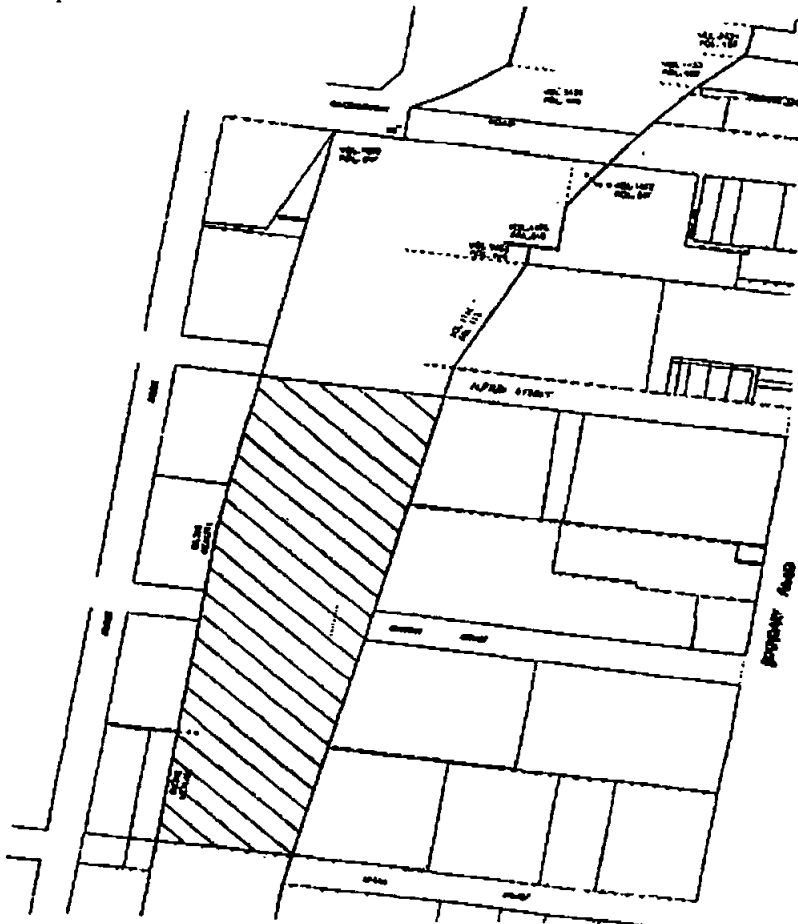

Pursuant to Section 41 of the **Melbourne City Link Act 1995** ("the Act") the Melbourne City Link Authority elects to use the procedures provided under sections 42 and 43 of the Act in the acquisition pursuant to section 38 of the Act of land which is part of the Project area (as defined by section 7 of the Act). The land the subject of this election is in a specified part of the Project area, being that located between Alfred and Mark Streets in North Melbourne. 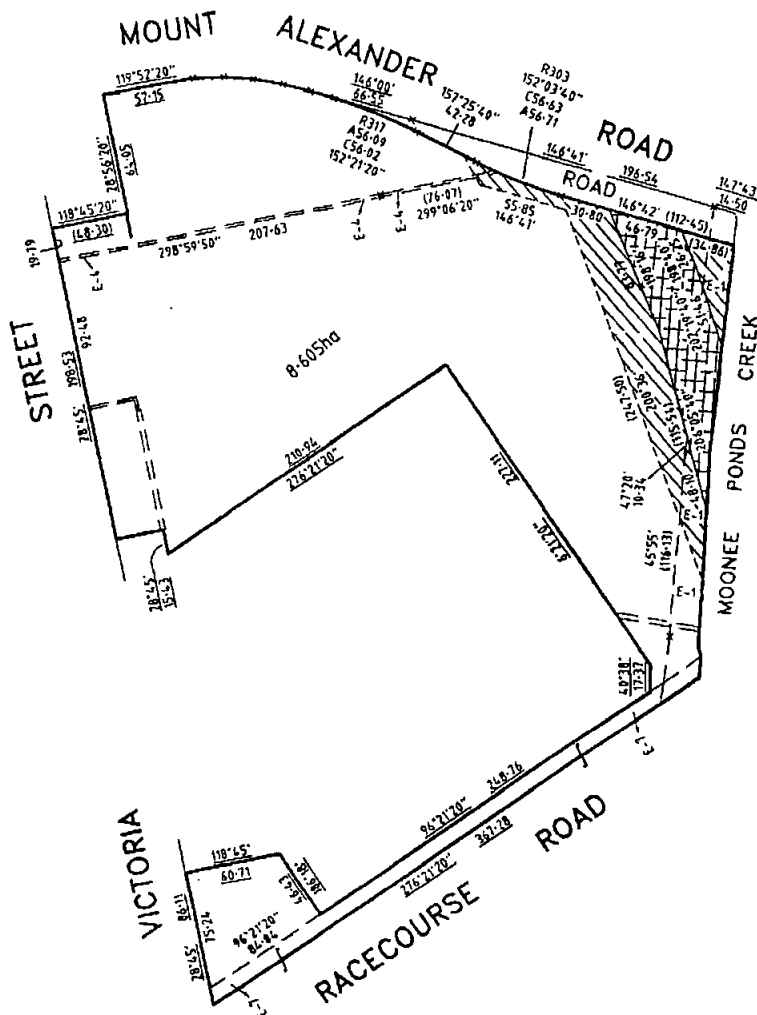

