" A Bill to further continue for a limited time  
 " An Act intituled, ' An Act to facilitate the  
 " Apprehension of Transported Felons and  
 " Offenders illegally at large, and of Persons  
 " found with Arms and suspected to be  
 " Robbers.' "

As the Act of the Governor and Council 5 GUL. IV. No. 9, will expire on the 31st August next, it is proposed to renew it for a further period of Two Years.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bills, about to be brought under the consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,  
 E. DEAS THOMSON.

1. " A Bill for giving Relief to Insolvent Persons, and providing for the due collection, administration, and distribution of Insolvent Estates within the Colony of New South Wales, and for the prevention of frauds affecting the same."

It is proposed to make provision for giving relief to such persons as by misfortune, and without having been guilty of fraud or dishonesty, are or may become Insolvent, and for the due collection, administration, and distribution of Insolvent Estates within the Colony of New South Wales, and for the prevention of frauds affecting the same.

Any Judge of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, upon the petition, in writing, of any person setting forth that he is Insolvent, may direct such person to appear before him to be examined, touching his said Insolvency, and accept the surrender of such Insolvent's Estate, and place the same under sequestration.

The like powers vested in the Judges, or Commissioners duly appointed by them, in cases where persons administer the Estates of others, or in cases where persons are under legal inability to administer their own Estates, or the Estates of others.

Estates of persons having committed any act of Insolvency may be sequestrated upon petition of any creditor whose debt shall amount to Fifty Pounds.

Estates of a Company, or of the partners thereof, may be sequestrated on petition of a creditor, in case of any act of Insolvency committed by such Company, or the partners thereof.

Estates of persons deceased, administered by persons committing any act of Insolvency, may be sequestrated upon petition of creditor.

Partners of Companies to be under the same liabilities, and to possess the same privileges as individual creditors.

Orders for sequestration to be lodged with the Sheriff—

Attachment upon Estates under sequestration—

Attachment upon moveable property.

Creditor having duly obtained an order for placing the Estate of any debtor under sequestration, may take out the process of the Supreme Court to summon such debtor to appear before such Court.

Court to adjudge whether order of sequestration is to be confirmed or not.

If petition for order of sequestration prove unfounded or malicious, Court to award reasonable damages to injured party applying for the same.

If an order of sequestration, obtained by a petitioning creditor, be superseded by any act of such creditor, then such order may be revived in favor of any other creditor applying for the same, whose debt was contracted prior to such order for sequestration, and amounts to not less than Fifty Pounds.

If any Insolvent, against whose Estate any order of sequestration shall have been made, shall pay any monies or give any securities to the petitioning creditor after such order obtained, then he shall be deemed to have committed a new act of Insolvency, and the petitioning creditor shall give up, for the benefit of the other creditors, all such monies paid and securities given to him, and shall pay all the costs which may be incurred by any other creditor in obtaining the revival of the said order of sequestration.

The further execution of any judgment against the person or Estate of any Insolvent, after any order for sequestration of such Estate is lodged with the Sheriff for registration, shall be stayed, and the person having right to such judgment may prove the debt and costs secured thereby against the sequestered Estate, and take the benefit thereof upon distribution of the said Estate.

All actions pending against any Insolvent, for any debt proveable against his Estate, shall be stayed immediately upon any order being made for sequestration of such Estate, and the Plaintiff in any such action may prove the debt, together with the taxed costs then incurred, against such Estate, and take the benefit thereof upon distribution of such Estate.

Insolvents in custody of the Sheriff at the time any order for sequestration of his Estate is lodged with the said Sheriff, shall be forthwith discharged out of custody.

All actions commenced by any person, whose Estate shall afterwards be placed under sequestration, for any debt or demand due to the said Estate, and all proceedings therein, shall be stayed, upon such order being made, until the trustee, thereafter chosen, shall make election to prosecute or discontinue the same, which election must be made within six weeks after notice served upon him by Defendant.

Registrar of Supreme Court, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, shall appoint two public meetings of the creditors of sequestered Estates—the first for receiving proof of debts, the second for the same purpose, and also for the election of a trustee.

Insolvent attempting to remove out of the jurisdiction of the Court, before distribution of his Estate, and without consent of his creditors, to be apprehended and committed to prison.

Supreme Court may summon Insolvent upon application of trustee.

Insolvent not appearing may be apprehended. Insolvent absconding, to evade being served with such summons, shall be deemed guilty of fraudulent insolvency.

