District No. 3, comprising the country adjacent to the County of King, having for its boundary to the southward, the right bank of the Murrumbidgee as far as any stations extend down that river, and bounded on its right by the left bank of the River Lachlan. Head quarters, Yass.

The Act of the Governor and Legislative Council, 2 Victoria, No. 19, intituled, "An "Act to continue and amend an Act, inti-E. DEAS THOMSON. | " tuled, 'An Act to restrain the unauthorised

" cocupation of Crown Lands," passed | guilty of a misdemeanor; and being convicted during the last session of the Legislative Council, being found insufficient for its pur-

It is proposed, that any person who shall be found occupying any Crown Lands lying waste in New South Wales, within the limits which have been, or shall hereafter be, allotted for location to settlers, and shall not hold a valid license from the Government of New South Wales for the occupation of such lands, shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for the first offence, any sum not exceeding ten pounds; for the second offence, twenty pounds; for the third and every subsequent offence, fifty pounds; to be recovered in a summary way before any one or more Justices of the Peace, upon the information and complaint upon oath, of any Justice of the Peace, Commissioner of Crown Lands, proprietor or lessee of land, or chief constable of the district.

It is proposed, that from and after the day of 1839, it shall not be lawful for any person to occupy any Crown Lands in New South Wales, beyond the limits allotted as aforesaid, without having first obtained a lease or license; and that any person who shall be found occupying any Crown Land beyond the limits allotted as aforesaid, without holding such lease or license, shall on conviction, forfeit and pay the penalties above proposed to be imposed in the case of persons unlawfully occupying waste lands of the Crown within the said limits of location, to be recovered in a summary way before any one or more Justice or Justices of the Peace, upon information and complaint on oath, of any Justice of the Peace, or of any person holding any such license for the occupation of Crown Lands, or the overseer or mananger of any station belonging to any such

licensed person, or any constable duly appointed

for any district beyond the limits as aforesaid. It is proposed, that it shall not be lawful for any person to cut, split, saw, or remove any timber, the produce of any Crown Land, whether within or beyond the limits allotted as aforesaid, upon or from the same, without having first obtained a license for such purpose; and that any person who shall cut, split, saw, or remove any such timber, without having such license, shall forfeit and pay the penalties hereinbefore imposed in the case of persons unlawfully occupying waste lands of the Crown within the said limits of location; Provided that nothing in the foregoing contained shall be construed to prevent any licensed occupier of Crown Land, or his, or her overseer, or manager from cutting such timber as is ordinarily used, and as may be necessary for the domestic uses of such station.

It is proposed, that if any person shall forge, counterfeit, or alter, or shall utter, or make use of, knowing the same to be forged, counterfeited, or altered, any such lease, license, or other document, purporting to be an authority from the Government of New South Wales, to occupy any Crown Lands within the same, with intent to evade any of the provisions of the proposed Act, such person shall, if free, be thereof, shall be liable to be transported for any time not exceeding seven years, or to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding four And if such offender be a convict under sentence of transportation, he shall be liable to be transported for any term not exceeding seven years, or to be worked on the roads or public works for any term not exceeding four years.

It is proposed, that it shall be lawful for any Justice or Justices before whom any person holding any such lease or license shall be committed on the oath of any one or more credible witness or witnesses, of any offence which in the opinion of such Justice or Justices shall render such person unfit to continue to hold any such lease or license, to declare the same to be null and void; and such lease or license shall thereupon become null and void accordingly, and shall not be pleaded in justification of any offence committed against any of the provisions of the proposed Act.

It is proposed, that in case any such person or persons, after being served with notice of cancellation of his or her lease or license, shall refuse or neglect to deliver up and quit possession of such land for the space of ten days after service of such notice, it shall be lawful for any Commissioner of Crown Lands for the district in which such lands shall be situated, being a Justice of the Peace, to enter upon such lands and take possession of the same, for and on behalf of the Crown, together with any houses or other improvements that may have been made thereon; and the same to deal with as may be deemed most expedient for the purpose of expelling such person or persons therefrom; and also to drive off and impound any cattle that may be found thereupon.

It is proposed, that every licensed person occupying Crown Land as aforesaid, shall make a report once a quarter in each year, of all stock kept upon the land so occupied by him, with the names, and descriptions, and particular brands of the respective proprietors; and no such licensed person shall have or keep any stock upon any such lands belonging to any other person, except such as shall be reported to the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the district in which the same shall be situated, upon pain of forfeiting for each head of stock so kept contrary to the provisions of the proposed Act, the sum of for every month any such stock may have been kept. without being reported.

It is proposed, that the Crown Lands adjacent to and beyond the limits aforesaid, shall be divided into districts, to be comprised within such boundaries as the Governor shall from time to time appoint; and that for each such district some fit and proper person, being a Justice of the Peace, and not holding any stock or lands in his own or any adjacent district, shall from time to time be appointed by the Governor, who shall be called the Commissioner of Crown Lands for such district; and so many men, mounted, armed, and accoutered, shall also be appointed by the Governor, as he may deem necessary as and for a

Border Police, to be under the orders of and paying for the same such price as shall be asattached to the said Commissioner.