Notice is hereby given that at a meeting of Southern Grampians Shire held on 20 September 1995 Council resolved to make Local Law No. 1 Streets and Roads and on 14 February 1996 resolved to make Local Law No. 2—Meetings and Common Seal pursuant to Part 5 and Schedule 1 of the **Local Government Act 1989**.

The purpose of Local Law No. 1 Streets and Roads is to:

- (a) provide for control and management of traffic over roads whether by persons, vehicles or animals,
- (b) regulate parking of vehicles within the municipality,
- (c) ensure physical features of roads and/or abutting properties represents no danger to road users,
- (d) establish mechanisms to ensure public consultation, prior to major changes to traffic arrangements or discontinuation of roads, is conducted,
- (e) control access of various types of vehicles and animals to roads, and
- (f) control and regulate the following activities on roads:
 - * trading;
 - * placing of goods and equipment;
 - * repairs to vehicles;
 - * parties, festivals and processions;
 - * collections.

The purpose of Local Law No. 2 Meetings and Common Seal is to:

- (a) provide a mechanism to facilitate the good government of the Council through its formal meeting procedure to ensure effective and efficient Council decisions are made in a manner which acknowledges the role of local government within the Australian system of Government;
- (b) to promote and encourage community participation in the system of local government by providing mechanisms for the Council to ascertain the community's views and expectations;

- (c) to regulate and control the election of Mayor, any Deputy Mayor and the chairperson of any Special Committees;
- (d) to regulate and control the procedures governing the conduct of meetings including:
 - (i) the notice required for meetings;
 - (ii) the keeping of minutes;
- (e) to regulate and control the use of Council's seal;
- (f) to provide for the administration of the Council's powers and functions;
- (g) to provide generally for the peace, order and good government of the municipal district; and
- (h) to repeal any redundant local laws.

The Local Laws 1 and 2 were advertised in the 'Spectator' newspaper on 3 November 1995 and 6 January 1996 respectively and likewise in the Government Gazette on 5 November 1996 and 11 January 1996.

Comments were received in relation to the Streets and Roads Local Laws. Council considered these comments and resolved to make the Streets and Roads Local Law on 20 September 1995. It was also resolved to make the Meetings and Common Seal Local Law on 14 February 1996.

Variation to the Rules of Games that may be played in the Temporary Casino at the Galleria in the World Trade Centre.

Under section 60 (1) of the **Casino Control Act 1991** the Victorian Casino and Gaming Authority on 1 March 1996 resolved to amend the Rules of the Games that may be played in the Temporary Casino at the Galleria in the World Trade Centre, which were published in the Government Gazette on 16 June 1994, as follows:

After Part XIII - Keno insert:

"PART XV-LET IT RIDE

1. Definitions
2. Equipment
3. The Cards
4. The Shuffle and the Cut
5. Wagers
6. Minimum and Maximum Wagers
7. The Deal
8. The Play
9. Final Settlement
10. Order of Poker Hand Values
11. Payout Odds
12. Irregularities
13. General Provisions

RULES FOR LET IT RIDE

1. Definitions

1.1. In these rules the following meanings apply:

- 1.1.1. "Dealer" means the person responsible for dealing the cards at a Let It Ride table.
- 1.1.2. "Game Supervisor" means the person responsible for the supervision of the operation of the game.
- 1.1.3. "Casino Supervisor" means a person other than a game supervisor who is responsible for the supervision and management of gaming operations.

