THE following Address was presented to His EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR, at Government House, Sydney, on Wednesday, the 14th instant, viz:—

To Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, &c. &c.

May it please Your Excellency,

We, the undersigned, Members of Council, Civil Officers, Magistrates, Clergy, Landholders, Merchants, and other Colonists of New South Wales, beg to approach Your Excellency upon your arrival with your family at the seat of your government, with the renewed assurance of our devoted loyalty to our Most Gracious Sovereign Queen VICTORIA, and with our sincere congratulations upon Your Excellency's appointment to be Governor of this Colony. As the first Representative appointed over us by Her Majesty, entering also upon the high and responsible duties thus delegated to you, at the commencement of the second half century from the foundation of the Colony, Your Excellency's accession to the government cannot but form a memorable epoch in its history. We trust that this epoch will be in every way auspicious, and become yet more memorable by the continued and progressive improvement in the whole system of our government, by the general amelioration of the society, the development of increasing resources, moral as well as physical, the maintenance of our true interests, and by the secure establishment in this remote portion of the empire of those sound principles of religion, morality, and rational liberty, which are the national attributes and glory of Britain. That such may be the happy results, under the blessing of Divine Providence, of Your Excellency's Administration, is our united and fervent prayer.

To which His EXCELLENCY was pleased to return the following reply:—

GENTLEMEN,—

I beg to return my warmest thanks for the honor you have conferred upon me by the pre-

sentation of this Address, and for the kind congratulations on my arrival amongst you, tendered in it, from so large a number of gentlemen possessing wealth and influence in this Colony.

I have not, Gentlemen, entered upon the performance of my duties, without what is, I trust, a due knowledge of their importance, or without a deep sense of the anxious care, punctuality, and energy, which will be required of me, in conducting the affairs of this country.

I feel also, Gentlemen, that in succeeding to a man, eminently endowed with all the qualities requisite for government, I am in a position where I can gain no benefit from comparison, though I may labour under the greatest disadvantages from contrast.

I embark nevertheless, Gentlemen, in the undertaking with alacrity and confidence, because I feel deeply within me the conviction, that I have no other objects in view, than to do my duty to my Sovereign, and to promote the welfare of this Territory—objects which are so indissolubly united as to form one common purpose.

Being deeply impressed with the opinion that morality and religion are the true grounds on which rational liberty and all good institutions are founded, I look to you, Gentlemen, and to the Colonists generally, for support and assistance, in maintaining and promoting these all important interests.

I beg you again to accept my sincere thanks for the honor you have conferred upon me, and I trust you will convey to all who may have participated in this Address, a knowledge of the gratitude which it has awakened.

THE following Address was presented to His EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR, at Government-house, Sydney, on Friday, the 16th instant, viz.—

To His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Governor of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.



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May it please Your Excellency,

We, the Magistrates, Landholders, and other Inhabitants of the District of Maitland, beg leave to congratulate Your Excellency upon your safe arrival in this Colony.

Summoned to your exalted office through no courtly favor, but from the reputation of high talent exhibited under trying and difficult circumstances in various parts of the western world, we feel assured that the same mind will direct the government of this distant land with the same ability, prudence, and sagacity.

We beg leave further to express our satisfaction that Her Majesty has selected the Governor of this Colony from the ranks of civil life. We are aware that in youth Your Excellency embraced the brilliant profession of arms, but having shewn at the conclusion of the war, like the distinguished characters of classic times, that defending one's country in the hour of danger does not preclude the study of the arts of peace; we rejoice that Your Excellency, withdrawing from the din of camps, mingled in social intercourse with your fellow citizens at home, and will not therefore bring into the debatable field of State policy, that finalterable adherence to a first impression and that intolerance of opposition, which often disqualifies the mere soldier for civil government, however estimable he may be in private life, and though loaded with titles and the glittering trophies of glorious war.

We trust that your Excellency will, at no distant period, honor with your presence the District of the Hunter, and satisfy yourself by actual observation, that this portion of the Colony is in a state of great tranquillity and extraordinary advancement. As respects the former we may state that, at the Quarter Sessions held this day, there are but eight cases for trial (including both bond and free), and a daily communication with Sydney by steam, bears ample testimony to the latter.

We shall confidently look to Your Excellency for support and countenance in all measures calculated to promote morality and religion in this town and neighbourhood. Christians here, of all denominations, seem suddenly alive to the interests of their respective Churches, and it is to be hoped, that, under Your Excellency's fostering care the District of Maitland will soon be as much distinguished for its Churches and Seminaries, as it already is for the fertility of its soil and the amount of its pastoral and agricultural produce.

That Your Excellency may long enjoy health and happiness, and return in safety to your native land, after a period of years successfully spent in promoting the interests of this Colony, and your own enduring renown, is the earnest prayer of the undersigned.

HIS EXCELLENCY'S REPLY.

GENTLEMEN,—

I feel truly obliged to you, for this mark of kindness and attention, and I only regret that I am forced to receive it in this house, instead of in the midst of all those who have so promptly

stepped forward, in the flourishing District of Maitland, to welcome me to their country. As soon, however, as the business, which now presses hard upon me, shall be disposed of, I hope to see you in your own homes, and to enjoy a near view of those rapid improvements of which I have now only a knowledge by report.

