COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bill, about to be brought under the consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

*" A Bill for facilitating Proceedings by and against
 the Sydney Alliance Marine and Fire and Life
 Assurance Company."*

After recital of the formation of the Company and its establishment at Sydney, and that it would be convenient and just to enable some Member thereof to sue and be sued, in place and stead of the whole, which cannot be done without the aid of the Legislature—It is proposed—

That all Actions and Suits, and all proceedings at Law or in Equity, shall be in the name of the Chairman of the Board of Directors for the time-being.

That a Memorial of the name of the Chairman shall be recorded in the Supreme Court, and renewed whenever any new Chairman shall be elected.

That no Action shall be brought until such Record be made.

That the Chairman and other Officers, and the Proprietors of the Company shall be competent witnesses.

That Execution upon any Judgment may be issued against any Member of the Company, who shall have his remedy against the others.

That the names and places of abode of the existing Members of the Company shall be recorded, on oath, in the Office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court, within fifteen days from the first of January in each year.

That the persons whose names are so recorded, shall be considered Members of the Company until a new list be made out, or notice be given in the *Government Gazette*.

That the proposed Act shall be valid at all times notwithstanding any change of Members of the Company.

That the proposed Act shall not incorporate the Company.

That Bonds, Mortgages, &c., may be put in suit in the name of the Chairman, though he be not named therein.

That Plaintiff shall not be non-suited for want of proof of the Memorial.

That the rights of the Crown shall not be affected by the proposed Act.

That the proposed Act shall not take effect until receipt in the Colony of the approbation of Her Majesty—and that it shall thereafter be deemed a Public Act.

FEMALE FACTORY.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, with reference to the Notice

dated 26th February last, respecting the taking in of Needle-work at the Female Factory, that work for the Factory will be received by the Superintendent of Hyde Park Barracks, and when finished returned from the Factory to the same person for delivery to the parties from whom it was received, by which arrangement they will be relieved from the necessity of delivery it themselves at Parramatta.

All work so delivered at Hyde Park, must be cut out, and an exact inventory of the contents of every parcel delivered with it to the Superintendent. Payment also must be made to that Officer, (or to the person properly authorised to receive it) according to the schedule of prices to be seen at Hyde Park, before any finished work can be delivered.

All kinds of plain Needle Work will be taken in, and executed in the best manner, including jackets and trowsers. And work will still be taken in by the House Steward at the Factory.

Specimens of the work are to be seen, both at Hyde Park and the Factory, and also a variety of articles which are constantly on sale, including twine made from New Zealand flax, fruit-tree nets, and hammocks of the same, straw hats, &c. &c.

Parties are reminded that all applications for Agricultural Labourers and Mechanics, must be renewed at these Sessions, as after the 1st day of October, ensuing, all former applications for Convicts of that description, will be cancelled in conformity with the existing Regulations.

The Magistrates will take particular care to point out to Applicants, any informality in their Forms of Application, in order that the same may be corrected before transmission to the Commissioner, and to remind them, when necessary, to require their Overseers to send in their Return in Form B, to the Sessions of the District in which they reside. The Magistrates are also requested to see that all the particulars required in Terms of the Regulations, are duly filled up in the several Forms, to avoid inconvenience and delay in returning them for correction.

The greatest accuracy will be required on the part of the Applicants in filling up the Returns, as the best means of avoiding confusion and inconvenience to the Public Service.

Those Magistrates who were authorised to employ Assessors last year, for taking into consideration Applications for Servants, will be allowed, if still necessary, to return the same parties on the present occasion; but where the employment of other parties in lieu should be requisite, the Magistrates will immediately report the names to this Office.

TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD,

OR A

CONDITIONAL PARDON.

IT having been represented to the Government, that Mr. Crawford's late Overseer, CHARLES EYLES, against whom a Warrant has been issued for his apprehension, on a charge of having been concerned in the murder of nine Aboriginal blacks, in November, 1838, at a station of Mr. Crawford's, called Ardgawan Plains, at the Big River, is supposed to be concealing himself, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that with a view to the furthering the ends of justice, a Reward of Twenty-five Pounds will be paid to any Free Person or Persons, who shall apprehend and lodge the said Charles Eyles in any of Her Majesty's Gaols; or, if a Prisoner of the Crown, that application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to him of a Conditional Pardon.

CONVEYANCE OF MAILS.

WITH a view to improvement in the conveyance of the Post-office Mails, and to induce a better establishment, it is proposed to afford an opportunity for the same, by extending the term of Contract to three years from 1st January, 1840. Should eligible Tenders be received, and persons disposed to Contract for their transmit to and from the undermentioned places for three years, are invited to send their offers in writing to this Office until 12 o'clock on Thursday, the 1st August next, endorsed "Tenders for Conveyance of Mails in Cumberland."

From and to Sydney and Windsor, via Parramatta daily (Sundays excepted).

From and to Sydney and Campbelltown, via Liverpool daily (Sundays excepted).
From and to Sydney and Penrith daily (Sundays excepted).

It will be required of persons tendering, to specify the rate demanded per mile, and payment will be made according to the number of miles actually run over, and computed for the distance by the Surveyor-General.

Each Tender must be accompanied by a plan or model of the vehicle it is proposed to use, and each Contractor will be bound under a penalty of £50 not to use any other description of carriage without the express permission of the Postmaster-General, accidents only excepted.

Each vehicle is to be supplied with a commodious and secure box for the accommodation of the Mail Bags, and to be drawn by two horses, and not to carry more than three passengers, exclusive of the Driver, under a penalty of Five pounds for a breach of agreement in either case.

It is to be understood that the Mail is invariably to start at the hours as now or hereafter to be fixed by the Postmaster-General, and the Contractor to carry all bags or letters which may be delivered to him under the authority of the Postmaster-General, or any of the Postmasters.

Each Contractor will be bound under a penalty of £5 for each and every offence over and above the penalties provided by the Act of Council for the receipt or conveyance of any letter or packet by himself, or by any of his servants or passengers to the prejudice of the Post-office Revenue.

The Drivers employed, to be free men and of certified good character, and the Contractor to be answerable for the conduct of his agents and servants.

The Contractor will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes' delay after the specified time of starting.

The rate of travelling will not be less than seven miles per hour, including all stoppages, under a penalty of five shillings for every ten minutes' delay after the specified time of arrival.

All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement, to be deducted by the Postmaster-General from the next quarterly payment falling due to the Contractor.

It is desirable that each party tendering, or an agent for him, may attend at this Office on the appointed day for opening the Tenders; and that each Tender may bear the signatures of two respectable and solvent persons, willing to enter into a bond with the Contractor for the safety of the Mails, and the due performance of the Contract.

The hours of starting from each Post-office, and other particulars may be ascertained at the General Post-office, where parties proposing to Tender are invited to apply.

Printed forms of Tender may be had, on application at the General Post-office.
