

CITY OF KINGSTON Local Law No. 7

Notice is hereby given that at the Ordinary Council Meeting of the City of Kingston held on 1 April 1996, Council resolved to commence the statutory process for the making of local law number 7 (Meeting Procedures).

The purpose and general purport of the local law is to:

- (a) provide for the peace order and good government of the municipal district;
- (b) provide for the administration of Council powers and functions;
- (c) regulate proceedings at Council Meetings, Committee Meetings and other meetings conducted by or on behalf of Council where Council has resolved that the provisions of the Local Law are to apply;

- (e) promote and encourage community participation in the system of local government by providing mechanisms within the meeting arrangements for the Council to ascertain the community's views and expectations;
- (f) regulate the use of the Common Seal; and
- (g) prohibit unauthorised use of the Common Seal or any device resembling the Common Seal.

A copy of the proposed local law is available for inspection (or purchase for the sum of \$2.00) from any of the following City of Kingston Service Centres: Moorabbin, 999 Nepean Highway; Mentone, Brindisi Street or Chelsea, 1 Chelsea Road.

Any person affected by the proposed local law may make a written submission in accordance with the provisions of Section 223 of the Local Government Act 1989, addressed to Mr Peter Frost, City of Kingston, PO Box 21, Moorabbin 3189.

Submissions received by 4.00 p.m. on Friday, 26 April will be considered by Council's Advisory and Executive Committee at its meeting to be held on Monday, 6 May at the Mentone Service Centre, Brindisi Street, Mentone. Persons making written submissions should clearly state in their submission whether they wish to be heard in person or by a person acting on their behalf at the meeting in support of their written submission.

CITY OF KINGSTON Local Laws 5 and 6

Notice is given that at the Ordinary Council Meeting of the City of Kingston held on 1 April 1996, the Council resolved to make local laws numbered 5 (Environment and Amenity) and 6 (Birds, Animals, Poultry, Rodents and Bees).

The purpose of local law number 5 is to:

- (a) provide for the peace, order and good government of the municipal district of the Council;
- (b) provide for the administration of Council powers and functions;

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- (c) provide for a safe and healthy environment by prohibiting or regulating activities which may be dangerous or unsafe or detrimental to the quality of life in the municipal district;
- (d) provide for the protection of the environment and amenity of the Municipal District; and
- (e) prohibit and/or regulate activities with a view to minimising nuisances.

The general purport of local law number 5 is summarised as follows:

Part 1 Preliminary Provisions

Part 2 Protection of Amenity, including: advertising and bill posting, bulk rubbish containers, building/industrial refuse on roads or Council land, substances from vehicles, animals and livestock, clothing recycling bins, unsightly/dangerous land, motor vehicles and machinery, camping on roads or public places, trees and plants overhanging roads or Council property, chimneys, noise, audible intruder alarms, distribution of materials and literature on Council land, property numbers, collection of recyclable material, and circuses, carnivals and festivals.

Part 3 Recreation Vehicles for Recreational Purposes

Part 4 Moveable Dwellings Including Tents and Caravans

Part 5 Restrictions Applying to Heavy Vehicles in a Residential Area

Part 6 Consumption of Alcohol in Public Places

Part 7 Fire Prevention, including: lighting fires in the open, incinerators, and barbeques

Part 8 Administration, including permits, fees, notices to comply, infringement notices, payment of penalties, and powers of authorised officers to impound and act in urgent circumstances.

The purpose of local law number 6 is to:

- (a) provide for the peace order and good government of the municipal district of the Council;
- (b) provide for the administration of Council powers and functions;
- (c) provide for the welfare of birds, animals, poultry and rodents that are kept by residents or ratepayers within the municipal district;

- (d) regulate the keeping of any birds, animals, poultry, rodents or bees, the regulating or prohibiting of the keeping of any place, or the storage of any things related to the keeping of birds, animals, poultry, rodents or bees which in the opinion of the Council may be offensive, injurious to health or dangerous;
- (e) regulate the keeping of birds, animals, poultry or rodents, with power to limit the number kept on any property within any area within the municipal district;
- (f) regulate the cleanliness of housing and surrounds for birds, animals, poultry or rodents including the manner in which food for such things is kept;
- (g) suppress nuisances;
- (h) prevent objectionable noises unreasonable times; and to
- (i) repeal local laws of the former municipalities to the extent that any provisions contained in them are inconsistent with this Local Law.

The general purport of local law number 6 is summarised as follows:

Part 1 Preliminary Provisions

Part 2 Keeping of Cats and Dogs, including: restrictions on number of dogs and cats per property

Part 3 Keeping of Rodents and Reptiles

Part 4 Keeping of Other Animals

Part 5 Keeping of Poultry and Game Birds

Part 6 Keeping of Other Birds

Part 7 Keeping of Bees

Part 8 General Provisions, including public health and nuisance issues, litters of animals and permits relating to the number of animals or birds to be kept

Part 9 Administration, including permits, fees, notices to comply, infringement notices, payment of penalties, and powers of authorised officers to impound and act in urgent circumstances.



Notice of Intention to Make Local Laws

Notice is hereby given in accordance with Section 119 of the Local Government Act 1989 that Council at its meeting on 3 April 1996 has resolved to make the following Local Laws:

Administration, Enforcement and Penalties Local Law No. 1

The objectives of this Local Law are:

(a) provide for the administration and enforcement of; and prescribe penalties for contravention of Local Laws made by Council.