2. Equipment

2.1. A Let It Ride table shall have on one side, places for players and, on the opposite side, a place for the dealer. The table cloth shall be marked in a manner similar to that shown in Diagram "A" with:

- 2.1.1. Areas for wagers, the number of areas for each of seven players being three and these three areas being marked with the symbols "\$", "2", and "1".

2.1.2. Two marked areas directly in front of the dealer to house the dealer's down cards.

2.1.3. Inscriptions in front of each player showing the payout schedule, in accordance with rule 11.

2.1.4. The name and/or logo of the casino imprinted thereon; and

2.2. A dealing shoe from which all cards shall be dealt, or an automated shuffling shoe specially designed for the purpose of shuffling one deck and dispensing three cards at a time.

3. The Cards

3.1. Let it Ride shall be played with one deck, 52 cards without jokers, with backs of the same colour and design and one cutting card. In the event that a automated card shuffling shoe is used, two decks shall be in use, one at a time, but with the backs of the cards of a different colour.

3.2. Cards shall be checked prior to use on a gaming table and again at the conclusion of gaming.

3.3. Cards may, at the discretion of a game supervisor, be changed after any round of play if, for any reason, a card or cards become unfit for further use. If all the cards are replaced, the new cards shall be checked, shuffled and cut in accordance with these rules.

3.4. A game supervisor may, at any time, instruct the dealer to check and verify the proper amount of cards (52 cards).

3.5. All suits have the same rank. The rank of cards, from highest to lowest, shall be as follows:

Ace, King, Queen, Jack, 10, 9, 8; 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, except as provided in rule 10.1.5. where the Ace may be counted low.

4. The Shuffle and the Cut

4.1. The cards shall be shuffled in preparation for each round of play.

4.2. After the cards have been shuffled, the dealer shall cut the cards (once only) and place them on the cutting card. In the event that an automated card shuffling shoe is used, the cards shall not be cut.

4.3. The player never cuts the cards.

5. Wagers

5.1. Wagers shall be accepted only in chips.

5.2. Prior to the first card being dealt, for each round of play, each player at the game of Let It Ride shall make three equal wagers, one on each of the player's betting areas marked "\$", "2" and "1".

5.3. Once the first card has been dealt, no player shall handle, remove or alter the original wager until a decision has been rendered and implemented on that wager, unless explicitly permitted by these rules. In the event that an automated card shuffling shoe is used, this rule applies when the first set of three cards is removed from the shoe.

5.4. All wagers at a Let It Ride table shall be made by placing gaming chips, with the smaller denomination on top, on the appropriate areas of the layout.

5.5. Wagers orally declared shall only be accepted if accompanied by chips or cash which must be immediately converted to chips and placed on the layout before the dealer announces "no more bets".

5.6. A player shall not wager on more than one hand of any round.

5.7. Only one wager shall be accepted on any one betting area.

6. Minimum and Maximum Wagers

6.1. The minimum and maximum wagers permitted per player shall be shown on a notice at the table. Unless stated on this notice, wagers are not required to be made in multiples of the minimum. This notice may also state the minimum unit in which wagers may be made above the table minimum.

6.2. Wagers below the minimum shall be paid or collected after the result and the owner of the wager shall be advised that further wagers under the minimum shall be returned regardless of the result.

6.3. Wagers above the maximum shall be paid or collected to the maximum.

6.4. A casino supervisor may alter the limits on a gaming table at any time except that a minimum wager can only be changed to a higher minimum if a sign showing the proposed new minimum has been displayed at the table for at least 20 minutes before the time of the proposed change.

6.5. A gaming shift manager may allow a player to wager in excess of the stated maximum wager permitted on that table, provided that a marker denoting the new maximum for that playing area is placed adjacent to the playing area.

