PROCLAMATION

Declaration of Lands to be Public Land

I, Richard E. McGarvie, Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council and having considered a recommendation of the Minister for Planning under Section 2 (2) of the **Land Conservation Act 1970** made after consultation with Ministers in whom the land is vested and Ministers responsible for public authorities (other than municipal councils) in which the land is vested, declare those lands in the City of Warrnambool and the Rural Cities of Horsham and Ararat that are:

- (i) unalienated land of the Crown including land permanently or temporarily reserved under Section 4 of the **Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978** and State forest and parks within the meaning of the **National Parks Act 1975**; or
- (ii) vested in any public authority (other than a municipal council)—

to be public land for the purposes of the **Land Conservation Act 1970** in relation to the Investigation of Historic Places.

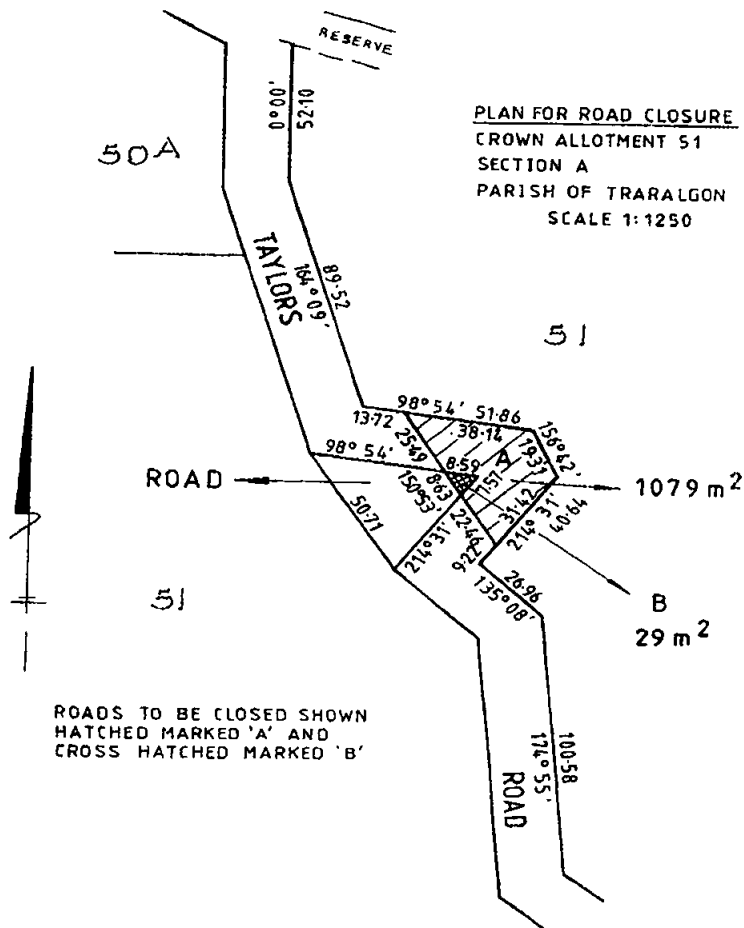

Discontinuance of Road**

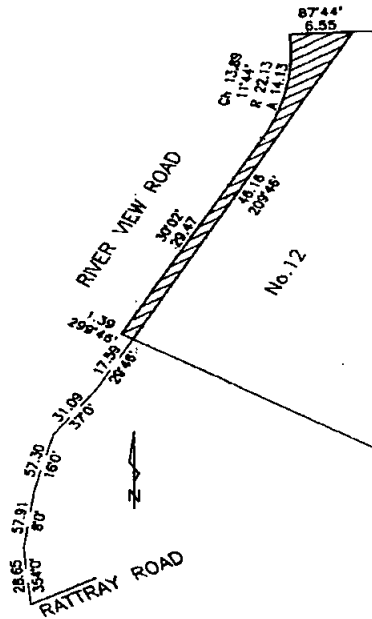

BASS COAST SHIRE COUNCIL
Notice of Proposed Local Law
Consumption of Liquor in Public Places—
Local Law No. 1

Bass Coast Shire Council proposes to make a new local law entitled "Consumption of Liquor in Public Places Local Law".

