GRANTS OF LAND.

THE following descriptions of GRANTS OF LAND, with the names of the persons to whom the were originally promised, or by whom they are now claimed, are published for general information, in order that all parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.

It is requested that *within three months* from the present date, the particulars required by the Government Notice of the 1st October 1838, may be accurately furnished to this Office, viz:—

Surname and all Christian names of the person in whose favor the Deed is to be prepared, written at full length, his residence and the intended name of the property.

Also (if required in any name but that of the original Promisee), the grounds of the claim, and a letter from the said Promisee, if living, and from all intermediate Assigns, if any, giving his and their consent and sanction thereto, and witnessed either by a Magistrate or a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

If these be duly furnished and satisfactory and if no Caveat be lodged or other cause of uncertainty appear, the Deeds will be prepared accordingly, as soon as possible after the expiration of the stated period of three months.

If the required particulars be not furnished within that period, or if a Caveat be lodged, or other cause of uncertainty arise, which cannot be satisfactorily determined by the Government, the case will be referred to the Commissioners of Claims, and the parties subjected to the expense of that proceeding.

45. GEORGE Cox, 50, Fifty acres, parish unnamed, near Corral, Illawarra; commencing at the corner of Spearing's and J. Underwood's

46. JOHN HEALING, 94, Ninety-four acres, parish of the Field of Mars; No. 8 of the Veterans' allotments; bounded on the south by a right of way of 1 chain wide reserved for a road east 27 chains; on the east by a right of way of 1 chain wide reserved for a road bearing north 36 chains to the Creek; and on the north by the said Creek to Pye's eastern boundary line; and on the west by that boundary line bearing south 34 chains; to the aforesaid forementioned right of way reserved for a road.

48. JOHN BROWN, 30, Thirty acres, parish of Nelson; commencing at the south corner of Samuel Mason's 80 acres, bounded on the south west by a line bearing south 40 degrees east 20 chains; on the south east by a line north 24½ degrees east 18 chains; on the north east by a line north 40 degrees west 20 chains; and on the north west by a line south 24½ degrees west 18 chains.

Promised by Governor Macquarie, on the 4th March 1811.

Quit-rent 1s. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1827.

49. FREDERIC WRIGHT UNWIN, 50 acres, parish of Saint George, at Muddy Creek; bounded on the north by a measured portion of 45 acres, being a line bearing west ½ a degree south 35 chains commencing at a stake near the mouth of Muddy Creek; on the west by a marked road 1 chain wide dividing it from Packer's and Hannam's grants, being a line bearing south 44½ degrees west 15 chains; then by a line bearing south ½ a degree east 3 chains; on the south by a line bearing east ½ a degree north 44 chains to Muddy Creek; and on the east by that creek to the aforesaid stake.

MACQUARIE.

50. ARCHIBALD CLUNES INNES, 1280, Twelve hundred and eighty acres, parish unnamed, on the River Forbes; bounded partly on the south by the section line bearing east 42 chains commencing at a rock at an angle on the river Forbes 4 miles northward from the purchase of Major Innes of 983 acres at the confluence of the Forbes and Hastings Rivers; on the east by a line north 80 chains; on the north by a line west 160 chains to the River Forbes; and on the west and remainder of the south by that river to the aforesaid rock.
