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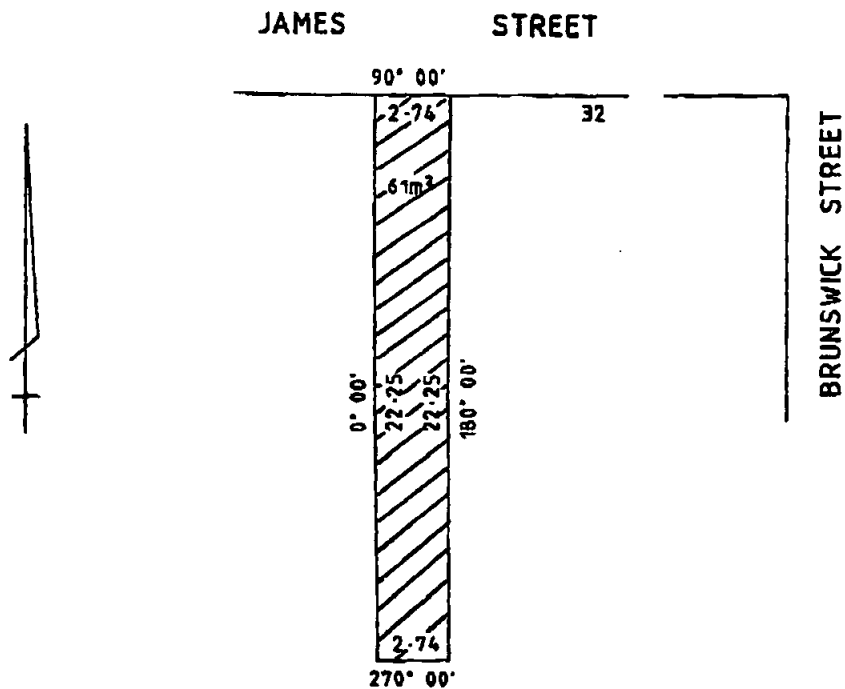

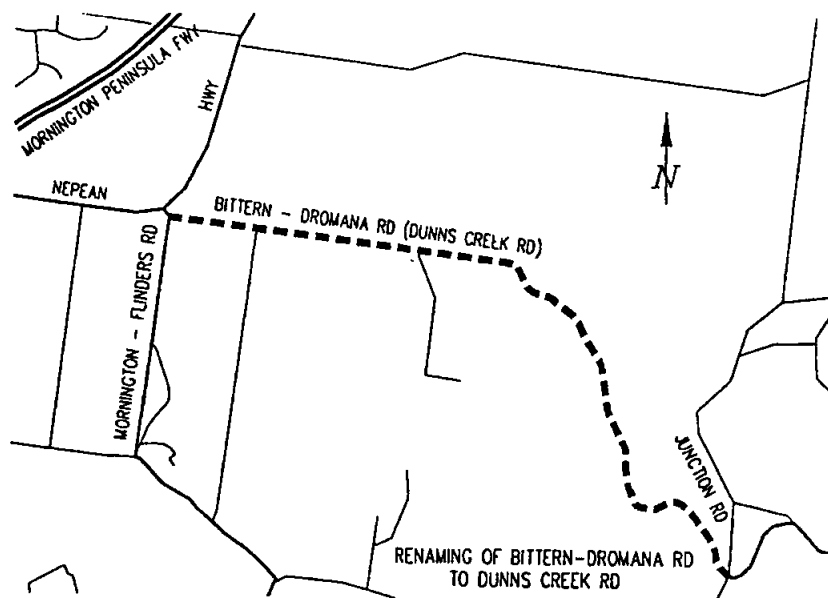

- (i) for a period of time as determined by Council;
- (ii) on such conditions as determined by Council.

1.7 Regular Movement of Livestock—In excess of 52 separate movements in one 12 month period."
