PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Major-General Sir Richard Bourke K. C. B. Captain General and Governor in Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS, by a Proclamation under my hand and seal, bearing date the First day of July, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, I did in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested in that behalf appoint and order that Courts of General Quarter Sessions should be holden at certain places and times as is therein set forth; And whereas it hath been represented to me the said Governor that it would be expedient for the Courts of General Quarter Sessions to be holden on other days than those fixed by the said Proclamation for holding the same respectively, Now therefore, I the said Governor, in pursuance of the said power and authority in me vested in that behalf, do direct and appoint that the Courts of General Quarter Sessions shall henceforth be holden at the several Towns and places and at the respective times hereinafter particularly mentioned, that is to say:—

At Sydney, on the First Monday in the respective Months of January, April, July, and October, in every Year.

At Campbelltown, on the First Monday in the respective Months of February, May, August, and November, in every Year.

At Parramatta, on the Second Monday in the respective Months of February, May, August, and November, in every Year.

At Windsor, on the Thursday next after the Second Monday in the respective Months of February, May, August, and November, in every Year.

At Bathurst, on the Fourth Monday in the respective Months of February, May, August, and November, in every Year.

At Maitland, on the Second Monday in the respective Months of March, June, September, and December, in every Year.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Major-General Sir Richard Bourke, K. C. B., commanding His Majesty's Forces, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the present Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for repealing so much of an Act intituled 'An Act to continue, until further provision shall be made, 'certain Duties, Tolls, Rates, Fees, and other sums of Money imposed by the Governors of 'New South Wales, and for other purposes as 'relates to the levying of Tolls in New South 'Wales, and for raising a Fund towards making, 'repairing, and upholding Public Roads, Bridges, 'and Ferries, and for regulating the collection 'of Tolls thereon;'"—It is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony for the time being, by any Proclamation or Proclamations under his hand, from time to time to appoint places at which Tolls shall be collected and to cause the same to be collected upon any line of road, which has been or shall be wholly or partly made, and which is repaired at the public expense; and to cause Toll to be collected at any Bridge built, purchased, or repaired at the public expense; and at any Ferry constructed or upheld at the same; and to cause such gates, bars, chains, rails, and fences to be built and set up, as shall be deemed necessary for preventing passengers, beasts, and carriages from passing, unless there shall be then

paid such Toll as shall be due or demandable under the authority of the said recited Act: And whereas by my Proclamation bearing date the Twentieth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, certain places were appointed for the collection of certain Tolls whereat they have been collected, and it has become necessary to appoint other places for that purpose, Now I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited Law or Ordinance, do by this my Proclamation appoint the following places in addition to those formerly named, at which Toll-Gates shall be established, and at which Tolls shall be collected to the amount and under the regulations, restrictions, and provisions of the said recited Ordinance;—that is to say,

There shall be a Toll-Gate—

1. On the road from Sydney to Parramatta, at the top of the hill at Grose Farm, where a new Toll-Gate has been erected, instead of at the former Sydney Toll-Gate near the Benevolent Asylum, which has been taken down and removed.
2. On the Old Botany Road at or near its junction with the road from Sydney to Parramatta, near the Benevolent Asylum.
3. On the Cook's River Road at or near its junction with the road from Sydney to Parramatta, near the Brisbane Distillery.

Of which several Toll-Gates all Persons concerned are hereby required to take due notice, according to the provisions of the said recited Law or Ordinance.

WHEREAS the enforcement of the Regulations contained in the Notice issued by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs on the 1st September last, in regard to the Transfer of Shares in Ships, has been found in some cases to be productive of inconvenience, the same have been rescinded, and in lieu thereof the following Regulations are henceforth to be observed.

That in all future Transfers of Ships, or Shares in Ships, each Party transferring will be required either to do so by a separate conveyance, or, where the Owners of Shares join in one conveyance, they

will be required to state what Share or Shares each of them conveys; and in the granting part, after the customary word "grant, bargain, sell, assign, and set over," the words "in the proportions above specified," shall likewise be inserted.

GOVERNMENT CONVICTS.

THE Twenty-sixth Section of the Assignment Regulations of 9th May, 1835, appearing to have been misunderstood, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be re-published, for general information, viz. :—

"26—Any Person who shall employ a Convict belonging to a Road Party, or otherwise in the service of Government, shall be immediately deprived of all his Assigned Servants, and considered ineligible as an Assignee in future."

His Excellency also directs it to be notified that no Person whatever, having charge of Prisoners of the Crown, in Government Employment, is authorised to permit such Prisoner to work in Private service, even during the time of cessation from his labor for Government; and that, after this Notice, such alleged permission will not be regarded as any plea for remission of the Penalty imposed by the 26th section of the Assignment Regulations above re-published.
