IMMIGRATION.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is desirous of drawing the attention of the Colonists to the Government Notice of the 25th September, 1837, offering bounties on the introduction of Agricultural Laborers and Mechanics, and of Domestic Servants, in consequence of an intimation received from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that it is the intention of Her Majesty's Government to discontinue at the earliest possible period, the assignment of Convicts to private service; and His Excellency is instructed to point out to the Settlers generally, the expediency of their looking for the future to Immigration rather than to assignment, as the source from which they may obtain the requisite labor for the cultivation of their lands, and for other purposes.
