CityWide Service Solutions Pty Ltd determines the prices of the products manufactured at the plant under the terms of the contract. The Local Law is therefore no longer required.

Variation to the Rules of Games that may be played at the Melbourne Casino, which was published in the Government Gazette on 24 April 1997.

Under section 60(1) of the **Casino Control Act 1991** the Victorian Casino and Gaming Authority on 21 October 1997 resolved that the following amendments be made to the rules of Poker:

For rule 8.3.1 substitute:

"8.3.1 The values of each card in descending order for a 36 card deck is: Ace, King, Queen, Jack, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6 and for a 32 card deck is: Ace, King, Queen, Jack, 10, 9, 8, 7. Ace counts low in a small straight."

Rule 8.3.1.1 is repealed.

Rules 8.3.1.2 to 8.3.1.11 are renumbered as rules 8.3.1.1 to 8.3.1.10.
