Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

IN meeting you at the usual time of the year for the dispatch of public business, I will briefly advert to a few of the most important topics which I propose to bring under your consideration.

One of the principal subjects to which I would claim your attention, and upon which I require your advice, results for the most part from the unexampled prosperity with which it has pleased Providence to bless this land. The flourishing state of the Revenue, and the large profits derived from pastoral and commercial pursuits, have placed in the public Treasury and in the hands of individuals, a vast amount of capital, which demands an increased supply of labor for its advantageous employment. Measures have accordingly been devised, and are now in progress, to procure or aid the introduction into the Colony of useful laborers of various descriptions. Some of these have already arrived, and more are immediately expected under the existing arrangement; but the supply is so far below the demand as to render necessary some further expedients for obtaining a nearer approximation to the desired amount. Amongst other projects it has been proposed to this Government to introduce the Hill Laborers of India, whose readiness to emigrate on reasonable terms, and whose general utility, have been proved in their transfer to other countries. Some Papers in illustration of these facts will be laid on the Table. The Plan is however open to objections which it will be proper to discuss before it be finally adopted. I propose therefore to appoint a Committee of the Council to consider the scheme and report their opinion. To this Committee will also be referred the communications which have taken place between His Majesty's Ministers and this Government, resulting from the Report on Immigration of the Committee of 1835.

Notwithstanding the deficiency of labor to which the Sale of I have referred, I am enabled to state that considerable progress has been made in some of the most important public works since the last meeting of the Council, and I have reason to expect that by the end of this year, several Buildings of a

permanent character, and on a large scale, will be available to the public service, whilst considerable improvements have been made in the Streets of Sydney and on some of the principal roads in the interior. Trusting that by the operation of the measures adopted, or to be adopted for procuring the introduction of Emigrant Mechanics and Laborers, means will be found for returning to the Colony with profit the Revenues which have been for some time accumulating in the Treasury, I do not intend to propose to you at this juncture any less satisfactory remedy for an admitted evil; the retention without fructification of large sums in the public coffers. The many works of great expense which are still required for general security and convenience, for facilitating commerce and improving internal communications, demand the application of large sums of money which cannot be raised upon easier terms than under the existing system. Nor have the sums thus accumulated remained wholly useless to the public. The Government by reason of its surplus Revenue has been enabled to leave large balances in the Banks at a moderate rate of interest, and thus more ample means are afforded to those useful Establishments for encouraging and supporting the enterprizes of individuals, which, when controlled by prudence. and conducted with skill, are beneficial not only to the projectors, but to the whole community.

After I had last the honor of addressing you, I received His Majesty's Gracious permission to open for location the Country adjacent to the Waters of Port Phillip, and in the vicinity of Two-fold Bay. The former of these Districts already contains a population of above 500 Souls, whilst more than 100,000 Sheep may be found grazing on its ample pastures. The expenses attending this occupation have been hitherto defrayed from the Revenues of Crown Lands, to which the Sale of such Lands within the District will hereafter largely contribute. Copies of the communications which have passed between His Majesty's Ministers and this Government on the subject of these locations, are laid on the Table for

Government Gazette that An Act renewing for one year the Act 9 Geo. 4, Cap. 83, which institutes and upholds the Legislature of this Colony, passed the Imperial Parliament in the last Session. It had been the intention of His Majesty's Ministers to propose to parliament in that Session a New Bill for the future Government of New South Wales, but circumstances which had not been anticipated induced them to postpone it for another year. In announcing this delay, the Secretary of State has assured me of his intention to introduce at an early period of this Session, a Bill framed upon such principles as upon the fullest consideration of the circumstances of the Colony, shall appear to the King's Ministers best calculated to promote the important interests involved in the

In consequence of the postponement of the intended New Act for the Colory, I have to lay before you a Bill for continuing the Jury Act of

last year to the 30th June, 1838.

I have directed the Abstracts of Revenue and Expenditure for the past year to be laid before you.

The Estimates for the ensuing year will be presented in the next month.

Gentlemen, it has been often and truly observed that the happiest ages of the world afford the scantiest materials for the Historian. Nor is it otherwise with the Annual Review of Colonial Affairs which I am accustomed to lay before you. It is not easy to vary the terms in which it is my privilege again and again to congratulate you upon uniform tranquillity and rapidly increasing prosperity. Upon the present occasion I may be content to state that great as was the Revenue of 1835, it has been surpassed by that of 1836, whilst its collection has been accomplished without injury or even inconvenience to the People-That the Exports and Imports for the latter surpass considerably those of the former period, and that there is every indication of a continuance of that success with which the enterprize and industry of the Colonists have under Providence been hitherto rewarded.

This land was promised on the 31st March, 1821, by Governor Macquarie to Edward Field, Senior, now deceased, the father of the claimant. Edward Field, Junior, claims not only as having purchased from his futher in his life-time, but . likewise as devi**s**ce.

Case No. 95 .- EDWARD FIELD, Junior, of Penrith, Fifty acres, in the County of Cook, parish unnamed, at the Vale of Clwyd; bounded on the west side by a line north 11 chains; on the north by a line east 47 chains; on the east side by part of R. Martin's, Senior, farm, being a line south 11 chains; and on the south side by Edward Field's farm, being a line east 47 chains.

This land was promised on the 9th March, 1825, by Governor Sir Thomas Brisbane to James Porchmoth, deceased; from whom, it is alleged, claimant purchased.

