FORTY POUNDS REWARD.
WHEREAS, on the morning of the 9th Oct. two ruffians came to one of our sheep stations, at Bega; one of them presented a musket to the breast of the person in charge, with the intention of shooting him, but the piece missed fire—they then knocked him down, and tied his hands—after which they proceeded to the hut where his wife was in bed with two young children, one of them an infant at the breast—the ruthless unmanly villains struck the poor woman on the head and breast, and otherwise abused her, and swore they would murder both her children if she made the slightest noise or resistance. They then robbed the hut of a fowling piece, balls, percussion caps, a silver watch, a one pound note, and various articles of wearing apparel of considerable value. The undersigned will give the above reward to any person who will give such information as will lead to the conviction of the offenders.

One of the ruffians was about five feet six inches in height, had on at the time moleskin trousers, a dark cloth jacket, straw hat, his face covered with a handkerchief or comforter. The other was about five feet in height, wore at the time dark plaiding trousers, dark jacket, black and red silk handkerchiefs, striped shirt, straw hat, face covered with a comforter, dark whiskers seen below it.

It is to be understood that the Mail is invariably to start on days as now, or hereafter to be fixed by the Postmaster-General, and the Contractor to carry all bags and letters which may be delivered to him under authority of the Postmaster-General, or any of the Postmasters.

Each Contractor will be bound under a penalty of £5 for each and every offence, for the receipt or conveyance of any letter or packet by himself, or by any of his servants or passengers, to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue.

It will be optional with parties to offer for one or more of the above line of stages, and to propose the mode of conveyance, but on all roads where Mail carriages can travel, a preference will be given to that mode of conveyance; and the Contractors will be held strictly bound to use the conveyance they propose, and to provide secure lockers and dry covering for the Mail bags.

Mail carts drawn only by one horse, must not carry more than one passenger; by two horses not

more than three passengers; and by three or more horses not more than six passengers, exclusive of the drivers; under a penalty of £3 for each offence.

All vehicles and horses employed in the conveyance of Mails, to be at all times subject to the inspection and approval, or rejection of the Postmaster-General, or person appointed for that purpose. The drivers and postmen to be free men, and of certified good character.

The Contractor will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes delay after the specified time of starting.

The rate of travelling will not be less than six miles per hour, including all stoppages, under a penalty of five shillings for every ten minutes delay after the specified time of arrival.

All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement to be deducted by the Postmaster-General from the next quarterly payment falling due to the Contractor, and to be considered as over and above any penalties provided by any Act of Council.

Each party tendering, or an agent for him, must attend at this office on the day appointed for opening the Tenders; and each Tender must bear the signatures of two respectable and solvent persons, willing to enter into a bond with the Contractor, for the safety of the mails and the due performance of the Contract.

The hours of starting from each Post Office, and other particulars, may be ascertained at the General Post Office, where parties proposing to tender are invited to apply.
