Regulatory Impact Statement

**Surveyors (Cadastral Surveys) Regulations
1995**

Notice is given in accordance with section 11 of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994**, that a Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) has been prepared in relation to the Surveyors (Cadastral Surveys) Regulations 1995. Public comment is invited on both the RIS and the proposed Regulations.

The proposed Regulations will set minimum standards to be observed in cadastral surveying in order that land property boundaries are defined with confidence and accuracy. They will impact directly on Licensed Surveyors, their assistants and others who deal with plans of survey.

The existing Regulations will sunset on 20 June and those proposed will embody much of the existing requirements but with a focus on standards to be achieved rather than being prescriptive. They have been updated to take account of changes in technology and methods.

The main changes in the proposed Regulations are that penalties (to \$1000) are now specifically linked to non-compliance of certain sections and that the current "notice of having re-established boundaries" is expanded to require a diagram of the relationship between the survey control marks and the adopted boundaries. Additionally, permanent monumentation is proposed which will be cheaper than the present marks. The net effect of the changes will be to provide savings of up to 5% in the cost of surveys, saving the industry \$400,000 annually.

The RIS has examined whether the Regulations should be made at all—the analysis has concluded that they provide a substantial direct benefit to surveyors and land owners of Victoria, calculated to be a Net Present Value (NPV) of \$6.1 m over ten years. The main alternative is a voluntary Code of Survey Practice. This Code has been judged less effective in maintaining the cadastral survey framework and would offer benefits of \$3.2 m NPV over the ten years.

Cadastral surveying has a far-reaching impact on land ownership, on financing based on the security of land and in the full utilisation of land. With such at stake, the Regulations will contribute to maintaining the present high level of confidence in Victoria's land tenure system.

Dangerous Goods Act 1985
ORDER TO SUBJECT TO CONDITIONS OR
RESTRICTIONS THE SUPPLY AND USE OF
HIGH RISK CARCINOGENIC
SUBSTANCES

Preamble

1. Specific regulatory control over 15 high risk carcinogenic substances has previously been provided in Victoria under the Drugs, Poisons and Controlled Substances Regulations 1985. These Regulations have protected both workers and the public by ensuring the supply and use of carcinogenic substances is carried out, so far as is practicable, to eliminate any risk of exposure.

2. As the Victorian drugs, poisons and controlled substances legislation moves towards national uniformity, the control of carcinogenic substances will no longer be provided by the Drugs, Poisons and Controlled Substances Regulations 1985.

3. Regulations dealing with high risk carcinogenic substances are intended to be made under the **Victorian Occupational Health and Safety Act 1985**. The proposed regulations will give effect to a National Standard which has not yet been finalised.

4. Until such time as the proposed regulations under the **Occupational Health and Safety Act 1985** can be brought into operation, the Governor in Council is of the opinion that it is expedient for the public safety to make an Order to subject to conditions or restrictions the supply and use of carcinogenic substances.

5. Therefore, the Governor in Council under section 55 (1) of the **Dangerous Goods Act 1985** makes the following Order to subject to conditions or restrictions the supply and use of carcinogenic substances.

Part 1—Definitions

6. In this Order—

“authorised person” means the person who is the holder of a warrant to use a carcinogenic substance;

“carcinogenic substance” means the following substances prescribed as dangerous goods for the purposes of this Order—

- (a) Benzidine and its salts
p-Biphenylamine
 Chloromethyl Methyl Ether
 3,3'-Dichlorobenzidine and its salts
sym-Dichloromethyl Ether
N-2-Fluoroethylacetamide
 1-Naphthylamine
 2-Naphthylamine
N-Nitrosodimethylamine
beta-Propiolactone; and
- (b) Acrylonitrile
 Camphenchlor
 1,2-Dibromo-3-Chloropropane
p-Dimethylaminoazobenzene
 4,4'-Methylenebis (2-Chloroaniline); and
- (c) all preparations containing 1% or more of any of the substances referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b);

“designated area” means any place where a carcinogenic substance is stored or used in a workplace;

“designated person” means any person who has been appointed by the authorised person to enter a designated area;

“sealed system” means a manufacturing arrangement constructed and operated in such a way that there is no risk of respiratory, skin or oral exposure of a person to a carcinogenic substance;

“Secretary” means the Secretary to the Department of Business and Employment;

“use” includes the manufacture, storage, handling or distribution of a carcinogenic substance and includes the production of a carcinogenic substance as an intermediate;

“warrant” means a valid warrant issued by the Secretary authorising the use of a carcinogenic substance; and

“workplace” means any place, whether or not in a building or structure, where employees or self-employed persons work.