Act to apply and regulate, so far as applicable, Insolvents under 11 Geo. IV, No. 7.

Local Acts 6 Geo. IV, No. 8, and 2 Wm. IV, No. 11, repealed.

2. "A Bill for limiting and modifying the law respecting Imprisonment for Debt in certain cases, and for preventing persons indebted from leaving the Colony clandestinely."

As the Act of the Governor and Council 2 Gul. IV, No. 11, will expire on the 31st August next, it is proposed to restrict and better regulate the practice of Arrest and Imprisonment for Debt.

No person to be arrested and held to special bail unless he shall be about to remove out of the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court, or to abscond to remote parts within the same.

Persons under legal obligations to pay money to the amount of Twenty Pounds, or upwards, at a future day, if about to remove out of the jurisdiction of the Court, may be restrained from so doing in certain cases.

Sheriff's duty.—Nature of security to be given by persons about to remove out of the jurisdiction of the Court, and complainant's remedy thereon.

Remedy of parties complaining of wrongful arrest.

Debts due, or becoming due, may be registered with the Registrar of the Supreme Court. Effect thereof.

Registrar or Chief Clerk of Supreme Court may furnish certificate that no claim is registered against party applying for the same; or if any claim be registered, the particulars of such claim, and by whom made.

Punishment for forging or knowingly uttering forged certificates of such Registrar or Chief Clerk.

Penalty on masters of ships receiving persons on board without certificate or notice in the *Government Gazette*.

3. "A Bill for vesting all Estates and Property in the Colony of New South Wales, occupied for the Ordnance Service, in the Principal Officers of Her Majesty's Ordnance, and for granting certain powers to the said Principal Officers."

It is proposed that all Lands, and the Buildings thereon, which have been heretofore, or which may hereafter be granted or purchased for the use of Her Majesty's Ordnance Department in this Colony, shall henceforth be vested in the Principal Officers of the Department in Great Britain.

4. "A Bill for the conditional remission of sentences of Convicts transported to Norfolk

" *Island and Moreton Bay, and to enforce the conditions thereof.*

It is proposed to empower the Governor to remit the sentence of any person transported to any Penal Settlement, under sentence, or commutation of sentence, of any competent Colonial Court, whose conduct has been good since his removal to such Penal Settlement, after having served a certain term proportioned to his sentence, and upon condition that he do work in irons in any located part of the Colony for any period less than his sentence to such Penal Settlement which shall not exceed three years in the whole.

A Dispatch has been received by Viscount Palmerston, G. C. B., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Sir George Villiers, G. C. B., Her Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary, and Minister Plenipotentiary at Madrid, dated the 21st October, 1837, from which the following is an extract:—

EXTRACT.

" I have the honor to enclose the copy and translation of a Decree, published in the *Madrid Gazette* of the 14th instant, by which Santa Cruz de Santiago, in Teneriffe, and other ports in the Canary Islands, are established as Ports for Foreign Commerce."

TRANSLATION.

DECREE.

" DONNA ISABELLA the Second, by the Grace of God, and by the Constitution of the Spanish Monarchy, Queen of Spain, and, in Her name, Donna Maria Christina de Bourbon, Queen Regent of the Kingdom, be it known unto all by whom these presents are seen and concern, that the Cortes have Decreed, and we sanction the following:—

" The Cortes in virtue of their power, have Decreed, that the Decrees of former Cortes, viz., the Decree of the 5th January, 1822, in virtue of which the Port of Santa Cruz, of Santiago, of Teneriffe, was permitted to carry on national and foreign trade, with a deposit of the first class; and of that of the 20th of the same month and year, with several provisional regulations for the trade in the Canary Islands, and for granting the privilege of trade to certain Ports of those Islands; and the Order of the 31st March, of the said year, empowering the Provincial Deputation of the Canaries to regulate the Ship and Port Duties exacted from Vessels entering the Licensed Ports of these Islands, in transit, be herewith re-established, except in that part in the second and third Articles of the Decree of January 20th, which is provided for in the Tariffs, formed in 1830, by the Royal Com-

mission, and approved of by the Government, and which are still in force, which the Cortes present to Her Majesty, in order that she may be pleased to give it Her sanction."

" Therefore, we command all Tribunals, and all Authorities, whether Civil, Military, or Ecclesiastical, of whatever rank and dignity they may be, to keep and cause to be kept, fulfilled and executed, the present Law in all its parts. Let it be so understood, printed, published, and circulated."
