**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the GOVERNOR of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the second year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for repealing so much of an Act intituled, 'An Act to continue until further provision shall be made, certain Duties, Tolls, Rates, Fees and other Sums of Money imposed by the Governor of New South Wales, and for other purposes, as relates to the levying of Tolls in New South Wales, and for raising a Fund towards making, repairing, and upholding Public Roads, Bridges, and Ferries, and for regulating the collection of Tolls thereon;" It is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony for the time being, by any Proclamation or Proclamations under his hand, from time to time, to appoint places at which Tolls shall be collected, and to cause the same to be collected upon any line of road, which has been or shall be wholly or partly made, and which is repaired at the public expense; and to cause Toll to be collected at any Bridge built, purchased, or repaired at the public expense, and at any Ferry constructed or upheld at the same; and to cause such Gates, Bars, Chains, Rails, and Fences, to be built and set up, as shall be deemed necessary for preventing Passengers, Beasts, and Carriages, from passing, unless there shall be then paid such Toll as shall be due or demandable under the authority of the said recited Act: AND WHEREAS, by a Proclamation bearing date the Eighth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, certain places were appointed for the collection of certain Tolls whereat they have been collected, and it has become necessary to appoint another place for that purpose; Now I, THE GOVERNOR aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited Law or

Ordinance, do by this my Proclamation appoint the following place (in addition to those formerly named) at which a Toll Gate shall be established, and at which Tolls shall be collected to the amount, and under the regulations, restrictions, and provisions of the said recited Law or Ordinance; that is to say, there shall be a Toll Gate on the road from Sydney to Parramatta, near Annandale Bridge, where a new Toll Gate has been erected; instead of at the former Sydney Toll Gate at the top of the Hill at Grose Farm, which has been temporarily removed, in order to carry into effect certain improvements about to be effected on the public road, of which all Persons concerned are hereby required to take due notice, according to the provisions of the said recited Law or Ordinance.

**ROADS.**

**H**IS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, having deemed it expedient to open and make a certain Parish Road from Berrima to Bong Bong, a description of which is subjoined.—Notice is hereby given that in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 4th WILLIAM IV., No. 11, intituled “*An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the Streets in the Towns thereof.*” a Survey and Tracing, shewing the intended line of the said Road, are now deposited in the Office of the Surveyor General, and all persons interested therein, are requested to transmit in writing, addressed to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month from the present date, any well-grounded objections which may appear to them to exist to the formation of the said Road.

**RUNAWAYS.**

**I**T having been represented to the Governor, as essential to the proper Discipline of Convicts, that, when found illegally at large, they shall be dealt with at the place from which they have absconded, His Excellency requests that they may be invariably returned for this purpose—if Runaways from private service, to the Magistrates of the District in which they were assigned—if from an Ironed Gang, to the Officer in charge.

It is obvious that the characters of such offenders, the circumstances attending their escape, and the commission by them of any previous offence, can be best known or ascertained where they have been employed; and that their punishment will be most efficacious, as an example to their associates, if inflicted on the spot.

**RATIONS.**

**W**ITH reference to the Government Notice of the 20th March, respecting the substitution of Meat for Flour, in consequence of the present scarcity of Grain in the Colony, His Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to approve of the following substitution, being made by the Contractors whenever it may be found necessary, in the Ration of Convicts, male and female, in the service or employment of Government, until further notice, viz. :—

Two pounds of Beef or Mutton, or one pound and a quarter of Salted Pork, weekly, in lieu of three pounds of Bread, made from 10 per Cent. Flour, being the quantity which they receive; also, Rice may be substituted in place of the Maize-meal, in the proportion of twelve ounces of the former, for sixteen ounces of the latter.