The purpose (objective) of the proposed local law is to:

- (a) regulate and control the consumption of liquor in public places
- (b) prevent behaviour which;

- (i) constitutes a nuisance; or
- (ii) may be detrimental to health or safety; or
- (iii) affects the enjoyment of public places

by reason of the consumption of liquor in public places.

The general purpose of the proposed local law is to regulate the consumption and possession of alcohol in a public place which includes a road. It provides for situations whereby an authorised officer of the Council (which may include a police officer) may direct a person to stop consuming alcohol or to dispose of liquor or to seal a liquor container. An authorised officer may also direct a person to hand liquor over to the authorised officer if a person contravenes the local law. The proposed local law allows for offenders to be prosecuted either by the issue of an infringement notice or by Court procedure.

The proposed local law, if made, would apply to the whole of the municipal district including circumstances where its provisions have further application to a localised area (such as Phillip Island).

Copies of the proposed local law may be inspected at or obtained from any of the following Council Customer Service Centres: 67-69 McBride Avenue, Wonthaggi; 91-97 Thompson Avenue, Cowes; The Esplanade (corner Ramsay Boulevard), Inverloch or Shop 3 Bass Highway, Grantville.

Any person affected by the proposed local law may make a submission to Council relating to the local law. Submissions received by the Council within 14 days of the publication of this notice will be considered in accordance with Section 223 of the **Local Government Act 1989**. Any person requesting that he or she be heard in support of a written submission is entitled to appear before a meeting of the Council or Council Committee either personally or by a person acting on his or her behalf and will be notified of the time and date of the hearing.

BANYULE CITY COUNCIL
General Local Law No. 1

Notice is hereby given that Council at its meeting on 13 November 1995 made Local Law No. 1 General Local Law.

The purpose of this Local law is to:

- * protect the amenity of neighbourhoods within the municipal district.
- * provide for the peace order and good government of the Municipal district.
- * prohibit, regulate, control activities, events practices and behaviour in places so that no detriment is cause to the neighbourhood, nor nuisance to a person nor detrimental effect to a person property.
- * prohibit, regulate and control obstructions, behaviour and activities on roads, including the use of toy vehicles and the consumption of alcohol.
- * protect Council's assets and to regulate the use thereof.
- * empower an Authorised Officer to impound unregistered, abandoned or derelict vehicles left standing on roads, in parking areas or on Council land.
- * empower an Authorised Officer to impound shopping trolleys left on any road, Council land, except in an area set aside for the purpose of storage of shopping trolleys.
- * regulate activities which may interfere with or damage Council's roads, land and assets.
- * regulate the location, size and standard of construction of vehicles crossings.
- * ensure that building works do not damage, encroach on to or make roads unsafe and to protect the amenity of the area.
- * empower Council to fix the days, hours and conditions under which a vehicle may be left on a road, Council land or private land where Council regulates parking and enable the introduction of parking schemes including disabled parking.
- * protect the amenity of the municipal district by placing prohibitions and obligations on owners and occupiers of land.
- * to regulate camping and the use of caravans for habitation.
- * provide for domestic and trade waste removal.
- * promote responsible pet ownership and animal welfare.
- * provide for the maintenance of land on which animals are kept.

* regulate the presence of cats or dogs in public places.

* control the use of Council land buildings and the activities of people whilst in Council buildings or upon Council land.

* provide for the issue of permits.

* provide of fees and charges.

* provide for enforcement.

HORSHAM RURAL CITY COUNCIL
Local Laws No. 1 and 2

Notice is hereby given that at its meeting at 14 November 1995, council made the following Local Laws:

Local Law No. 1—Processes of Municipal Government (Procedures for Meetings)

- * to provide a mechanism to facilitate the good government at the Horsham Rural City Council through its formal meeting procedure to ensure effective and efficient Council decisions are made in a manner which acknowledges the role of Local Government within the Australian system of Government;
- * to promote and encourage community participation in the system of Local Government by providing mechanisms for the Council to ascertain the community's views and expectations;
- * to regulate and control the election of Mayor;
- * to regulate and control the procedures governing the conduct of meetings including:
 - (i) the notice required for meetings;
 - (ii) the keeping of Minutes;
- * to regulate and control the use at Council's Seal;
- * to provide for the administration of Council's powers and functions; and
- * to provide generally for the peace, order and good government of the municipal district.

