HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bills, about to be brought under the consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,

ALEXANDER M'LEAY.

1. *A Bill to continue for a limited time, an Act intituled, "An Act to facilitate the apprehension of transported Felons and Offenders illegally at large, and of Persons found with arms, and suspected to be robbers."*

As the Act of the Governor and Council, 5 Gul. IV. No. 9., commonly called the Bushranging Act, will expire on the 31st August next, it is proposed to renew it for a further period of two years.

2. *A Bill further to continue for a limited time, an Act intituled, "An Act for regulating the constitution of Juries, and for the Trial of Issues in certain cases in the Supreme Court of New South Wales," and to make further provision for Trial by Jury.*

As the Act of the Governor and Council, 2 Gul. IV. No. 3, will expire on the 30th June next, it is proposed to renew it for a further period of one year, with a declaratory clause that persons of bad fame and repute, or of dishonest life or conduct, or of immoral character or repute, are disqualified from serving on Juries in any case, either civil or criminal.

3. *A Bill to continue for a limited time, an Act intituled, "An Act for the relief of Debtors in execution for debts which they are unable to pay."*

As the Act of the Governor and Council, 2 Gul. IV. No. 11, will expire on the 31st of August next, it is proposed to continue it for a further period of two years.

4. *A Bill to remove doubts as to the validity of Grants to Land in New South Wales.*

Doubts having arisen as to the validity of Grants to Land in New South Wales, in consequence of their having been issued in the name of the Governors and Lieutenant Governors of the Colony; instead of in the name of His Majesty, and the King having graciously signified his Royal pleasure through the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies that all Grants to Land so issued should be declared valid in law, it is proposed to quiet the titles of all persons holding or entitled to Lands so granted, by declaring such Grants to be as valid and effectual in law, and binding upon His Majesty, His Heirs, and Successors, as if such Grants had been issued in the name of His Majesty, or of either His Majesty's two last Royal Predecessors.

CAMDEN.

37. FREDERICK MAYE, 1280, Twelve hundred and eighty acres, parish unnamed; bounded on the north by the Wingecarribee river, commencing at its confluence with Black Bobs Creek; on the east by a line south 110 chains; on the south by a line west 112 chains; and on the west by Black Bobs Creek, to the confluence aforesaid.

Promised by Sir Ralph Darling on 5th January, 1830, and possession authorised 1st January, 1831, as a primary grant. Quit-rent £10 13s. 4d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1838.

38. JOHN THOMAS LEAHY, 1000, One thousand acres, parish unnamed, at *Wollongong*, primary grant, commencing at the north-west corner of Michael Carrol's one hundred acres; and bounded on the west partly by Blaxland's 1280 acres and vacant land, being a line north 134 chains; on the north by part of Spearing's 1000 acres additional grant, being a line east 80 chains; on the east by part of Spearing's 1000 acres, Thompson's and Drummond's farms, being a line south 134 chains; and on the south by Moran's and Carrol's farms, being a line west 80 chains to the north-west corner of Michael Carrol's 100 acres as aforesaid.

Promised by Sir Thomas Brisbane on the 2d September, 1825, to James Stares Spearing, at whose request the Deed is now advertised for Colonel Leahy. Quit-rent £8 6s. 8d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1833.

39. JOHN THOMAS LEAHY, 1000, One thousand acres, parish unnamed, at *Wollongong*; commencing at the north-west corner of J. S. Spearing's 1000 acres primary grant, and bounded on the west by a line north 66 chains; on the north by Buckland's 1920 acres, being a line east 121 chains, then by Martin's 60 acres, being a line south 40 chains; again on the north by Martin's 60 acres and part of Anderson's 200 acres, being a line east 39 chains; again on the east by part of C. T. Smith's 300 acres, being a line south 40 chains; and on part of the south by Thompson's farm, being a line west 80 chains, then by a line north 14 chains, forming part of the east boundary of Spearing's 1000 acres primary grant; again on the south by Spearing's said 1000 acres, being a line west 80 chains to the north-west corner of J. Spearing's said 1000 acres primary grant as aforesaid.

Promised by Sir T. Brisbane to James Stares Spearing on 2d September, 1825, as a reserve, and confirmed by Sir Ralph Darling, on 15th March, 1828, as an additional grant to the same party, at whose request the Deed is now advertised for Colonel Leahy. Quit-rent £8 6s. 8d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1829.

40. JOHN THOMAS LEAHY, 1920, One thousand nine hundred and twenty acres, parish unnamed, at *Wollongong*, commencing on the sea coast at the south-west corner of John Kelly's 50 acres, and bounded on part of the north by that farm, being a line west 46 chains; on part of the east by the farms of Kelly, Callaghan and Brennan, being a line north 40 chains; again on the north by a line west 40 chains; on part of the west by a line south 120 chains; on part of the south by the farms of J. and W. Underwood being a line east 40 chains; again on the west by the farms of W. Underwood and R. Anderson, being a line south 80 chains; again on the north by the farms of Anderson and Cunningham, being a line west 40 chains, again on the west by a line south 40 chains; again on the south by the farms of J. and R. Promised by Sir Ralph Darling 3d March, 1827, to Harriet Overington, now the wife of Mr. James Stares Spearing, and possession authorised as a primary grant on 29th September, 1827, but at whose request the Deed is now advertised for Colonel Leahy. Quit-rent £16 sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1835.

41. THE REV. JOHN DUNMORE LANG, D. D., 1,000, One thousand acres, parish unnamed, at *Sutton Forest*, commencing on Black Bob's Creek, at the south-east corner, and bounded on the east by Mr. Henderson's 2,000 acres, being a line north 185 chains; on the north by a line west 80 chains; on the west by a line south to Black Bob's Creek; and on the south by that creek to the south-east corner aforesaid.

Promised by Sir Thomas Brisbane on 2d February, 1824, to the late William Lang, father of Dr. Lang. Quit-rent £7 10s. sterling per annum, commencing 1 January, 1831.

42. JOHN DUNMORE LANG, 1,000, One thousand acres, parish unnamed, at *Bong Bong*, first portion containing six hundred and ninety-nine acres; bounded on the south by the road commencing where White's creek crosses it; on the west by the grants of Nicholson and Wells, north, 10 degrees west 56 chains, north 65 degrees east 15 chains and 50 links, and north 25 degrees west 27 chain; and on the north and north-east by White's creek to the aforesaid road; second portion containing three hundred and one acres; bounded on the north by the road; on the west by part of Norris' grant, south 26 degrees east 12 chains; on the south by a line north 64 degrees east 132 chains; and on the west by White's Creek.