Case No. 96.—Alexander Berry, Esq., M. Case No. 97 .- JOANNA LYSAUGHT, of Illawarra, Widow, Sixty acres, in the County of Camden, parish unnamed, District of Illawarra; bounded on the south by a line bearing west 15 chains; on the west by a line bearing north 40 chains; on the north by a line bearing east 15 chains; and on the east by a line bearing south 40 chains.

This land was promised by Governor Macquarie on the 8th March, 1821, to Thomas Martin, junior, and was claimed by Patrick Lysaught by memorial, No. 944, under the first Commission, and a Deed of Grant was prepared in his favour; but previous to the date thereof, Lysaught died. His widow claims on behalf of herself and four children-Ellen, Jane Elizabeth, Andrew, and Mary.

Case No. 98.—James Richard Styles, Four hundred acres, in the County of Argyle, parish of Bungoma; bounded on the east side by part of Reid's farm, bearing south 80 chains; on the south by a line west 52 chains to Futter's southeast corner; on the west by part of Futter's farm, bearing north 89 chains; and on the north by a line east 52 chains.

This land was promised by Governor Macquarie, 100 acres, on the 31st March, 1821, and 300 acres on the 31st October, 1821, to Joseph Inch, deceased, who, it is alleged, devised to his widow,

Case No. 99.—Thomas Kane, on behalf of combe's farm; bearing north 90 chains, and west James Thomas and Mary M'Kenna, of Glenharty, in Van Diemen's Land, in opposition to Mary Kempton, now Mrs. Bones, Five perches, in the County of Cumberland, Town of Sydney, and parish of St. Andrew, allotment No. 13, of section No. 23; bounded on the east by No. 12 allotment, bearing north 15 degrees 30 minutes west 72 links; on the north by Market-street, bearing west 16 degrees 30 minutes south 42 links; on the west by No. 14 allotment, bearing south 15 degrees 30 minutes east 75 links; and on the south by Nos. 15 and 11 allotments, bearing east 22 degrees 30 minutes north 43 links.

This Allotment was advertised by the Colonial Secretary, in the Gazette of June 4th, 1884, page 348, with a view to the preparation of the Deed of Grant, in the name of Mary Kempton. It is alleged, that M'Kenna, the father of the claimants, purchased from one Cassidy, a soldier, all the land between Clarence and Kentstreets, of which the allotment in question forms part. Deeds of Grant of other portions have already been prepared in the names of other claimants.

Case No. 100 .- Ann Onus, of Richmond, widow, Two roods and three perches, in the County of Cumberland, parish of Ham Common, town of Richmond, allotment No. 9, of section No. 1; bounded on the north-east by a line commencing at the northern corner of allotment No. 8, and dividing it from Francis-street west, 19 degrees north I chain and 67 links; on the north-west by a line south 19 degrees west 4 chains 19 links; on the south-west by a line east 19 degrees south 1 chain and 67 links; and on the south-east by a line north 19 degrees east 4 chains and 18 links.

This allotment is a portion of a larger allotment originally numbered '0, and located to Isaac Cornwall. It appears, however, to have been subsequently located to one Andrew North, by Mr. Cox, and North, it is alleged, sold to Jeremiah Hills, who sold to Joseph Ones, deceased.

Case No. 101 .- ANN ONUS, of Richmond, widow, One acre and Ten perches, in the County of Cumberland, parish of Ham Common, town of Richmond, allotment No. 1, of section No. 1; bounded on the north-west by a line commencing at the west corner of allotment No. 12, and dividing it from Chapel-street, bearing south 181 degrees west 4 chains and 10 links; on the south-west by a line dividing it from Windsor-street, bearing east 20 degrees south 2 chains and 59 links; on the south-east by a line north 19 degrees east 4 chains 10 links; and on the northeast by a line west 20 degrees north 2 chains and 62 links.

This allotment is a portion of a large allotment originally numbered 17, and located to David Bell. It appears, however, to have been subsequently possessed by Mr. Cox, now deceased, who sold to James King, also deceased, who devised to Mr. Edward Cox, who sold to Joseph Onus, deceased. In the Surveyor-General's Office this allotment is charted to Hathaway.

Case No. 102. George Campbell Cur-LEWIS, of Krarwarree, in the County of Murray, Gentleman, Five hundred aces, in the County of Argyle, parish unnamed, at Mullengullengong; bounded on the east and north sides by Bal-No. 279. June 7, 1837.

60, commencing at the Jacqua Creek; on the west by a line south, 113 chains 50 links, to the Jacqua Creek; and on the south by that Creek.

The order for this land was in favor of James Birnie, and was given by Governor Macquarie on the 4th January, 1819. It appears, however, that on the 21st February, 1821, it was made over to Richard Jones and William Wemys, in trust, for Mrs. Martha Matilda Birnie, wife of the said James Birnie, who, it is alleged, has sold it to claimant. The land is charted to Mrs. Birnie in the Surveyor-General's Office.

Case No. 103 .- JANE BENNET, of Parramatta, widow, Twenty-six and a half perches, in the County of Cumberland, parish of St. John, town of Parramatta, allotment No. 46, in section No. 25; bounded on the west by a line I chain 64 links; on the north by a line I chain; on the east by a line 1 chain 62 links to Philip-street; and on the south by that street 97 links.

This allotment was leased by Sir Thomas Brisbane to Edward Fullers, for twenty-one years, from the 30th June, 1823. The husband of Claimant, William Bennet, is deceased. It does not appear whether the allotment in question was purchased by Claimant, or by her late husband. It has passed through several hands.
