ASSIGNMENT REGULATIONS.

THE GOVERNOR having brought under the consideration of the Executive Council two cases, in which under the 14th and 15th clauses of the Assignment Regulations of the 9th May, 1835, convicts were transferred to persons, not of the full age of twenty-one years, the Council has advised, and the Governor has approved of the following regulations, being established respecting the Assignment or Transfer of convict servants to the estates of minors.

1st. The convicts shall be assigned in every such case, not to the minors themselves, but to Trustees who shall be not less than two in number, and who must be themselves personally eligible to receive convict servants.

2nd. In the event of the Trustees, or any Trustee employing the convicts so assigned, in any other way than for the benefit of the trust, the convicts will be withdrawn, as also any that may be in any other way assigned to the Trustee or Trustees, who will thenceforth be considered ineligible to receive convict servants in any capacity.

3rd. No assignment or transfer of convict servants will be made to the estate of any minor, unless it be proved to the satisfaction of the Governor, that the land on account of which the convicts are claimed shall have come to the minor, either by inheritance or bequest, or have been purchased with money to which the minor has become entitled either by inheritance or bequest.

4th. That no minor be admitted to the privileges of a new settler, in the assignment of convict servants.




