HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct the publication of the general objects of the following Bills about to be brought under the consideration of the Legislative Council.

By His Excellency's Command,

ALEXANDER M'LEAY.

1. "*A Bill to prevent Clandestine Marriages, and to provide for the issuing of Licenses.*"

IN order to prevent Clandestine Marriages of Minors, it is proposed that no marriage shall be solemnized where either of the parties, not being a widower or widow, shall be under the age of twenty-one years, without the consent of the parents or guardians.

Persons knowingly and wilfully solemnizing matrimony between persons, one or both of whom shall be minors, without such consent, to be deemed guilty of felony, provided prosecution shall be commenced within three years.

Marriages, by reason of contract, not to be compelled by suit in any Ecclesiastical Court.

Before Licenses for marriages in such cases as the banns shall be dispensed with shall be granted, one of the parties to swear before the Surrogate, or other person having authority to grant the same, that there is no impediment of kindred or alliance, or of any other lawful cause, to prevent such marriage, or if either party be under age, that the consent of the parents or guardians has been obtained.

Marriages to be solemnized in the presence of two or more witnesses besides the Minister, and after celebration to be certified as is now by law directed.

Not to apply to the marriages of Quakers or Jews.

2. "*A Bill for better regulating the keeping and carriage of Gunpowder.*"

The Act of 9th George IV, No. 7, to be repealed.

From and after the passing of this Act, all Persons importing Gunpowder into this Colony, shall, immediately on its arrival, report the same at the Custom House, and also to the Ordnance Storekeeper for the time-being.

Permits to be granted to such Importers or Proprietors to deposit the same in one of the Government Magazines, and the same to be entered in a Book to be kept for that purpose by the Ordnance Storekeeper.

When any Sale or Transfer of any Gunpowder so deposited shall take place, the same shall be reported to the Ordnance Storekeeper, that the same may be duly registered; in failure of which the Ordnance Storekeeper to refuse to deliver the same.

Gunpowder so permitted to be deposited to be removed only between the hours of eight o'clock in the forenoon, and five o'clock in the afternoon, from the ship or vessel in which the same may be imported, direct to the Magazine.

No package to contain more than 100lbs., and all packages to be well secured.

The removal to be at the expense of the Importer or Proprietor.

Ordnance Storekeeper to deliver the whole or part of Gunpowder so deposited on application to him made, and on payment of Storage Rent and other expenses.

Rates of Storage Rent to be fixed.

Penalties to be inflicted for landing Gunpowder contrary to the Provisions of this Act.

Amount of Rent how to be applied.

On the oath of one Person of Gunpowder being kept contrary to this Act, any Justice may issue a search warrant.

Penalties recoverable before two Justices by distress, half the Penalty to be given to the Informer.

This Act not to extend to Gunpowder belonging to the King.

3. "*A Bill for Regulating Buildings and Party Walls; and for preventing mischiefs by Fire within the Town of Sydney.*"

It is proposed to adopt the Regulations in respect to Buildings and Party Walls, and the prevention of mischiefs by Fire, contained in the Act of the British Parliament 14 Geo. III c. 78, commonly called the London Building Act, so far as the same may be applicable to the Town of Sydney.

Buildings to be divided into six different rates.

Regulations as to the external and Party Walls and Chimnies, as well as with respect to the District Surveyors to be the same as provided in the above-mentioned Act of Parliament.

No Bow Windows to be built extending beyond the line of Street, except projections for decorations, shop windows, and stall-boards.

No stack of Warehouses to be above thirty-five squares, including internal and external walls.

No Stables to contain more than twenty-five squares of building, including internal and external walls.

No funnel or pipe for the conveyance of smoke or steam shall be fixed next any public street.

Every building contrary to the Act declared to be a common nuisance; and the builder and owner to enter into a recognizance to demolish the same.

If owners neglect to take down ruinous houses after notice, the magistrates in Petty Sessions upon information on oath, to order the same to be taken down or secured.

Not more than ten gallons of turpentine to be distilled together, or of oil and turpentine to be boiled together at once in houses contiguous to others. Not to prevent Shipwrights from boiling or mixing oil and other materials for paying Ships or Vessels.

Fire Engines and Ladders to be kept in known places, and firecocks to be fixed on the Mains.

Penalty for Chimnies being allowed to take Fire.

Money insured on houses burnt down to be laid out, if required, for re-building the same.

Free servants by carelessness firing a house, to be liable to a pecuniary penalty.

Constables to repair to buildings on fire to render all necessary assistance.

Appeal to be made to the Quarter Sessions, from decisions by Justices under the Act.
