IMMIGRATION.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct that the period allowed to Settlers for notifying their intention to bring out Emigrants under the Government Notice of the 28th October, 1835 (now re-published for more convenient reference), shall be extended to the 30th day of June next.

In order to guard against the inconvenience of long outstanding claims against the Government, His Excellency is further pleased to notify that Bounties will not be allowed under the former or present Notice, unless the Emigrants shall arrive on or before the 31st day of December, 1837.

AS a part of the arrangements intended to be adopted with a view to facilitate the introduction into the Colony of useful and respectable Emigrants from any part of Europe, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified that a pecuniary aid, to the amount and under the conditions hereinafter specified, will be granted to those Settlers who shall be at the charge of bringing Emigrants to Sydney:—

1. The sum of £30 will be granted as a bounty towards defraying the expense of the passage of every married man, whether mechanic or farm servant, and his wife, neither of whose ages shall exceed, on embarkation, 30 years; and the sum of £5 for each of their children whose age shall exceed 12 months. A sum of £15 will also be allowed for every unmarried female whose age shall not be below 15 nor above 30 years, who shall come out with the consent of the Settler or his agent, under the protection of the married couple, as forming part of the family, and destined to remain with it until such female be otherwise provided for. A bounty of £10 will also be

allowed for every unmarried male mechanic or farm servant, above the age of 18 and not exceeding 25 years, brought out by a Settler who at the same time brings out an equal number of females, accompanying and attached to a family, as hereinbefore described.

2. Before any such payments are made, the Emigrant on whose account they are claimed, will be required to present themselves before a Board, appointed by the Governor to inspect persons of this description, to whom the adults are to exhibit testimonials of good character, signed by clergymen and respectable inhabitants of note in the places of their former residence, with which testimonials it is necessary that every family and single person for whom the bounty is claimed, should be provided. If the Board shall be satisfied with these testimonials, and that the persons presenting themselves are within the ages set forth in the foregoing paragraph, to be established by the production of copies or extracts of the registry of their baptism, duly certified by the Parish Minister, or other proper officer, of good bodily health and strength, and in all other respects likely to be useful members of their class in society, a certificate to such effect will be granted by the Board, which being presented at the Colonial Secretary's Office, in Sydney, a warrant will be immediately issued for payment to the Settler, of the sum to which he shall become entitled under this notice. In the case of Foreigners brought to the Colony for the cultivation of the vine or olive, or for the manufacture of wine or oil, certificates of age, but not of character, will be dispensed with.

3. Settlers desiring to avail themselves of any of these bounties are required to transmit to the Colonial Secretary, at Sydney, on or before the last day of November next, a list, specifying as nearly as circumstances will permit, the number, condition, and calling of the persons they propose to bring out.

4. It is to be understood that bounties will not be allowed for any persons brought out by Settlers, unless the claimant shall have transmitted

to the Colonial Secretary, within the time specified, the list required by the foregoing paragraph, and that he shall have received in reply an intimation of its being the intention of this Government to grant a bounty on the introduction of the persons described therein. If hereafter it shall be found expedient to renew* the arrangement now promulgated, due notice will be given from the Colonial Secretary's Office.

5. It is also to be understood that no expense whatever, attendant upon the introduction of these Emigrants, will be defrayed by Government, excepting the bounties hereinbefore mentioned; and that the wives and families of soldiers in regiments in this Colony, or Van Diemen's Land, and of persons serving under sentence of transportation in either Colony, are excepted from the present regulation.

GRANTS OF LAND.

THE following descriptions of GRANTS OF LAND, with the names of the persons to whom they were respectively promised, are published for general information, in order that all parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions which may have been made inadvertently; and notice is hereby given, that at the end of *three months* from this date, unless written caveats be previously lodged at this Office, Deeds of Grant will be prepared accordingly.

It is requested that all Christian and Surnames may be communicated to this Office, at full length, together with the intended name of property, and the present residence of the party.

