Parliamentary Committees Act 1968 REFERRAL OF MATTER TO THE FAMILY AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT **COMMITTEE**

The Governor in Council, under Section 4F of the Parliamentary Committees Act 1968 refers the following matter to the Family and Community Development Committee for inquiry, consideration and report to the Parliament.

The effects of television on children and families in Victoria and in particular, to-

- (i) Examine the impact of television on relationships within the family, lifestyle and leisure patterns of families.
- (ii) Examine the influence of television on the social and physical development and learning patterns of children.
- (iii) Examine the relative usefulness of television in enhancing skills development within especially in relation to parenting and children with special needs.
- (iv) Assess the likely impact on children and families of new and emerging forms of multi-media technology and consider ways that this technology may enhance the well-being of Victorian families.
- (v) Examine the relationship between violence on television and violent behaviour within families.
- (vi) Make recommendations to provide advice to families suggesting ways to use television to enhance the positive and minimise the negative effects of television on children.

Planning and Environment Act 1987 MELBOURNE PLANNING SCHEME

Notice of Approval of Amendment Amendment L283

The Minister for Planning and Local Government has approved Amendment L283 to the Melbourne Planning Scheme.

The amendment comes into operation on the date this notice is published in the Government Gazette.

The amendment inserts a new specific site control as Clause 315-5A of the Melbourne Planning Scheme to allow the land at 99-107 Lygon Street, Carlton to be used as a hotel.

The amendment corrects an anomaly in the scheme and provides the state section of the Planning Scheme definition of hotel to be used at this site rather than the regional definition that relates to a now defunct Liquor Control Act 1968.

A copy of the amendment can be inspected, free of charge, during office hours, at the Department of Infrastructure, Customer Service Centre, Upper Plaza, Nauru House, 80 Collins Street, Melbourne and at the offices of the Melbourne City Council, Council House, Level 6, 200 Little Collins Street, Melbourne 3000.
