## YEARLY LEASES OF LAND.

**W**ITH reference to the Regulations of 1st August 1831, and 25th September 1839, for the Leasing of Crown Lands, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified for general

information, that the minimum upset price of Crown Lands offered for Yearly Lease, will in future be *Five Pounds per Section* of 640 Acres, instead of One Pound as heretofore.

The Terms of Sale will be those specified in the first mentioned Notice, viz.—Ten per cent. deposit on the bidding to be paid down, and the balance in one month.

## DISCHARGED SOLDIERS.

**T**HE Right Honourable the Secretary of State for the Colonies having, by a Despatch, No. 180, of the 22nd August, 1838, intimated to the Governor Her Majesty's pleasure, that such Infantry Soldiers as are Discharged within the Colony after fifteen years service, and are therefore in a situation to receive Free Discharges with Pensions, shall obtain Remission in the purchase of Crown Lands, at Public Auction; His Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations for granting such Remission:—

1. Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates, who have received free Discharges in the Colony, after a service of Fifteen years or upwards, and who may be recommended by their Commanding Officers, will, on their making application in the manner herein-under described, be entitled to Remission in the purchase at Auction of Crown Lands, to the following extent, viz.:—

Sergeants, £50 each.

Privates, £25 do.

2. Persons claiming under these Regulations will be required to transmit to this Office, within Six Months from the date of their Discharge, a Certificate from the Major of Brigade, or other proper Officer, briefly setting forth their Character and length of Service, and the circumstances of their Discharge.

3. When this has been approved by the Governor, the Applicant will receive a Certificate from the Colonial Secretary, stating the amount of Remission to which he is entitled, which Certificate will be received either in whole or part payment of any Crown Lands bought by the Holder of it, at Public Auction, in the Colony, within Twelve Months from its date.

4. Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates discharged subsequently to the 22d August, 1838, but before the date hereof, will be admitted to the benefit of these Regulations, on their applying in the way pointed out in paragraph 2; but such Application must be lodged in the Colonial Secretary's Office within Six Months from this date.

5. Parties are warned that the rules herein laid down with respect to the time within which Applications are to be made, and also the time during which Certificates are available, will be strictly enforced; and that no extension of time will, under any circumstances, be granted.