Part 2—Prohibition

7. A person must not use a carcinogenic substance unless that person holds a warrant from the Secretary.

8. A person must not supply a carcinogenic substance unless the person being supplied has provided a copy of the warrant to the supplier.

Part 3—Application for a Warrant to Use a Carcinogenic Substance

9. A person may apply to the Secretary for a warrant to use a carcinogenic substance.

10. An application to the Secretary for a warrant must contain—

- (a) the applicant's name and business address; and
- (b) the purpose for which the substance is required and the manner in which it is intended to be used; and
- (c) a statement to the effect that it is not practicable for the applicant to use any other substance for the purpose, with information to support the statement; and
- (d) the name, form and quantity of the substance that the applicant intends to use, specified in the following manner—
 - (i) the name of the substance; and
 - (ii) the quantity or proportion of the substance in the preparation or product; and
 - (iii) the trade or common name of the preparation or product; and
 - (iv) the nature of the preparation or product; and
 - (v) the estimated annual quantity of the preparation or product required; and
- (e) the name and address of the person from whom the substance is intended to be purchased or obtained; and
- (f) the manner and form in which the applicant intends to dispose of the substance; and

- (g) the proposed number of designated persons.

11. At any time before a warrant is issued, the Secretary may require the applicant to provide such further information as the Secretary deems necessary.

Part 4—Conditions or Restrictions of Use and Supply of a Carcinogenic Substance

12. The Secretary may issue a warrant subject to conditions or restrictions.

13. A warrant issued by the Secretary must contain—

- (a) the name and business address of the authorised person; and
- (b) the name and form of the substance that the applicant is authorised to use; and
- (c) the name and business address of the person from whom the applicant is authorised to purchase or obtain the substance; and
- (d) any specific conditions or restrictions, in addition to the conditions or restrictions set out in this Part, that apply to the use of the substance; and
- (e) any authorisation granted by the Secretary under clause 14.

14. The authorised person must ensure that a carcinogenic substance is contained within a sealed system during manufacture, storage, handling and distribution unless otherwise authorised by the Secretary in the warrant.

15. The authorised person must ensure that any risk of exposure or absorption associated with the use of a carcinogenic substance—

- (a) is eliminated; or
- (b) if it is not practicable to eliminate the risk, is reduced so far as is practicable.

16. The authorised person must—

- (a) inform all persons who to his or her knowledge may be exposed to a risk to health or safety from a carcinogenic substance about the precautions that should be taken to avoid such exposure; and
- (b) record the names of all designated persons; and
- (c) inform by the quickest possible means any person who may have been exposed to, or could reasonably be thought to have been exposed to, a carcinogenic substance, of the fact that

they are known or suspected to have been exposed; and

- (d) report in writing to the Secretary, within 7 days, the occurrence of an exposure of any person to a carcinogenic substance; and
- (e) provide prominent signs advising that only designated persons may enter the designated area; and
- (f) ensure that a notice with “Entrance to Carcinogenic Area” written clearly and legibly on it, is permanently affixed to any door or doors leading to a designated area; and
- (g) ensure that the designated persons are as few in number as is compatible with good working practice.

17. The supplier of a carcinogenic substance must retain the copy of the warrant provided to him or her.

18. Whenever a carcinogenic substance is supplied, the supplier must issue to the person to whom the supply is made, an invoice showing—

- (a) the date of supply; and
- (b) the name and address of the person to whom the carcinogenic substance is supplied; and
- (c) the name, form and quantity of the carcinogenic substance supplied.

19. A copy of each invoice must be kept by the supplier and recipient for three years from the date of supply.

20. The Secretary may, at his or her discretion, amend any particulars of a warrant if the amendment is—

- (a) in the interests of health and safety; or
- (b) in the public interest; or
- (c) at the request of the authorised person.

21. The Secretary may suspend or cancel a warrant if the authorised person—

- (a) has not complied with the conditions or restrictions of the warrant; or
- (b) has been convicted of an offence against the **Dangerous Goods Act 1985** or the **Occupational Health and Safety Act 1985**; or
- (c) requests suspension or cancellation; or
- (d) ceases to carry on business at the premises to which the warrant relates.

22. A warrant lasts until it is cancelled or suspended.

23. If a warrant is suspended or cancelled under clause 22, it ceases to have effect and must be surrendered to the Secretary on demand.

Part 5—Application of this Order

24. This Order does not apply to the substances listed in paragraph (b) of the definition of "carcinogenic substance" in clause 6, until such time as the Drugs, Poisons and Controlled Substances Regulations 1985 (S.R. No. 61/85) are revoked.¹

Part 6—Duration

25. Unless sooner revoked, this Order is revoked on the day that regulations for carcinogenic substances under the **Occupational Health and Safety Act 1985** are brought into operation.
