This land was promised by Governor Macquarie on the 8th March, 1821, to Thomas Martin, junior, and was claimed by Patrick Lysaught by memorial No. 944, under the first Commission, and a Deed of Grant was prepared in his favour; but previous to the date thereof, Lysaught died. His widow claims on behalf of herself and four children-Ellen, Jane Elizabeth, Andrew, and Mary.