Camping Local Law No. 2

The objectives of this Local Law are:

(a) to regulate camping on roads and land.

Control of Vehicles Local Law No. 3 The objectives of this Local Law are:

 (a) regulate and control the abandonment of vehicles within the municipal district;

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- (b) regulate and control the unlawful obstruction, parking and standing of vehicles within the municipal district;
- (c) preserve the amenity of roads within the municipal district;
- provide for the peace, order and good government of Council's municipal district.

Droving of Livestock Local Law No. 4

The objectives of this Local Law are:

- (a) to regulate the droving of livestock within or through the Municipal district;
- (b) to regulate the droving of livestock to or from a location within the Municipal district along the most direct practicable route;
- (c) to regulate the droving of livestock along certain streets or roads within the Municipal district for purposes of-
 - (i) preventing damage to roadside vegetation;
 - (ii) preventing damage to properties adjoining certain streets or roads within the Municipal district;
 - (iii) preventing the spread of disease in the Municipal district;
 - (iv) preventing the spread of noxious weeds in the Municipal district;
 - (v) preventing damage to pavements, formations drainage;
- (e) to regulate the grazing of livestock on curtain roads within the Municipal district for fire reduction purposes;
- (f) to control the manner in which livestock are driven to provide as far as possible, for safety of users of streets and roads within the Municipal district;
- (g) to prescribe the fees to be paid for any permits issued under this Local Law;
- (h) to prescribe the penalties to be imposed for contravention of certain provisions of this Local Law.

Environmental Health (Local Amenity) Local Law No. 5

The objectives of this Local Law are:

- (a) prevent the outbreak of fire;
- (b) prevent and abate nuisances;
- (c) regulate the lighting of fire in the open air;

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- (d) prohibit the lighting of fires in incinerators in residential areas;
- provide for environmental control, protection and conservation;
- minimise the incidence of airborne particle pollution.

Environmental Health (Animals and Birds) Local Law No. 6

The objectives of this Local Law is to regulate the keeping of:

- (a) dogs;
- (b) cats;
- (c) horses, cattle and other animals:
 - (d) domestic birds;
 - (e) poultry;
 - (f) other birds;
 - (g) bees;
 - (h) rodents:
 - (i) reptiles.

Environmental Health (Refuse Disposal) Local Law No. 7

The objectives of this Local Law are:

- (a) provide for the use and control of receptacles of the deposit and collection of refuse and rubbish;
- (b) prescribe the size and shape of materials to be used in the construction of such receptacles;
- (c) prevent and regulate the deposit of refuse and rubbish upon streets and other lands and places under the control of Council.

Municipal Buildings Local Law No. 8

The objectives of this Local Law are to regulate the use of:

- (a) the municipal offices;
- (b) other municipal buildings;
- (c) aquatic facilities;
- (d) public conveniences.

Municipal Reserves Local Law No. 9

The objectives of this Local Law is to regulate the use of:

(a) reserves within the municipal district.

Recreational Vehicles Local Law No. 10 The objective of this Local Law is to regulate

the use of: (a) recreational vehicles on land within the municipal district.

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Street Traders and Collectors Local Law No. 11
The objectives of this Local Law are:

- (a) use of streets and public places by persons dealing in goods;
- (b) practice of soliciting and collecting gifts of money or subscriptions.

Streets and Roads (General Regulation) Local Law No. 12

The objectives of this Local Law are:

- (a) regulate the exhibition of merchandise on pavements;
- (b) regulate the exhibition of advertising signs on pavements;
- (c) regulate the placement of seats, tables, chairs and other furniture on pavements;
- (d) regulate the exhibition of merchandise and advertising signs on vehicles left standing near retail premises;
- (e) regulate the protrusion of verandahs and awnings into the airspace about pavements;
- (f) regulate the deposit of shopping trolleys in streets, car parks and other public places;
- (g) regulate the use of skateboards on pavements and in car parks;
- (h) prevent the deposit of dog litter on roads and in other public places;
- (i) prohibit the destruction or removal of, or damage to, street furniture;
- (j) regulate the exhibition of electoral material on public structures and certain private land;
- (k) regulate the identification of premises;
- (1) regulate the growth of trees and plants so as to prevent accidents;
- (m) prohibit obstructions;
- (n) provide for the construction and maintenance of permanent and temporary vehicle crossings.

Streets and Roads (Traffic) Local Law No. 13
The objectives of this Local Law are:

- (a) regulate the permanent closure of roads;
- (b) regulate the temporary closure of roads;
- (c) regulate the erection and maintenance of obstructions and barriers on roads;

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- (d) prevent injuries to persons and damage to property;
- (e) allow the implementation of traffic diversion experiments;
- (f) regulate the use of roads by heavy motor vehicles;
- (g) allow the introduction of speed limits on roads.

A copy of the proposed Local Laws can be inspected and obtained from the Customer Service Offices in Nhill, Dimboola, Rainbow and Jeparit during office hours.

Any person affected by the proposed local laws may make a submission relating to the proposed Local Laws in accordance with section 223 of the Local Government Act 1989.

Any person who has made a submission, may request that he/she be heard in person or by a person acting on his/her behalf.

Any person wishing to make a verbal submission only, should contact Council and state their desire to do so prior to the closing date for written submissions.




STATE HIGHWAY

66/96 Omeo Highway in the Shire of East Gippsland shown hatched on plan numbered GP 19135.




MAIN ROAD