BATHURST.

13. WILLIAM LAWSON, 640, Six hundred and forty acres, parish unnamed, at Uddugaul, on the north bank of the Belubula River, about seven miles below J. Collett's 640 acres; bounded on the east by a line north commencing at a marked tree on the north bank of the Belubula River 37 chains; on the north by a line west 80 chains; on the west by a line south 92 chains to the Belubula River; and on the south by that river.

Promised to Joseph Pye by General Darling on the 15th September, 1829, and possession authorised 31st March, 1831; but at Mr. Pye's request the deed is now advertised for Mr. Lawson.

Quit-rent £5 6s. 8d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1832.

14. JOSEPH TAYLOR, 2560, Two thousand five hundred and sixty acres, parish unnamed, at Kangaroo Bay, near Molong; bounded partly on the east by a line from Nandillion Ponds south 46 chains 50 links to the corner of a Village Reserve; on the south by the Village Reserve west 80 chains, and a continued west line 35 chains; on the west by a line north 257 chains to Nandillion Ponds; on the north and remainder of the east by the Nandillion Ponds to the point of commencement.

Promised by General Darling on 15th March, 1831, and possession authorised on 30th September, 1831, as a primary grant.

Quit-rent £21 6s. 8d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1839.

BRISBANE.

15. RICHARD JONES, 640, Six hundred and forty acres, parish unnamed, at Cockrabil, on Krui Creek; bounded on the south by a line east 102 chains, commencing on Krui Creek; on the east by a line north 80 chains; on the north by a line west 48 chains to Krui Creek; and on the west by that Creek to the commencing south-west corner.

Promised by Governor Darling on 20th November, 1830, to Hugh Macdonald, in whose favor the land was advertised on 23d April, 1833, but at whose request it is now re-advertised for Mr. Richard Jones, and possession authorised on 22d April, 1831, free of quit-rent, being in compensation for services in the pursuit and apprehension of bushrangers in December, 1830.

CAMDEN.

16. JAMES NORTON, 600, Six hundred acres, parish unnamed, at Sutton Forest; bounded on the east by a line bearing south 17 chains, commencing at the south-west corner of Mr. Henderson's farm to the road; on the south by that road; on the west by a line bearing north 100 chains to the Nanawra or Black Bobs Creek; and on the north by that creek.

Promised by Sir Thomas Brisbane on 9th June, 1824, to Charles Driver, at whose request the Deed is now advertised for Mr. Norton.

Quit-rent £4 10s. 0d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1833.

17. WILLIAM HUTCHINSON, SEN., 300, Three hundred acres, parish unnamed, at Bong Bong; bounded on the south by a line bearing west 40 chains, commencing at the north-east corner of Charles Langham's farm; on the west by a line bearing north 78 chains 50 links to the Wingecarribbee River; and on the north and east by that river to the north-east corner of Langham's farm aforesaid.

Promised by Sir Thomas Brisbane on 15th November, 1825, to William Hutchinson, Junior, in whose favor the deed was advertised on 29th April, 1835, but at whose request it is now re-advertised for William Hutchinson, Senior.

Quit-rent £2 10s. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1833.

CUMBERLAND.

18. JOHN JOSEPH TERRY, 280, Two hundred and eighty acres, parish of Narrabeen; bounded on the north-west by the south-eastern boundary of J. Napper's 400 acres bearing east 20 degrees north 28 chains from Careel Bay to the sea coast; on the north-east by the sea coast to the northern boundary of J. J. Terry's 1200 acres; on the south by the last named boundary bearing west 25 chains to Careel Creek; and on the south-west by Careel Creek and Bay to the south-eastern boundary of J. Napper's 400 acres.

Promised by Sir Richard Bourke on 3rd July, 1835.

Quit-rent one peppercorn, being given in exchange for a building allotment in Parramatta, required for a Roman Catholic Chapel.