It is proposed, that it shall be the duty of each Commissioner to be constantly within his district, except when unavoidably absent therefrom for temporary and necessary purposes in the performance of his duty under the proposed Act, or under process of any competent Court in this Colony, and that he shall keep the peace in his district, and protectall persons being therein, in their persons and properties, and that for that purpose he shall make perambulations of his district, and visit the several stations therein, as occasion may require; and that as often as any complaint shall be made to him by any such licensed person, that any dispute has arisen, he shall, being so required, visit such station and enquire into the matter of such complaint, and shall, being so required to do by the parties, or either of them, in writing, hear and finally determine the matter and determine the boundaries between parties occupying lands as aforesaid, where it can be conveniently done, and that he shall enregister every such determination, and shall and may enforce the same by removing the stock of any licensed person so found, and determine by him to be encroaching as aforesaid in the said district; and that he shall and may remove, and impound the cattle of any unlicensed persons within his district.

It is proposed, whenever the Commissioner of any district shall consider the circumstances of any emergency to require it, that it shall and may be lawful for him to summon and call to his assistance such and so many persons within his district, mounted and armed in such manner as he shall require, to attend upon and aid him in the suppression of any attack or aggression which he shall have reasonable grounds for believing to be contemplated, or which shall be in course of commission, by or against any person whomsoever, in or near to his district, and for the purpose of pursuing and bringing to justice any person whom he shall have reasonable cause to believe to have committed any felony; and that every person so summoned and attending, shall be allowed five shillings a-day during the time he shall be necessarily in attendance upon the Commissioner; and that any person who shall refuse or neglect to do, or perform any lawful act which the said Commissioner shall require him to do or perform, he shall for every such offence forfeit and pay the sum of Ten Pounds, and if he be the servant of another, he shall also forfeit any wages which may be due to him for the time he shall be absent from his employment, in and about his trial for such offence; and being a felon under sentence of transportation, he shall be deemed thereby to have committed a misdemeanor, and shall be punished accordingly.

It is proposed, that the Commissioner and those under his orders whilst absent from their fixed station, shall be entitled to receive from

sessed annually by the Justices of the Peace nearest to their district; and that persons wilfully refusing to supply the same shall, forfeit and pay for every such offence, the sum of five pounds.

It is proposed, that each Commissioner shall appoint one or more places within his district as a public pound or pounds, one of which shall be near to his fixed station; and that he shall also appoint a fit and proper person to be the keeper of the same; and that the provisions of the Impounding Act, 4 Wm. 1V., No. 3, shall be applicable to and applied in all matters and things relating to the impounding of cattle beyond the limits as aforesaid.

It is proposed, that all licensed persons shall within one month, or sooner if required, after obtaining such license, and coming to occupy any lands within any such district, deliver, or cause to be delivered to the Commissioner of the said complaint; and that he shall fix thereof, a list of all persons residing with or employed by him in the said district; and shall also notify, in writing, any change which shall take place in the persons employed by him, within fourteen days after the same shall happen, under penalty respectively of five pounds for not furnishing such list, and one pound for not notifying such change of persons.

It is proposed, that every licensed person shall have a separate and distinct permanent brand for cattle, sheep, and horses, and shall register the same respectively with the Commissioner; and that it shall be lawful for the said Commissioner, whenever any person coming into his district shall have a brand similar to that of a prior occupant, to direct such person to make such alteration in his brand as may be necessary to prevent mistake or confusion; and that if any person shall neglect so to alter his brand within one month after notice so to do, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of five shillings for every head of stock bearing the brand which he has so refused or neglected to alter.

It is proposed, that at and after the expiration of one year from the passing of the proposed Act, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner to destroy all unbranded beasts in his district which shall be above one year old.

It is proposed, that from and after the passing of the proposed Act, there shall be paid by every person having or keeping any stock beyond the located boundaries aforesaid, as a tax or duty upon the same, for each and every sheep and lamb the sum of one penny; for each and every head of cattle, above the age of six months, the sum of one penny halfpenny: and for each and every horse, gelding, mare, and foal, above the age of six months, the sum ; and that the same shall be paid to the Commissioners of the respective districts, who shall give due notice to the persons liable to pay such tax or duty, of the day on which the same will become due; and that whenever it shall appear to any such person that the amount set forth in any such notice, as due by him, to be more than he is legally any person in charge of any station, beef or bound to pay, he shall cause notice of his obmutton, flour, tea, and sugar, as rations, upon jection to pay the same to be served upon the

said Commissioner, who thereupon shall refer the same to be enquired into by two other Justices of the Peace, who shall thereupon fix the amount of such tax or duty that the party is bound to pay.

It is proposed, that whenever any person liable to pay such tax or duty, shall refuse or neglect to pay the same after notice duly served upon him as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner to issue a warrant, under his hand and seal, directed to some one or more constables of the district, to levy the amount of the tax so due, by a distress of a sufficient part of the stock of the defaulter or defaulters.

It is proposed that it shall and may be lawful for the said Commissioners to receive for any thing done by them at the request of any particular parties, the fees in the schedule to the proposed Act proposed to be annexed; and that the Commissioners shall render accounts of all monies received by them under this Act, verified by affidavit, quarterly in each year, to the Colonial Treasurer, and shall at the same time pay over to the said Colonial Treasurer, all sums so received by them.

It is proposed, that all penalties incurred and imposed under the proposed Act, shall be sued for and recovered in a summary way before the Commissioners respectively, or any one or more Justice of the Peace, under and according to the provisions of the Act 5th William IV., No. 22.

It is proposed that all actions for any thing done in the execution of the proposed Act, shall be commenced within three months after the fact was committed.

It is proposed, that all sums of money payable under this Act, shall be applied in the first place, to the establishment and support of a Border Police, and the residue thereof shall be applied in like manner as other revenues of the Colony.

It is proposed, to repeal the Act of the Governor and Council, 2 Victoria, No. 19.
