CHARITABLE INSTITUTIONS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that applications for pecuniary aid from the Colonial Treasury for the support of Dispensaries, Schools, or other Charitable Institutions established by Societies or Individuals, and unconnected with the local Government, are to be addressed to the Colonial Secretary, and delivered at his Office in Sydney, on or before the 31st of May next.

All such applications are to be made by the trustees, committee, treasurer, or other person or persons managing the affairs of the Institution, and are to contain a brief account of the objects for which it has been established, and of the service it has rendered to the public in the past year, with the names of the persons forming the society. The application is to be accompanied by a statement of the funds of the Institution, shewing the amount received in the last year by private contributions, or from public bodies, the amount and general particulars of expenditure during the same period, and the balance actually in hand, on the 1st day of January of the present year, together with a statement of any debts then chargeable against the Institution.

The statement of accounts is to be verified by a declaration from the treasurer or manager of the funds of the Institution in the following form :—

"I do hereby declare and certify, that to the best of my knowledge and belief, the foregoing account is a true and bona fide statement of the whole funds, receipts, and expenditure of the during the year 183 , and of the balance in hand, and the debts of the Institution, upon the 1st of January, 1837. COURT OF CLAIMS.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the following CLAIMS for DEEDS of GRANT of Lands and Town Allotments will be ready for Examination by the Commissioners appointed for that purpose, under the Act of Council 5, William IV. No. 21, at the expiration of two months from this date, before which day any Caveat or counter Claim must be entered at this Office. Due notice will be given of the days appointed for the hearing.

Case No. 83.—JOHN MOAT WRIGHT, of Parramatta, Tanner, Two roods, seven perches and a half, County of Cumberland, parish of St. John, Town of Parramatta, allotments Nos. 6 and 7, and part of No. 5, in section No. 7, commencing at the south-east corner of C. Jackson's allotment; bounded on the south by Aird's-street, bearing east five degrees, south two chains, twenty-two and a half links; on the east by a line north eight degrees, east two chains, thirty-four links; on the north by a line west seven degrees, north two chains, twenty-seven and a half links; and on the west by a line south eight degrees, west two chains thirty-five links.

These Allotments, No. 5, 6, and 7, were charted to Samuel Larkin, and in the Gazette of 14th January, 1832, a consolidated description thereof

was advertised with a view to the preparation of the Deed of Grant in Larkins' name, who claims it is alleged as having purchased from Robert Bateman, Patrick Farrell, and Alexander Burton. A part of No. 5 has been sold to Mrs. Mitchell, and the remainder was sold by the Sheriff at the suit of Mary Brown against Larkin, and purchased by John Lacy, who sold to claimant. By memorial No. 868, these allotments were claimed for the children of Larkins, and Robertson is therein set forth as the locatee instead of Bateman.

Case No. 84.—JAMES FOULCHER, of Parramatta, Dealer, opposed by Roger Connor, of Wilberforce, One hundred acres, County of Cumberland, and parish of South Colah; bounded on the south by a line west twenty chains, commencing seventeen chains north of Berry and Wolstonecraft's south-west corner; on the west by a line north fifty chains; on the north by a line east twenty chains; and on the east by a line south fifty chains.

This land was promised on the 7th July, 1824, by Governor Brisbane to Michael Connor, deceased, and advertised with a view to the preparation of the Deed of Grant in his name in the Gazette of 15th October, 1831. Connor sold, it is alleged, to the claimant Foulcher. Roger Connor claims as eldest son and heir.

Case No. 85.—PETER M'INTYRE, of Hunter's River, Gentleman, Six hundred acres, County of Brisbane, parish of Gundy Gundy; bounded on the north by a line west sixty chains, fifty links, commencing on Page's River, at White's north-west corner pin; on the west by a line south eighty chains; on the south by a line east forty-eight chains to Page's River; and on the east by that River.

This land was promised to John Stewart, deceased, on two several orders for 500 and 100 acres, dated respectively 16th June, 1824, and 23rd May, 1825. It was sold by Auction, as it is alleged, to Mr. J. Macalister, deceased, who sold to claimant.

Case No. 86.—JOHN THORN, of Parramatta, Gentleman, Thirty-four perches, County of Cumberland, parish of Saint John, Town of Parramatta, allotment numbered 96, in section No. 20; bounded on the west by a line two chains, seventy-four links; on the north by a line one chain sixteen links; on the east by a line to the north boundary of No. 95 George-street, forty-nine links; thence by that boundary forty-six links; and by a line to George-street two chains; and on the south by that street eighty-five links.

This allotment was leased by Sir Thomas Brisbane for 21 years, to Mary Mackenzie, deceased, John Beeson administered to her effects and took possession of this allotment, and sold it as alleged to claimant.

