PASTURAGE LICENSES.

IN Reference to the Act of the GOVERNOR and Council, 7th William IV, No. 4, For restraining the unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands, and to the Regulation consequent upon it, dated the 1st October, 1836; His Excellency the GOVERNOR, has been pleased to direct that the following list, obtained from the Colonial Treasurer, of Persons who have taken out Licenses for Depasturing Crown Lands situated beyond the boundaries of location, upon the payment of the established fee, be published for general information, and as a guide to the Commissioners appointed to carry the Regulations in question into effect.

12. Contractors supplying Road Parties on the Bathurst or other Roads similarly situated, are required to have at all times on the spot a supply for fourteen days in reserve, in the care of a competent Agent to whom reference may be had in the Contractors' absence.

13.
