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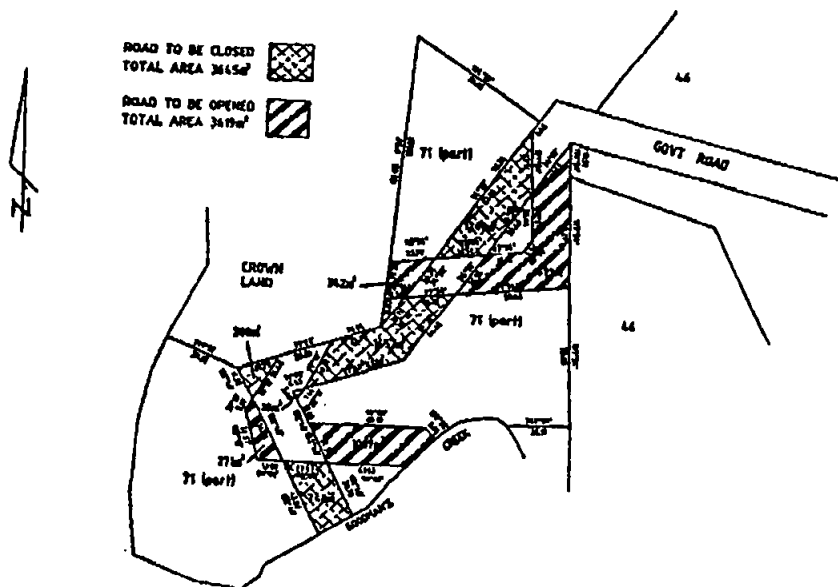

LAND ABUTTING MULLENS ROAD, BACCHUS MARSH, BEING CA 71, PARISH OF COIMADAI



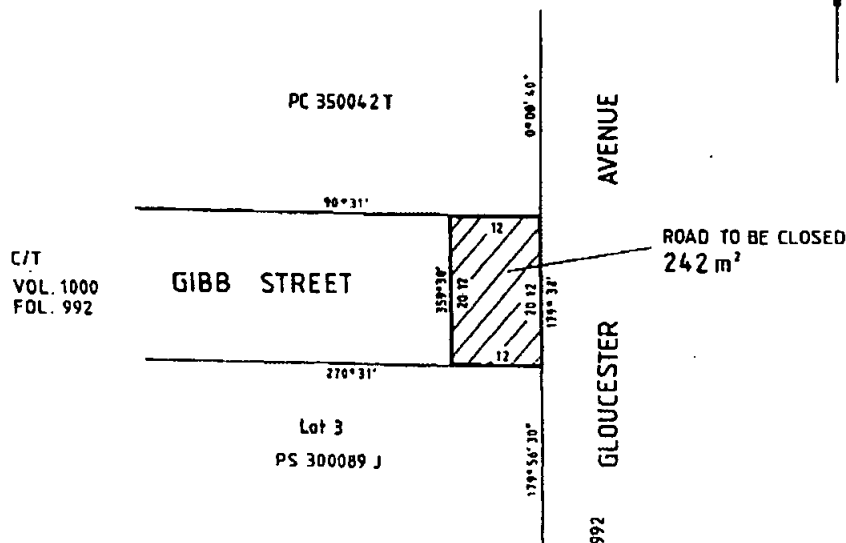

Purpose:

- administration
- provide for a safe and healthy environment for persons within the municipal district;
- regulate and control the conditions of behaviour which may lead to environmental nuisances, health and safety hazards or pollution being caused.

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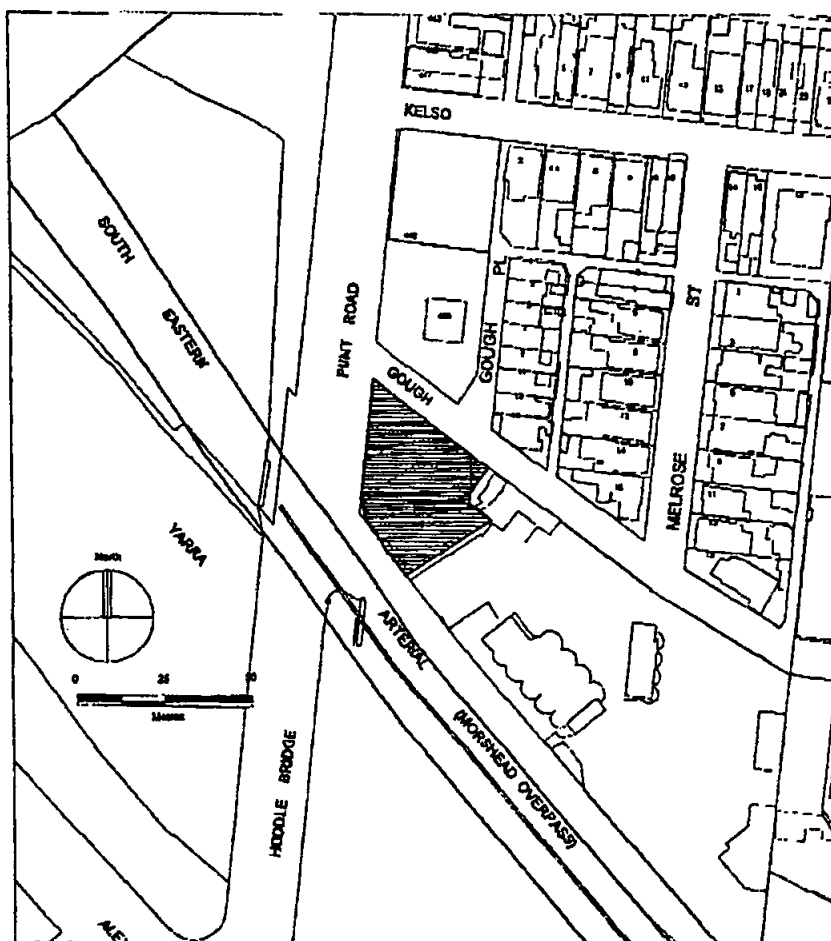