19. WILLIAM HILTON HOBELL, 30, Thirty acres, parish of Hunter's-hill, Parramatta River, at the Three Brothers; bounded on the east by a line north, 3 chains, commencing at the head of a

small bay on the eastern side of the Three Brother's Point; on the north by a line west 20 chains to the Parramatta River; and on all other sides by that river to the head of the small bay above-mentioned.

Promised by Governor Macquarie 1st December, 1821, to *George Fieldhouse*, and now advertised at his request for *Mr. Hovell*.

Quit-rent 1s. sterling per annum, commencing 1 January, 1841; the above land being authorised in lieu of the like quantity selected on Cook's River.

DURHAM.

20. JOHN WIGHTON, 1000, One thousand acres, *parish of Seaham*; bounded on the north by reserved lands, bearing west 133 chains; on the west by a line bearing south 80 chains; on the south by a line bearing east 133 chains; and on the east by *Duncan Sinclair's* farm, bearing north 80 chains to the commencing north-east corner.

Promised by *Sir Thomas Brisbane* on 15th May, 1824, to *Alexander Warren*, in whose favor the land was advertised on 1st July, 1834, but at whose request it is now re-advertised for *John Wighton*.

Quit-rent £7 10s. per annum, commencing 1st January, 1833.

21. JOHN WIGHTON, 1000, One thousand acres, *parish of Seaham*; bounded on the south by *McClyment's* farm, bearing west 80 chains; on the west by a line bearing north 130 chains; on the north by a line bearing east 80 chains to the west boundary of *Warren's* first granted farm; and on the east by that farm, bearing south 57 chains 50 links, and a continued south line of 72 chains 50 links to the commencing south-east corner.

Promised by *Sir Thomas Brisbane*, on 12th August, 1825, to *Alexander Warren*, in whose favor the land was advertised, on 1st July, 1834, but at whose request it is now re-advertised for *John Wighton*. Quit-rent £8 6s. 8d. per annum, commencing 1st January, 1833.

22. JOHN WIGHTON, 560, Five hundred and sixty acres, *parish of Seaham*; commencing at the north-east corner of the reserve of *Nelson's Plains*, at *Williams' River*, and bounded on the south by 63 chains of its north boundary line, bearing west by compass; on the west by a north line of 80 chains to the south boundary line of *Duncan Sinclair's* 800 acres grant; on the north by 62 chains of that line, bearing east by compass, to *Williams' River*; and on the east by *Williams' River* to the commencing point.

Promised by *Governor Darling*, on 31st January, 1829, to *Alexander Warren*, and possession authorised on 23rd July, 1829, in whose favor the land was advertised on 1st July, 1834, but at whose request it is now re-advertised for *John Wighton*. Quit-rent £5 6d. 8d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1830.

23. JOHN WIGHTON, 5, Five acres, *parish of Seaham*; commencing at the eastern extreme of the north boundary line of *Warren's* 2000 acres grant; and bounded on the south by the 3 chains of that line bearing west; on the west by a north line of 19 chains to *Williams' River*; on the north by *Williams' River* downwards; and on the east by the west boundary line of a surveyed portion of 25 acres of land, bearing south 16 chains 75 links to the eastern extreme of the

north boundary line of *Warren's* 2000 acres grant.

Promised by *General Darling*, on 23rd September, 1830, to *Alexander Warren*, in whose favor the land was advertised on 18th November, 1835, but at whose request it is now re-advertised for *John Wighton*. Quit-rent 10d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1831.

24. JAMES DODDS, 1070, One thousand and seventy acres, *parish of Auckland*; commencing at the south-west corner, and bounded on the south by a line bearing east 144 chains 40 links; on the east by a line bearing north 80 chains; on the north by a line bearing west 132 chains to *Hunter's River*; and on the west by that river to the south-west corner aforesaid.

Promised by *Sir Thomas Brisbane*, on 24th April, 1824. Quit-rent £7 17s. 6d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1833.

