moomba, the Grand Prix and New Year festivities. The penalty for breaching a provision of the Local Law is increased from \$50 to \$100. The provision making it an offence to refuse to comply with a direction of an authorised officer is deleted.

WANGARATTA RURAL CITY COUNCIL Consumption of Alcohol in Public Places Local Law No. 2

The Wangaratta Rural City Council proposes to make a local law to be called the "Consumption of Alcohol in Public Places"—Local Law No. 2.

A copy of the proposed Local law can be obtained from the Municipal Offices Offices 64-68 Ovens Street, Wangaratta during office hours (8.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. Monday to Friday) or by telephoning (057) 22 0888. Copies will also be available for inspection at Australia Post outlets within the municipality.

Any person affected by the proposed local law may make a submission relating to it under Section 223 of the Local Government Act 1989. Submission are to be in writing addressed to the Chief Executive Officer, P.O. Box 238, Wangaratta and must received by the Council within 14 days of the date of this notice. A person making a submission may request to be heard in support of their submission.

The purpose and general purport of the proposed local law is as follows:

- To provide for the peace, order arid good government of the municipal district of the Wangaratta Rural City Council:
- 2. To provide for the administration of Council powers and functions;
- To prohibit, regulate and control the consumption of alcohol in designated areas within the municipality;
- To protect again behaviour which causes detriment to the amenity and environment of the municipality; and
- 5. To protect the community interest.

Planning and Environment Act 1987 WARRAGUL PLANNING SCHEME Notice of Approval of Amendment Amendment L46

The Minister for Planning has approved Amendment L46 to the Warragul Planning Scheme.

The amendment comes into operation on the date this notice is published in the Government Gazette.

The amendment inserts site specific provisions in the planning scheme to enable a milk processing facility to be established on Darnum Park Road, approximately two kilometres north of Darnum township. The use and development of the land must be in accordance with an approved Development Plan prepared to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authority. The Development Plan must be in accordance with the Concept Plan which forms part of the amendment.
