2nd: All Male Convicts, on their arrival in in New South Wales, are to be kept in the service of Government for a period of not less than Six Months, and are afterwards to be assigned only

on the recommendation of the Superintendent under whom they may have been employed.

3d. All Male Convicts in Assignment are to wear a distinguishing Badge, the nature of which will be explained hereafter.

consequence of recent Despatches from the Right Honorable the SECRETARY OF STATE for the Colonies, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct, that the particular attention of the Colonists be drawn to the Governor ment Notice of the 18th November, 1837, inti-mating the intention of Her Majesty's Government to discontinue at the earliest possible period the Assignment of Convicts to Private Service, in the Australian Colonies, and pointing out the consequent necessity of Settlers looking rather to Immigration than to Assignment for the requisite supply of labor. His Excellency is again assured of the early intention of Her Majesty's Government to carry the measure into effect, and is therefore, very desirous of impressing upon the Colonists the expediency and importance of their availing themselves as soon as possible of the advantages held out by the Regulations of 25th September, 1837, in obtaining an adequate supply of free labor.

.. His Excellency takes this opportunity of also making known the instruction which has been given to discourage as much as possible the Assignment of Convicts in the Port Phillip Districts, in order to prevent disappointment to Settlers who may in future become purchasers of land in that part of the Colony