25. EDWARD ALLCORN, 60, Sixty acres, *parish of Vau*, at *Falbrook*, commencing at the south-east corner of *Donald Kennedy's* land, and bounded on the north by 16 chains of *Donald Kennedy's* south boundary-line bearing west; on the west by the east boundary line of *Duncan Kennedy's* land, bearing south 31 chains and 60 links to *Falbrook*; and on the south and east by *Falbrook*, to the south-east corner of *Donald Kennedy's* land aforesaid. The bearings are magnetic.

Promised on 31st March, 1821, by *Governor Macquarie*. Quit-rent 2s. sterling per annum; commencing 1st January, 1827.

26. JAMES MITCHELL, 2000, Two thousand acres, *parishes of Marwood and Sedgfield*, commencing at the south-east corner of *Robert Scott's* 2060 acres grant, and bounded on the west by a north line by compass of 289 chains; on the north by an east line by compass of 80 chains; on the east by a south line by compass of 250 chains to the *River Hunter*; and on the south by the *River Hunter*, to the south-east corner of *Scott's* land as aforesaid.

Promised on the 15th August, 1822, by *Sir Thomas Brisbane*. Quit-rent £2 sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1829.

27. JAMES MAC INTYRE, 1000, One thousand acres, *parish unnamed*, on *Glendon Brook*, near *Mirannie*, commencing at the north-west corner, and bounded on the north by a line bearing east by compass 125 chains; on the east by a south line by compass of 80 chains; on the south by a west line by compass of 125 chains; and on the west by a north line by compass of 80 chains, to the north-west corner aforesaid.

Promised by *Sir Thomas Brisbane* on 5th September, 1825, as a Reserve. Quit-rent £8 6s. 8d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1833.

HUNTER.

28. ABRAHAM POLACK, 500, Five hundred acres, *parish of Hunter* and *parish unnamed*, commencing on the north-east corner, and bounded on the north by a line bearing west 57 chains 50 links; on the west by a line bearing south 70 chains; on the south by a line bearing east 80 chains; and on the east by a line bearing north 43 chains 50 links, to *Hunter's River*; then by that river to the north-east corner aforesaid.

Promised by *Sir Thomas Brisbane* on 22nd

September, 1824, to James Greig, in whose favor the Deed was advertised on 10th February, 1836, but at whose request the Deed is now re-advertised for Mr. Polack. Quit-rent £3 15s. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1831.

MACQUARIE.

29. JAMES RALFE, 300, Three hundred acres, parish unnamed, adjoining the Township of Hay Reserve; bounded on the west by a line south 67 chains of the east boundary line of the Reserve for the Township of Hay, commencing at the River Hastings; on the south by a line east 32 chains; on the east by a line north 101 chains to the River Hastings; and on the north by that river.

Possession authorised for Charles Farrell by General Darling on 1st January, 1831, in lieu of the like quantity promised by Sir Thomas Brisbane, and the Deeds now advertised in favor of Mr. Ralfe, at the request of Mr. Farrell.

MURRAY.

30. JOHN TURLINGTON, 200, Two hundred acres, parish unnamed, at Tallaganda; bounded on the north by the Shoalhaven River, commencing at its confluence with Oroonmeir Creek; on the east by a line south 28 chains; on the south by a line west 59 chains; and on the west by Oroonmeir Creek.

Promised by General Darling on 19th August, 1828, and possession authorised on 20th February, 1829. Quit-rent one peppercorn, being in lieu of other land surrendered to Government.

31. WILLIAM BRADBURY, 1280, Twelve hundred and eighty acres, parish unnamed, at Duralla; bounded on the west by a line north 122 chains, commencing at a point of Duralla Creek, under a steep rocky mountain, whence flows a fine spring; on the north by a line east 80 chains; on the east by a line south 202 chains to Duralla Creek; and on the south by Duralla Creek to the point of commencement.