For the very flattering expressions which you have addressed to me personally I cannot adequately thank you; it is quite true, Gentlemen, that for whatever success may have attended me in this world, I am indebted solely to the habits of business which I acquired in early life, and to the assiduity with which I have endeavoured to discharge my duties in the successive stations to which I have been advanced. I trust, Gentlemen, I shall not, in your land, forfeit the humble reputation that I may have gained in this respect, in a far distant one.

I am gratified beyond measure in learning from you that the District of the Hunter, is marked no less by its present state of tranquillity, and by the decrease of crime, than by its advancement in cultivation and wealth. This, Gentlemen, is of the greater importance, as the questions now pending respecting this Colony are, I can assure you, regarded in England solely as great moral ones; England, indeed, admires the rapid progress that you have made in the short space of fifty years in wealth and importance, but still it deserves, I think, to be recorded, that she is more bent upon raising up in these beautiful regions a moral, a religious, and an enlightened population, worthy at no distant date, of her own free institutions, than upon adding to the extent of her dominion and empire.

I have to request you to convey to all those who have signed this Address, the expression of my warmest thanks, and in the hope that it may not be long before we meet again, I now say, Gentlemen, respectfully to you, farewell.

The increasing business of Government must, I apprehend, render it necessary for me to pass a larger portion of my time in Sydney than has been customary with any of my predecessors; nevertheless I trust, Gentlemen, that early opportunities will be afforded me of becoming better acquainted with you all; and I look forward with pleasure to the occasional enjoyment of your society, when I may, for the purposes of health or recreation, be able to escape from the din and bustle of the Capital.

It is most gratifying, Gentlemen, to me to find that the most ardent feelings of love and loyalty to the person of our youthful Queen universally pervade this prosperous Colony; that they may long continue to animate all breasts is my most fervent prayer.

Gentlemen, for the present I have the honor to say—Farewell! but it is not without the hope that we shall shortly meet again.

COURT OF CLAIMS.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the following CLAIMS for DEEDS of GRANT of LAND and TOWN ALLOTMENTS will be ready for the examination of the Commissioners appointed for that purpose, under the Act of Council 5th William IV., No. 21, at the expiration of two months from this date, before which day any Caveat or Counter-claim must be entered at this Office. Due notice will be given of the days appointed for the hearings.

Case No. 220—WILLIAM and GEORGE BLACKWELL, of

One acre and two perches, in the County of Cumberland, and parish of St. Luke's, near Liverpool, situate at the Brickfields lying between the Creek, Smith's land, Crown land, and the street leading to Bull's Hill.

A Deed of Grant of this allotment was claimed by John Roby Hatfield under the first Act, by Memorial No. 923, to the Commissioners, who decided in favour of his claim. Pending the investigation he sold to Claimants, and the Commissioners recommended that the Deed should issue to Claimants; but on the Surveyor General proceeding to measure, he found that the allotment formed part of the Common, and that Hatfield had no other claim than having had some tan-pits there.

Case No. 221—WILLIAM HOWARD GREENWAY, of the parish of Alnwick, Hunter River.

Eight hundred acres, in the County of Northumberland, parish of Alnwick; bounded on the north by Field's farm, bearing west to the south-west corner of said Field's farm; on the west by a line bearing south 80 chains; on the south by Spark's farm, bearing east to Hunter's River; and on the east by that River.

This land was located on an Order by Governor Macquarie, dated 30th November, 1821, in favour of Francis Howard Greenway, deceased. Claimant alleges that he is his eldest son, and moreover, holds the land by Deed of Gift from his Father.

Case No. 222—WILLIAM LEWTHWAITE, of Sydney, on behalf of his wife, formerly SARAH CLAPSON.

Twenty perches, in the County of Cumberland, parish of St. John, town of Parramatta, Allotment No. 11 of section 21; bounded on the west by a line 1 chain 14 links; on the south by a line 1 chain 22 links; and on the east by a line to Philip-street 1 chain 16 links; and on the north by that street 1 chain 30 links.

This allotment is leased by Sir Thomas Brisbane for 21 years from the 30th June, 1823, to James Burchan. Claimant alleges that one Michael Clapson was in possession of this and adjoining land (now granted to John Whitehead) 30 years ago, and that it has been sold by Clapson's widow to the prejudice of the eldest daughter, Sarah, Claimant's wife. Claimant proposes obtaining the Deed of Grant by paying 21 years Quit-rent, under a clause in the lease.

Case No. 223—EDWARD ASPINALL, of Sydney, on behalf of THOMAS PYE, of Bathurst.

Eight hundred acres in the County of Westmoreland, parish unnamed, near Dunn's Plains, Campbell's River; bounded on the north and west by Campbell's River; on the south by T. Pye's land, being a line east 106 chains; and on the east side by a line north 58 chains to William Lawson's land; and by that land 40 chains west to his south-west corner; and from thence 70 chains to Campbell's River.