7. The Deal

7.1. All cards used in the game of Let It Ride shall be dealt from a card shoe specifically designed for such purpose.

7.2. All cards shall be dealt face downwards.

7.3. Immediately prior to the commencement of a round of play and after all wagers are on the table, the dealer shall announce "no more bets".

7.4. If a conventional dealing shoe is used, the dealer shall, starting from his/her left and continuing clockwise around the table, deal the cards in the following manner:-

7.4.1. one card, face down, to each of the playing areas containing wagers;

7.4.2. in sequence, deal a second and third card, face down, to each of the playing areas containing wagers;

7.4.3. one card, face down, to each of the areas marked to house the dealer's down cards.

7.5. If an automated shuffling shoe is used, the dealer shall starting from his/her left and continuing clockwise around the table, deal the cards in the following manner:-

7.5.1. a stack of three cards dispensed by the automated card shuffling shoe, face down to each playing area containing a wager;

7.5.2. a stack of three cards, face down, to himself/herself;

7.5.3. the top card of the stack dealt to the dealer shall be placed undisclosed into the discard rack; and

7.5.4. the bottom card of the stack shall constitute the first dealer's card to be exposed as per rule 8.6.

8. The Play

8.1. After the cards have been dealt, the players shall pick up their cards and check the content of their hands.

8.2. The dealer shall, beginning from the left, ask each player to indicate whether they wish to either:

8.2.1. have the bet on the playing area marked "1" returned by the dealer; or

8.2.2. let the bet on the playing area marked "1" ride.

8.3. Should a player decide to let a bet ride, that bet shall remain in action until the conclusion of the game.

8.4. Each player shall indicate his/her decision by:

8.4.1. scratching the table towards himself/herself for the return of a wager; or

8.4.2. a horizontal movement of the hand to let a wager ride.

8.5. Should a player, at any stage of the game, have a winning hand, in accordance with rule 10, he/she shall place his/her cards under his/her wager on the area marked "\$", thereby indicating an intention to let all remaining wagers ride.

8.6. After each player has indicated a decision on his/her wager on playing area "1", the dealer shall turn, face up, the first of the dealer's down cards.

8.7. The dealer shall then, in accordance with rule 8.2, obtain a decision from each player for wagers on areas marked "2".

8.8. A player who has elected to let his/her wager on playing area "1" ride, may still elect to have his/her wager on playing area "2" returned by the dealer.

8.9. After each player has indicated a decision on his/her wager on playing area "2", the dealer shall turn, face up, the second of the dealer's down cards and each player's hand is then complete i.e. the player's hand comprises the player's three cards plus the dealer's two cards.

8.10. Players wagers on playing areas marked "\$" are not subject to rule 8.2.

9. Final Settlement

9.1 After the dealer's second down card is exposed players shall lay their cards face down.

9.2. A player is responsible for declaring his/her whole poker hand.

9.3. The dealer shall be responsible for declaring the optimum value of the hands in accordance with rule 10.

9.4 The dealer shall, beginning from the right, pay or collect all wagers, in accordance with rule 11. Each wager shall be acted upon separately.

9.5. After settlement of each hand the player's cards shall be picked up by the dealer, so that the cards can be readily reconstructed to indicate each player's hand in the case of a dispute.

10. Order of Poker Hand Values

10.1. The order of hands, lowest to highest, is as follows:

- 10.1.1. Five odd cards eg Q, 10, 6, 4, 2
- 10.1.2. One pair eg 10, 10, K, 6, 3
- 10.1.3. Two pairs eg 7, 7, 4, 4, J
- 10.1.4. Three of a kind eg Q, Q, Q, 8, 3

10.1.5. Straight-any five cards in sequence. An Ace may count high or low in a straight eg 5, 4, 3, 2, Ace or Ace, King, Queen, Jack, 10.

10.1.6. Flush-five cards of the same suit, not in sequence eg K, J, 9, 5, 2, all diamonds.

10.1.7. Full house-three cards of one kind plus two of another eg King, King, King, Jack, Jack. All hands take their rank from the threesome.