Promised to William Hilton Hovell on 8th March, 1828, by General Darling, in compensation for services in exploring the Interior to Western Port, and possession authorised on 1st July, 1829, at a peppercorn quit-rent, but the Grant now advertised for Mr. Bradbury, at Mr. Hovell's request.

NORTHUMBERLAND.

32. ANTHONY FINN, 320, Three hundred and twenty acres, parish of Branxton, at Anvil Creek, commencing at the southern extreme of the east boundary line of Samuel Marshall's fifty acres grant, and bounded on the west by that boundary line bearing north 29 chains; on the north by 59 chains of the south boundary line of the Church land bearing east; on the east by a south line of 29 chains to the high road; on the north-east by the high road easterly to the north boundary line of the Village Reserve; and on the south by 9 chains and 70 links of that boundary line bearing west from the road to Anvil Creek, and by Anvil Creek downwards to the southern extreme of the east boundary line of S. Marshall's fifty acres grant.

Promised to him on 1st July, 1830, by General Darling, for his zeal in capturing the bushrangers Dalton and Macnamara, and possession authorised on 1st October, 1830, free of quit-rent.

33. JOHN PAUL, 40, Forty acres, parish of Maitland, allotment No. 20, at Wallis' Plains, commencing at the south extreme of the east boundary line of allotment No. 19, and bounded

on the north by its south boundary line, bearing west 34 chains and 75 links; on the west by an occupation road 50 links wide, bearing south 5 degrees east 2 chains to the Fishery Creek; on the south-west by the Fishery Creek downwards to the western extreme of the north boundary line of Thomas Stubbs' additional grant; on the south by that boundary line bearing east 20 chains and 75 links; and on the east by 15 chains of the west boundary line of Mary Hunt's land, bearing north to the south extreme of the east boundary line of allotment No. 19, reserving a road of half a chain wide along the creek.

Promised by General Darling on 19th May, 1829, and possession authorised on 14th August, 1829, to Thomas Stubbs, at whose request the Grant is now advertised for Mr. Paul. Quit-rent 6s. 8d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1837.

34. JOHN PAUL, 20, Twenty acres, parish of Maitland, at Wallis Plains, commencing at the south extreme of the east boundary line of allotment No. 20, granted to Thomas Stubbs, and bounded on the north by its south boundary line bearing west 20 chains and 75 links to the fishery creek; on the south-west and south by the fishery Creek downwards to the south-west corner of Mary Hunt's land, and on the east by 15 chains and 25 links of the west boundary line of that land, bearing north to the south extreme of the east boundary line of allotment No. 20, reserving a road of half a chain wide along the Creek.

Promised by General Darling, on 18th May, and possession authorised on 16th June, 1830, to Thomas Stubbs, at whose request the grant is now advertised for Mr. Paul. Quit-rent 3s. 4d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1837.

ROXBURGH.

35. ALEXANDER KENNETH MACKENZIE, 235, Two hundred and thirty-five acres, parish of Melrose, part of section No. 4; bounded on the north by Bonnan Farm, east 80 chains; on the east by A. McKenzie's farm south 29 chains; on the south by William Cox's farm west 80 chains; and on the west by a reserve north 29 chains 80 links to the commencing point.

Promised by General Darling, 10th February, possession authorised 6th September, 1830, as an additional grant. Quit-rent £1 19s. 3d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1831.

36. SIR JOHN JAMISON, 1280, Twelve hundred and eighty acres, parish unnamed, at Capertee, bounded on the east by part of the western boundary of M. N. Campbell's land, commencing at a point on the Capertee River, and bearing south 83 chains; on the south by a line bearing west 80 chains; on the west by a line bearing north 171 chains to the Capertee River; and on the north by the Capertee River.

Promised by General Darling, on 28th September, 1830, and possession given on 31st March, to Dalmahoy Campbell, in whose favor the land was advertised on 18th November last, but at whose request it is now re-advertised for Sir John Jamison. Quit-rent £10 13s. 4d. sterling per annum, commencing on 1st January, 1839.