Case No. 87.—SARAH BAINES, of Windsor, Dress-maker, One acre and thirty-six perches, County of Cumberland, parish of Ham Common, Town of Richmond, allotment No. 5, of section No. 13; bounded south-westerly by a line commencing at the south-east corner of allotment No. 3, of section No. 13, bearing east twenty degrees, south two chains and fifty links, dividing it from Lennox-street south-easterly by a line north twenty-six degrees east, four chains thirty-six links; north-easterly by a line west twenty de-

grees, north three chains, twenty links; and north-westerly by a line south eighteen degrees, west four chains twenty-eight links.

This allotment was located to Robert Westmore, who sold, it is alleged, to one Robert Ireland, senior, who by will devised to his son, Robert Ireland, junior, who sold to Samuel Senior, who sold to claimant.

Case No. 88.—AARON ZADOCK, of Illawarra, Settler, Twelve hundred acres, County of Durham, parish of Auckland, and parish unnamed, at Falbrook, commencing at the north-west corner of Glennie's farm on Falbrook, and bounded on the south by an east line by compass of two hundred and thirteen chains; on the east by a north line of eighty chains; on the north by a west line of thirty-eight chains to Falbrook; and on the north-west and west by that brook to the north-west corner of Glennie's farm as aforesaid.

This land was promised by Sir Thomas Brisbane on the 29th July, 1824, to Thomas Clarkson, deceased, who it is alleged transferred it to claimant.

Case No. 89.—ANNE ONUS, of Richmond, widow, Four acres, in the County of Cumberland, parish of Ham Common, Town of Richmond, allotment No. 2, of section No. 4; bounded on the north-east by a line commencing at the eastern corner of allotment No. 1, and dividing it from Frances-street, bearing east seventeen and a half degrees, south five chains and two links; on the south-east by a line south nineteen degrees, west eight chains and eight links; on the south-west by a line dividing it from Windsor-street, bearing west nineteen degrees, north five chains; and on the north-west by a line north nineteen degrees, east eight chains.

This allotment was originally located to Edward Powell, who sold, it is alleged, to Joseph Onus, deceased, and Mrs. Onus now claims as his widow.

Case No. 90.—JAMES WRIGHT, Gentleman, One thousand, one hundred, and seventy acres, be the same, more or less, in the County of Murray, parish unnamed, at Juggalite, Isabella Plains; bounded on the north by a line east one hundred and seventy-two chains, commencing at the south-west corner of a measured portion of land containing 740 acres; on the east by a line south eighty chains, to the north-east corner of a measured portion of land containing 940 acres; on the south by the northern boundary of that portion being a line west one hundred and twenty chains to the Murrumbidgee River; and on the west by the Murrumbidgee River, being the land sold as lot 52, in pursuance of the advertisement of 5th April, 1836.

This land was purchased from the Crown at Auction, and paid for by William Wright, deceased, whose death took place prior to the execution of the Deed of Grant. James Wright claims as devisee and heir at law, being deceased's brother.

Case No. 91.—ANNE ONUS, of Richmond, widow, One acre and twelve perches, in the County of Cumberland, parish of Ham Common, Town of Richmond, allotment No. 11, of section No. 1; bounded on the north-east by a line commencing at the northern corner of allotment No. 10, and dividing it from Frances-street, bearing west nineteen degrees, north two chains and fifty-five links; on the north-west by a line south nineteen degrees, west four chains

and twelve links; on the south-west by a line east twenty degrees, south two chains and fifty links; and on the south-east by a line north nineteen degrees, east four chains and nineteen links.

This allotment is part of that located according to the original map to Hugh Devlin. It is at present charted to James King, deceased, to whom it was subsequently located, and who bequeathed, it is alleged, to Edward Cox, Esq., who sold to Joseph Onus, deceased, and Mrs. Onus now claims as his widow.

Case No. 92.—THOMAS RAINE, Esq., of Bathurst, Settler, Eighty acres, in the County of Bathurst, parish of Bathurst, at Queen Charlotte's Vale; bounded on the north by George Blackman's farm, west forty-seven chains from Queen Charlotte's Creek, commencing on Queen Charlotte's Creek at the eastern extremity of George Blackman's southern boundary; on the west by a line south seventeen chains; on the south by a line east fifty-two chains to the Creek; and on the east by the said Queen Charlotte's Creek to the eastern extremity of Blackman's southern boundary aforesaid.

This land was promised by Governor Darling on the 14th June, 1831, to Henry Hawkins Bowling, who sold, it is alleged, to claimant, Bowling has left the Colony.