10.1.8. Four of a kind eg Ace, Ace, Ace, Ace, 7.

10.1.9. Straight Flush-five cards of the same suit in sequence.

10.1.10. Royal Flush-the five top cards, all from the same suit eg Ace, King, Queen, Jack, 10, all spades.

11. Payout Odds

11.1. The odds payable at final settlement shall be as follows:

Less than a pair of 10's player loses

Pair of 10's or better	1 to 1	(up to maximum payout)
Two Pair	2 to 1	(up to maximum payout)
3 of a Kind	3 to 1	(up to maximum payout)
Straight	5 to 1	(up to maximum payout)
Flush	8 to 1	(up to maximum payout)
Full House	11 to 1	(up to maximum payout)
4 of a Kind	50 to 1	(up to maximum payout)
Straight Flush	200 to 1	(up to maximum payout)
Royal Flush	1000 to 1	(up to maximum payout)

11.2. Maximum payouts per table shall be displayed on a notice at the table.

12. Irregularities

12.1. An incorrect number of cards dealt to any player or the dealer, shall constitute a misdeal.

12.2. A card or cards dealt to any playing area where there are less than three wagers shall constitute a misdeal.

12.3. An exposed card dealt to a player's hand shall not constitute a misdeal, the dealer shall turn the card over and continue to deal the game.

12.4. An exposed card dealt as a dealer's down card shall constitute a misdeal.

12.5. Subject to rule 13.3, three or more cards incorrectly exposed shall constitute a misdeal.

12.6. In the event of a misdeal all bets are void. The hand shall be re-dealt after players have had the opportunity to change their bets.

12.7. If during settlement, the dealer becomes aware that a bet does not comply with rule 5.2, the player must, upon request, correct the bet accordingly.

12.8. In the event an automated card shuffling shoe jams, stops shuffling during a shuffle or fails to complete a shuffle cycle, the cards shall be reshuffled.

12.9. In the event an automated card shuffling shoe does not verify that the correct number of cards is remaining at the completion of the deal, the dealer shall count all the cards, verifying each hand as well as the remaining undealt cards. If the count proves the deck to have too few or too many cards, that round of play shall be void.

13. General Provisions

13.1. A person shall not, either alone or in concert with any other person, use or have in his/her possession or control at or near a gaming table or location related to the playing of a game a calculator, computer, or other electronic, electrical or mechanical apparatus or device that is capable, with respect to a game or part thereof, of recording, projecting or analysing an outcome or the changing probabilities or the playing strategies to be used.

13.2. Where a player has contravened any provision of the rules a casino supervisor may:-

13.2.1. declare that any wager made by the player(s) shall be void;

13.2.2. direct that the player(s) shall be excluded from further participation in the game;

13.2.3. seize any monies won by that player(s) while in possession of a prohibited device and retain such monies pending completion of an investigation;

13.2.4. confiscate the prohibited device; and

13.2.5. detain the person(s) in possession of the prohibited device until such time as an authorised person has

attended and assumed responsibility for the situation.

13.3. A casino supervisor may invalidate the outcome of a game if:

13.3.1. the game is disrupted by civil commotion, fire, riot, brawl, robbery, an Act of God; or

13.3.2. any fraudulent act is perpetrated by any person, that affects the outcome of the game.

13.4. Where the outcome of a game is invalidated, all wagers made by the players for that particular result shall be refunded.

13.5. A player shall not be advised by an employee of the casino on how to play, except to ensure compliance with these rules.

13.6. No onlooker or any player wagering at any table may, unless requested by a player, influence another players decisions of play.

13.7. The casino supervisor may close a gaming table at which players are present provided a sign showing the proposed time of closure has been displayed at the table for at least 20 minutes before the closure.

13.8. A seated player who abstains from wagering for three consecutive rounds whilst all other seats at the table are in use may be required to vacate that seat.

13.9. Complainants in all unresolved disputes shall be advised of the presence of, and their right to consult, a VCGA Inspector.

13.10. In any dispute arising from these rules or not covered by the provisions of these rules, the decision of the casino supervisor shall be final, subject to a review by the VCGA Chief Casino Inspector, if requested.

13.11. Players are not permitted to have side bets against each other.

13.12. A copy of these rules shall be made available, upon request.

13.13. Players shall not exchange cards, or exchange information, or communicate to cause to exchange or communicate information regarding their hand. Any violation may result in the hand being declared a "dead" hand, ie the player forfeits his/her wager and takes no further part in that round."
