**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct the publication of the general objects of the following Bill about to be brought under the consideration of the Legislative Council.

By His Excellency's Command,  
ALEXANDER M'LEAY.

"An Act for adopting certain Acts of Parliament passed in the third and fourth years of the Reign of His Present Majesty King William the Fourth, in the administration of Justice in New South Wales, in like manner as other Laws of England are applied therein."

"An Act for the amendment of the Law relating to Dower."

And also,

"An Act for the amendment of the Law of Inheritance," to be adopted in New South Wales.

Act not to take effect before the 1st January, 1837, nor to extend to any descent before said day, and also limitations made before the 1st January, 1837, to the heirs of a person then living, shall take effect as if the Act had not been made.