Local Law No. 2—consumption of Liquor in Public Places

Purpose and General Purport:

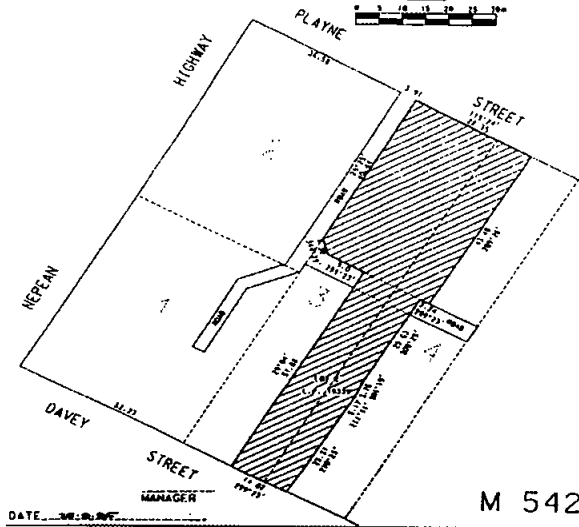
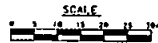

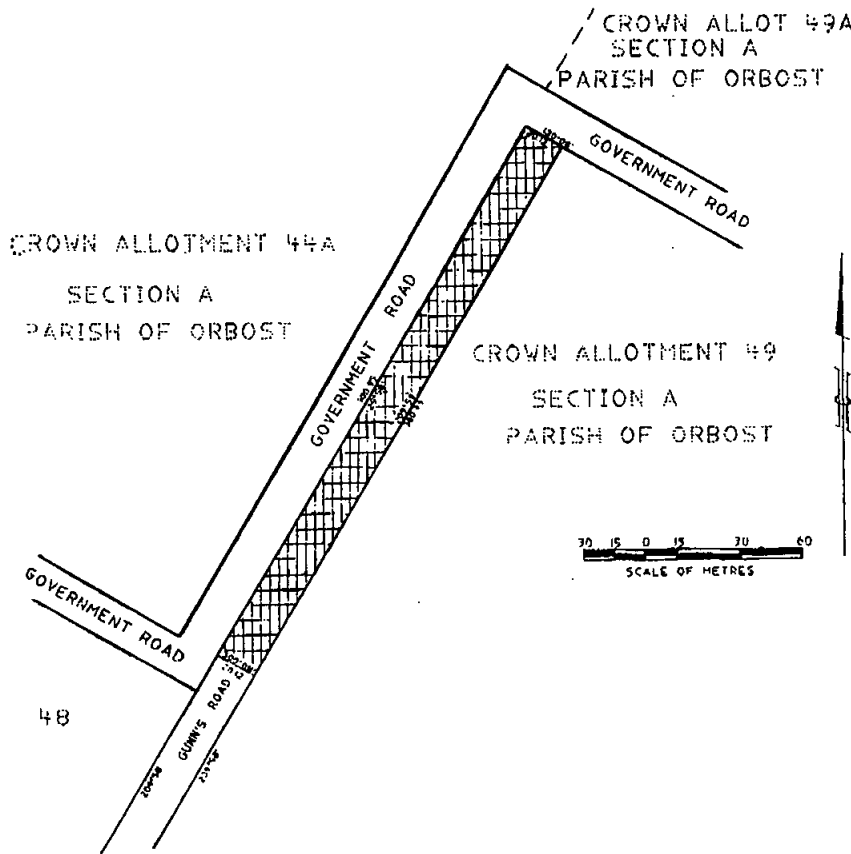
